

# DISQUALIFIERS

## Compliance with Law

1. The tow operator and employees shall, at all times, comply with federal, state and local laws and ordinances.
2. An operator or employee arrested or charged with a violation involving any felony or certain misdemeanors may be suspended until the case is adjudicated.

## Criminal Conviction Disqualifications for Tow Owners and Employees

1. GENERAL. - Listed below is a synopsis of criminal convictions for which a tow owner/employee may be disqualified, suspended or terminated from providing tow services for the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department. Nothing herein shall prohibit the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department from suspending, terminating or denying an application of any tow owner/employee whose conduct is deemed to be dangerous to the motoring public (e.g., registered sex offender, extensive criminal history).
2. Live Scan (fingerprinting) will be conducted on all tow operators and employees every three years during the three year tow contract. The tow investigator can order a Live Scan be done on any employee during the three year contract period at the tow investigator's discretion.
3. PERMANENT. – Please list all arrests and convictions under comment section below.

**Section One** - All felony convictions in the last seven years from date of application. Any felony conviction seven years or older will be subject to review by the Captain of Major Crimes Bureau, or the Tow Investigator, in consultation with the Captain to determine eligibility to provide services to the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department.

**Section Two** - if convicted of any of the following crimes, at any time, the applicant will be disqualified from working with the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department.

1. 220 PC – Assault with the Intent to Commit Mayhem, Rape, Sodomy, or Oral Copulation.
2. 261 PC – Rape or Aiding & Abetting a Rape.
3. 267 PC – Abducting Person Under Age 18 for Prostitution.
4. 288 PC – Lewd Act with a Child.
5. 289 PC – Sexual Assault.
6. Murder, Attempted Murder, Voluntary Manslaughter or Mayhem.

7. Rape, Sodomy or Oral Copulation by Force, Violence, Duress, Menace, or Fear of Immediate and Unlawful Bodily Injury on the Victim or another Person.
8. Robbery or Arson that Causes Great Bodily Injury, or that Causes an Inhabited Structure or Inhabited Property to Burn.
9. Any Felony in which the Defendant Inflicts Great Bodily Injury on any Person Other than an Accomplice, or any Felony in which the Defendant uses a Firearm.
10. Kidnapping, Carjacking.
11. Criminal Street Gang Convictions; Extortion / Threats to Victims or Witnesses.
12. Burglary (First Degree), When Another Person, Other Than an Accomplice, Was Present in the Residence During the Crime.
13. 191.5(a) PC – Gross Vehicular Manslaughter while Intoxicated Conviction.
14. 23153 VC – Driving while Under the Influence and Causing an Injury or Death.
15. 23152 VC – Three or More Convictions of Driving while Under the Influence.

**Section Three** – if convicted for any of the following crimes, the applicant is disqualified for 10 years for felony convictions and 5 years for misdemeanor convictions from working with the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department.

1. 148 PC – Resisting/Delaying a Peace Officer.
2. 222 PC – Administering Drugs with the Intent to Commit a Felony.
3. 273.5 PC – Infliction of Injury to Spouse, Cohabitant, Parent or Child.
4. 261.5 PC – Statutory Rape.
5. 275(a) PC – Cruelty to Child.
6. 273(d) PC – Corporal Punishment of a Child, Resulting in a Traumatic Condition.
7. 417 PC – Brandishing a Firearm in a Threatening Manner.
8. 450 PC – Arson.
9. 453 PC – Possession of a Fire Bomb.
10. 459 PC - Burglary
11. 466 PC – Possession of Burglary Tools.
12. 467 PC – Possession of Deadly Weapons with the Intent to Assault.
13. 470 PC – Forgery.
14. 470(a) PC – Reproduction / Falsification of Driver License or ID Card.
15. 470(b) PC – Display / Possess Reproduced / Falsified Driver License or ID Card.
16. 477 PC - Counterfeiting Money.

17. 484(a) PC – Theft.
18. 484(e) PC – Theft of an Access Card.
19. 484(f) PC – Forgery of Access Card Signature.
20. 484(g) PC – Fraudulent Use of an Access Card.
21. 487 PC – Grand Theft.
22. 496 PC – Receiving Stolen Property.
23. 503 PC – Embezzlement.
24. 538(d) PC – Fraudulent Impersonation of a Police Officer.
25. 2800 VC – Evading a Peace Officer.
26. 10750 VC – Altering, Defacing or Replacing Vehicle ID Numbers.
27. 10752 VC – Fraudulent Acquisition of DMV or CHP VIN Numbers.
28. 10851 VC – Vehicle Theft.
29. 20001 VC – Hit and Run Causing Injury or Death.
30. 23152 VC – Driving while Under the Influence.
31. Three or more Misdemeanor Drug Related Convictions.
32. Any Misdemeanor Conviction within the Previous Three Years.

**Other Disqualifying Factors**

1. Any driver who is subject to epilepsy, fainting or loss of consciousness by reason of chronic medical condition deemed unfit to drive by DMV.
2. Any tow operator or employee that has furnished false information on his/her application or failed to furnish all information requested on said application.
