## 1900

The design of the badge was again altered by adding ball-tips to the points of the star so that deputies were not injured when involved in a physical altercation.

## <u>1903</u>

Sheriff William A. White 1903 - 1907

Sheriff's Department has first federal lawsuit for unsanitary food served to inmates.

In early 1900's, the Sheriff's Department purchased 1897 era Winchester shotguns for department use.

## <u>1906</u>

Harriet Shehi, wife of Deputy Sheriff George Shehi, is hired as the Department's first full-time jail matron by Sheriff Will White. According to a letter she submitted to Sheriff Traeger in 1923 seeking his support for an early retirement, she claimed this meant that she lived in the jail twenty-four hours a day, seven days a week and was only relieved by her daughter during the first seven years of her employ.

## <u>1907</u>

Sheriff William A. Hammel 1907 – 1914

The LASD purchases its first car, 1907 Locomobile.

Future Sheriff's Eugene Biscailuz and William Trager are hired.

The County Constabulary comes under the supervision of the Sheriff's Department.
