In January 2019, in addition to prohibiting the physical presence of ICE agents in the jail for civil immigration enforcement, the Sheriff took the significant step of lowering the threshold for misdemeanor convictions from five years to three years. He also decided to eliminate various misdemeanor crimes from this list even though the Values Act permits transfers to ICE of inmates convicted of those crimes. This action reduced the misdemeanor list from 151 listed crimes to 101 listed crimes. After careful consideration over the past year, the Sheriff decided that a further important change was warranted to maintain community trust. Accordingly, effective 03/26/2020, the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department will no longer make notifications about, or permit transfers of, persons previously convicted of non-violent or non-serious felonies or misdemeanors. Only inmates with qualifying serious or violent felony convictions will be transferred to ICE.

None of the inmates who were transferred to ICE were given early release because they were in a "vulnerable group."

2) To be clear, as of 3/26/2020, LASD is <u>ONLY</u> "qualifying" inmates to be transferred to ICE who have been convicted of a <u>serious felony (as defined by Penal Code section 1192.7)</u> or <u>a violent felony (as defined by Penal Code section 667.5)</u> with <u>no time limitation</u>. This also means that the misdemeanor list has also been completely eliminated and is no longer used to qualify inmates for transfer. Yes?

That is correct – only crimes defined as serious or violent under the Penal Code are being transferred to ICE with no time limitation. This also means that the misdemeanor list has been completely eliminated.

The Department will no longer notify ICE when an inmate qualified under the old criteria is being released. They will be treated the same as any non-qualified inmate.






