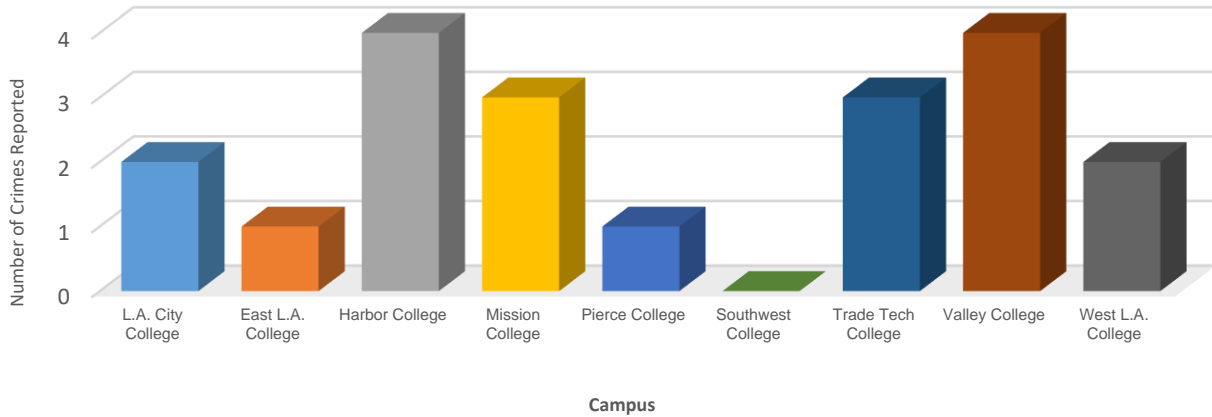

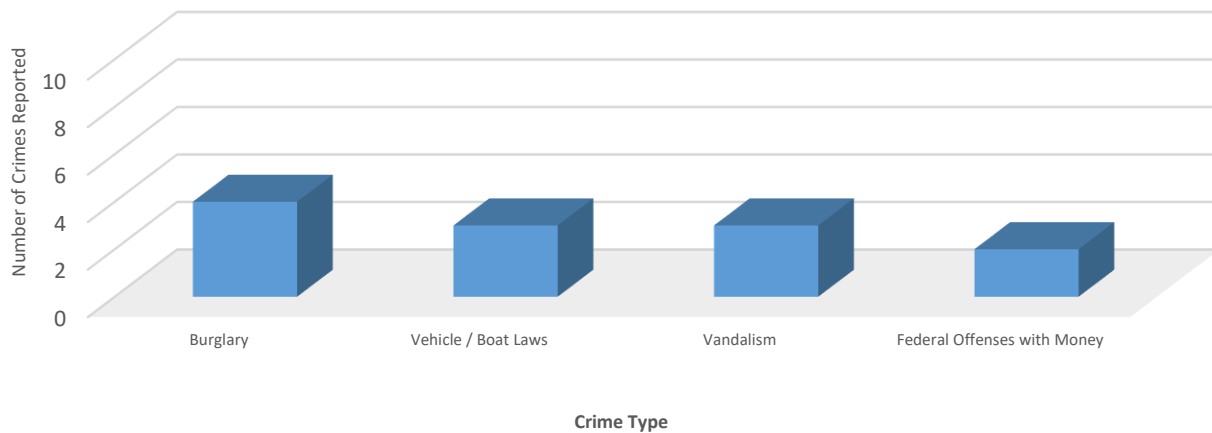

Total Part I & II By Campus

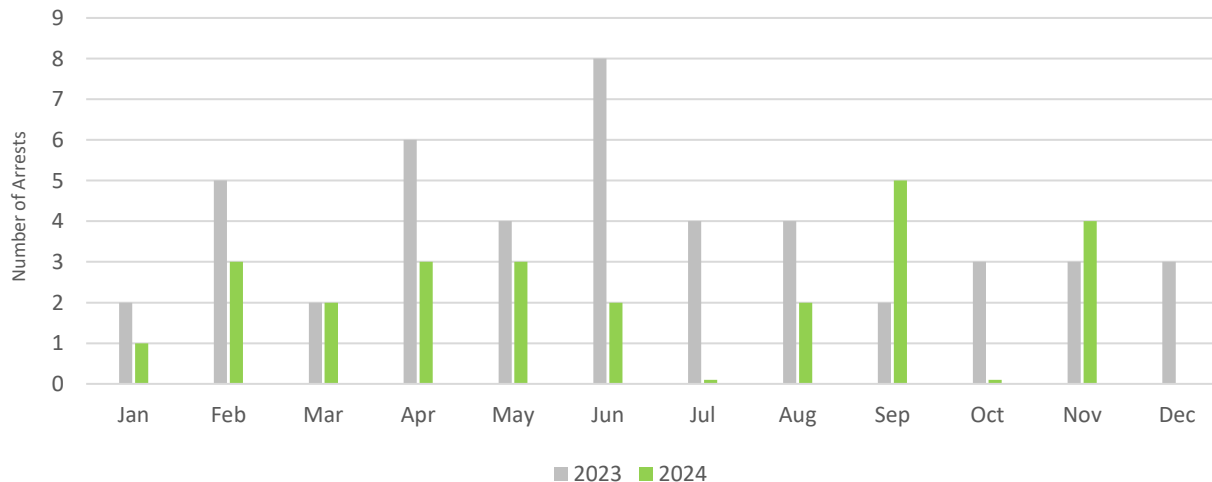

Year-to-Date Arrests by Month

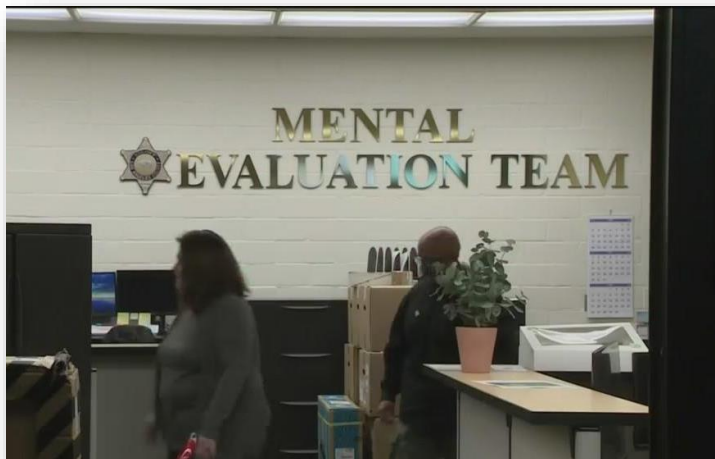

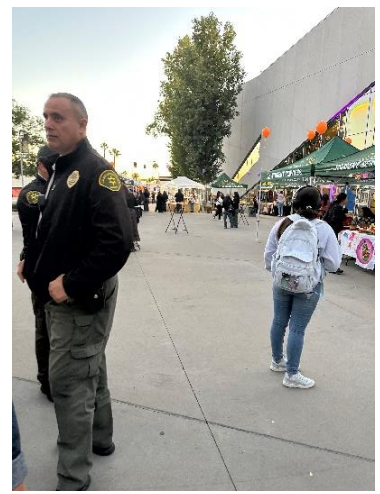


East Los Angeles College

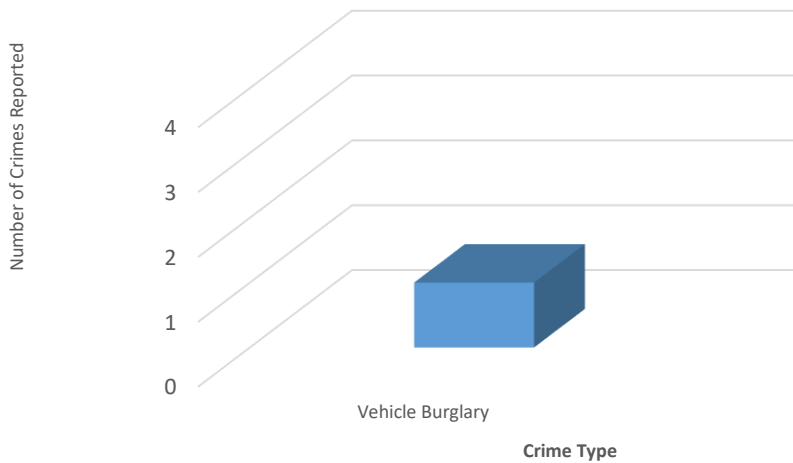

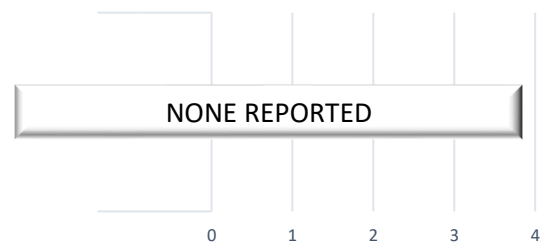

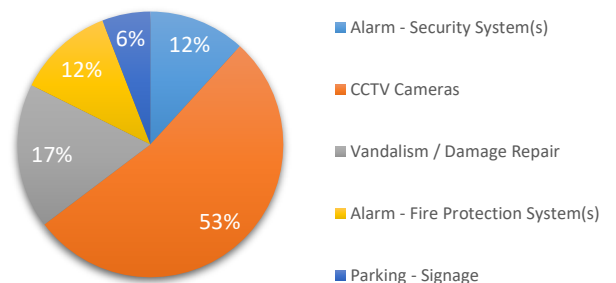

Recognizing the partnership between the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department and the Los Angeles City College community.

This month, I would like to recognize the outstanding work of the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department at LACC. On November 5, 2024, a grand theft occurred, where \$1,400 were stolen from a student's purse at the LACC's soccer field. The money was meant to cover the victim's rent making the theft a significant financial burden.

Thanks to the dedication and quick response of the LACC deputies and security officers, and the exceptional team of detectives, a crime bulletin was disseminated to students, faculty, and staff, seeking their assistance in identifying the suspect. The strong bond between the college community and the Sheriff's Department played a critical role in solving the case. This collaboration led to the arrest of the suspect, and recovery of the stolen money.



This incident demonstrates the Sheriff's Department's commitment to serving and protecting the college community. The incident also highlights the remarkable trust and teamwork, which exists between LACC and the Department.

Thank you to the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department and the LACC's faculty and staff for your dedication and service. Your efforts make a real difference in the lives of students and the entire campus community.
