Total Part I & II By Campus

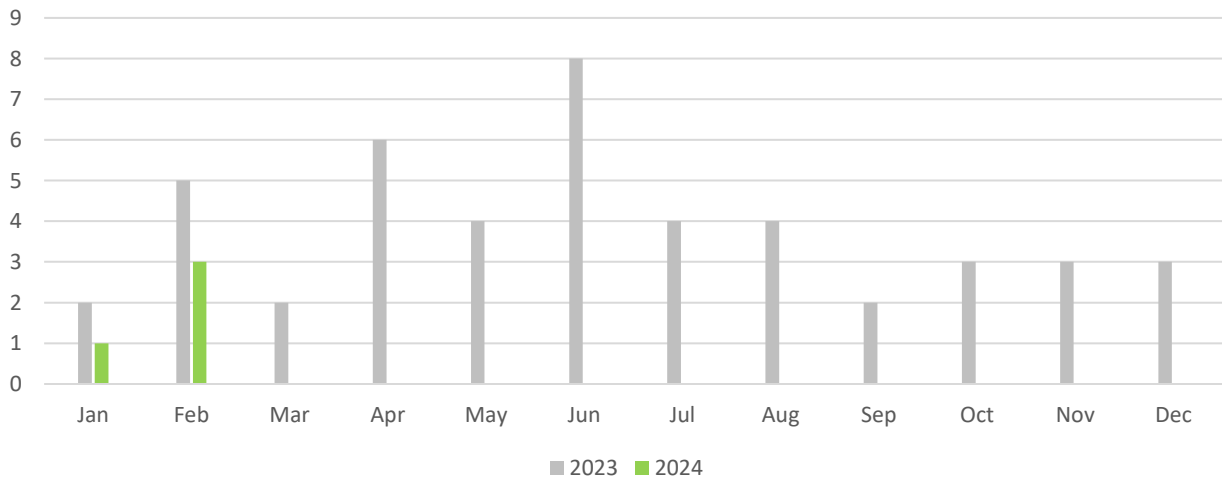

## Year-to-Date Arrests by Month

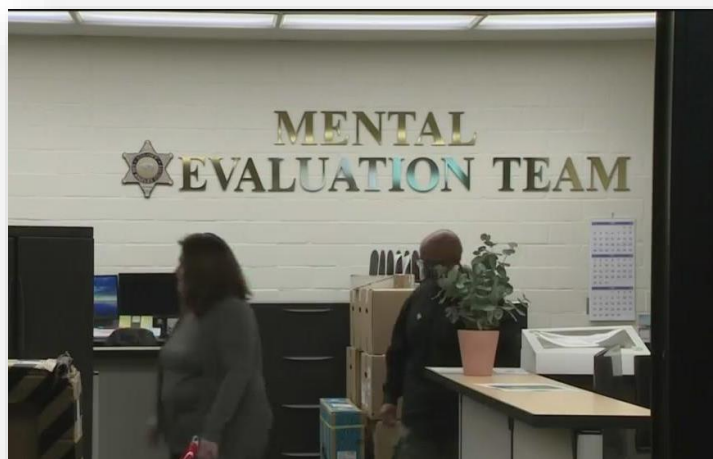

# East Los Angeles College



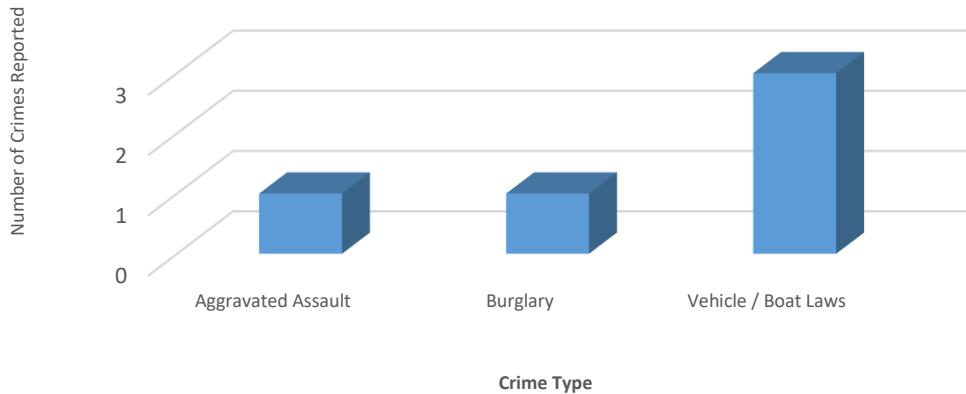

# Los Angeles Harbor College



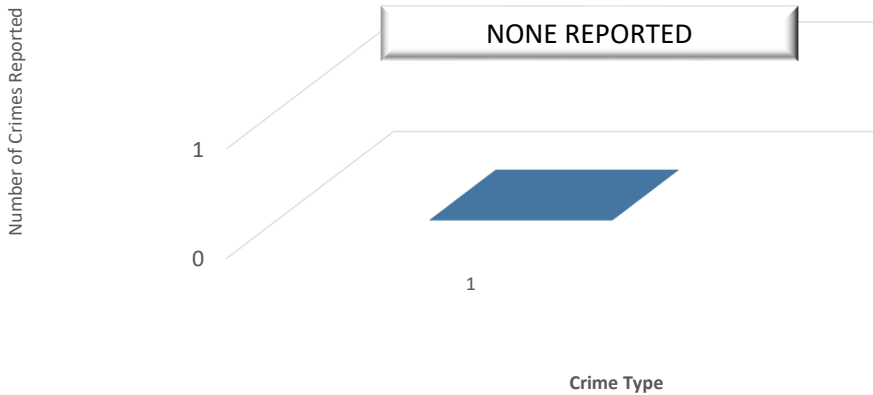
Los Angeles Harbor College (LAHC) had no crimes reported in the month of February and no arrests.

# Los Angeles Mission College



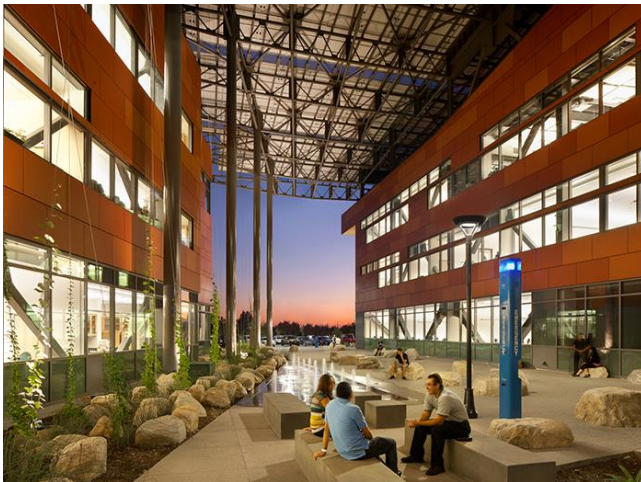
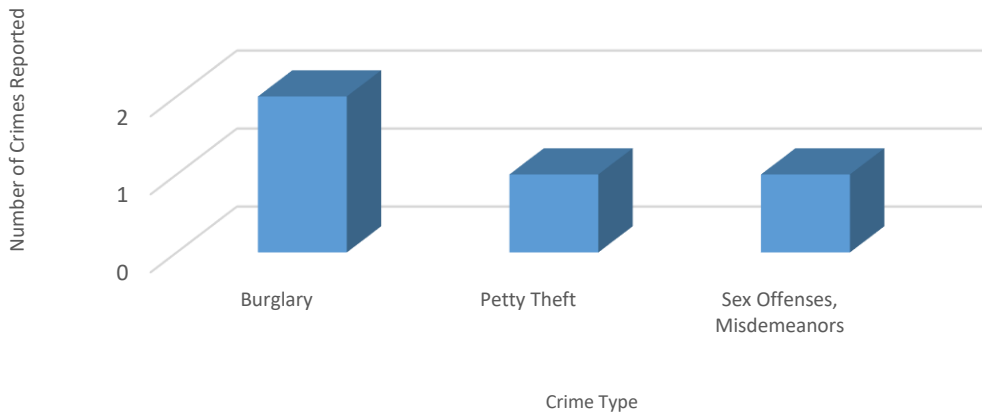
There were four crimes reported in the month of February and one arrest at Los Angeles Mission College (LAMC).

A male, non-student, was arrested for a prior burglary that occurred on campus in December.

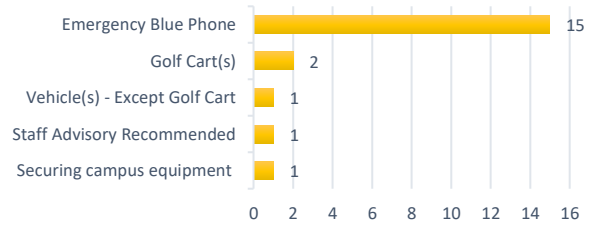

Overall, Part 2 crimes have slightly increased since 2023 while Part 1 crimes have remained the same.

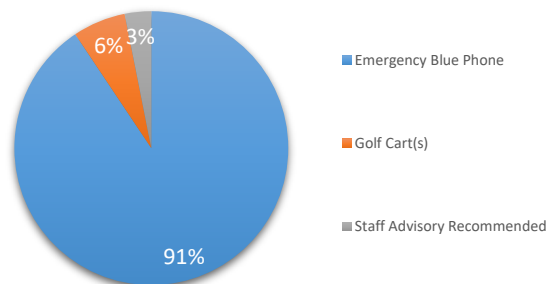

# Los Angeles Valley College

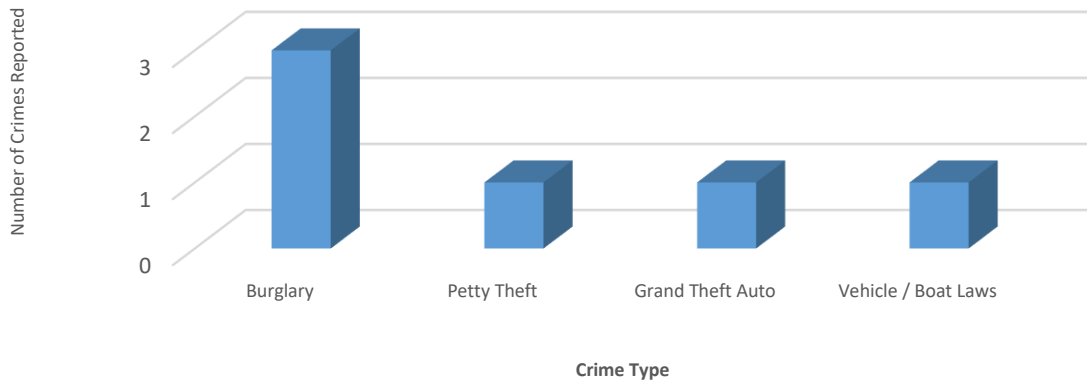

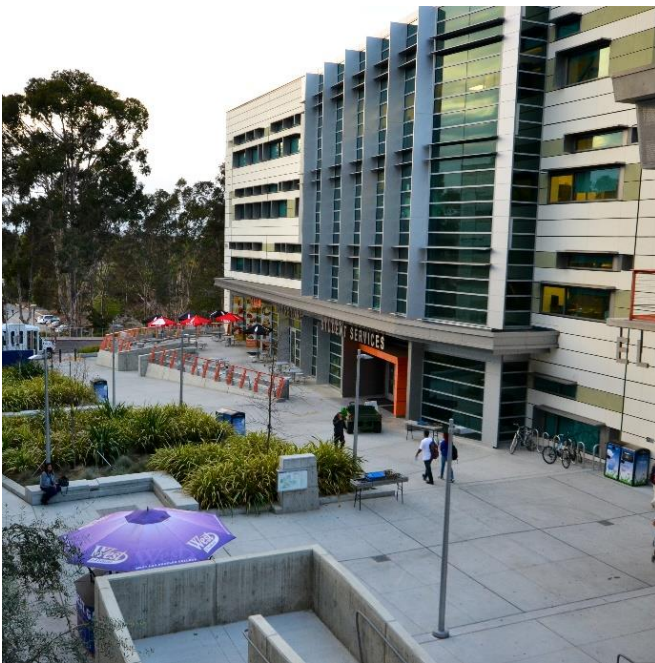
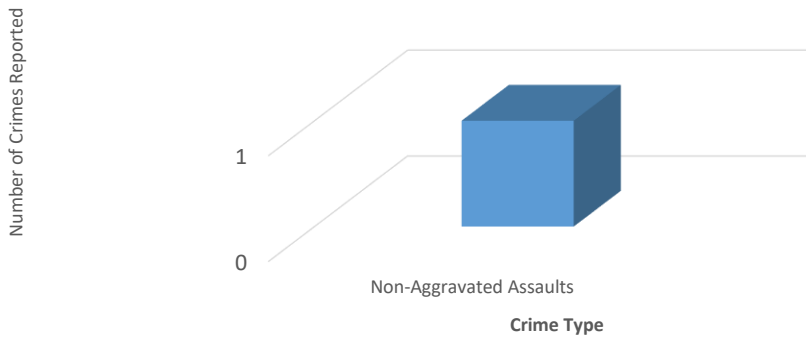
There was one crime and no arrests reported in the month of February at West Los Angeles College (WLAC).
