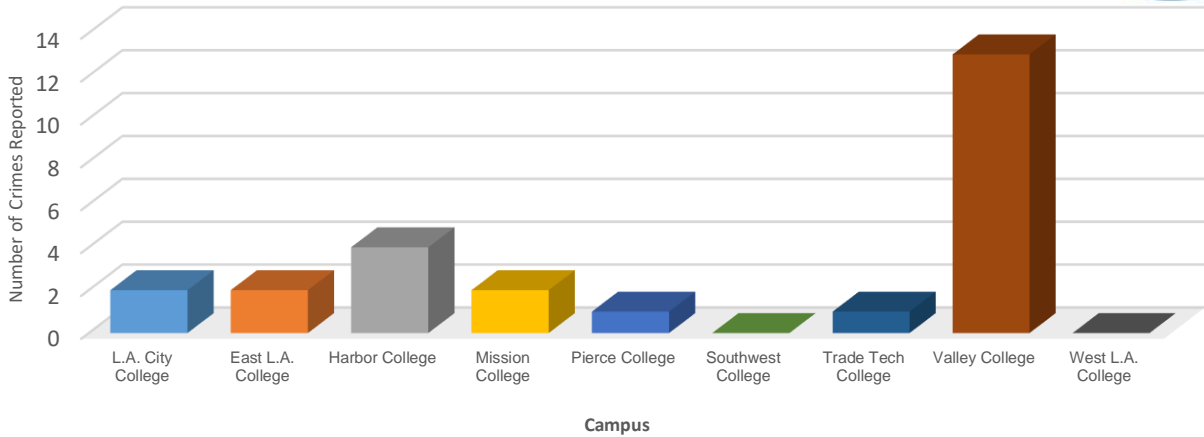

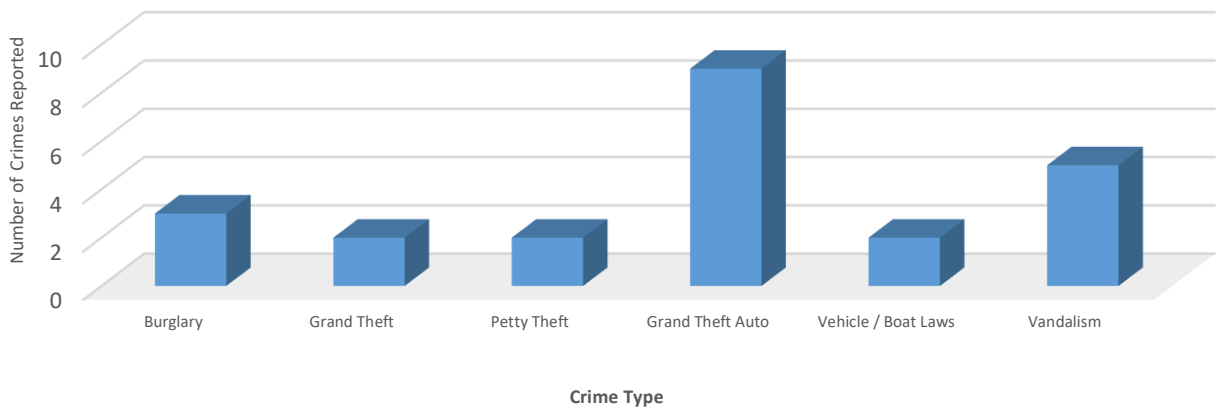

Total Part I & II By Campus

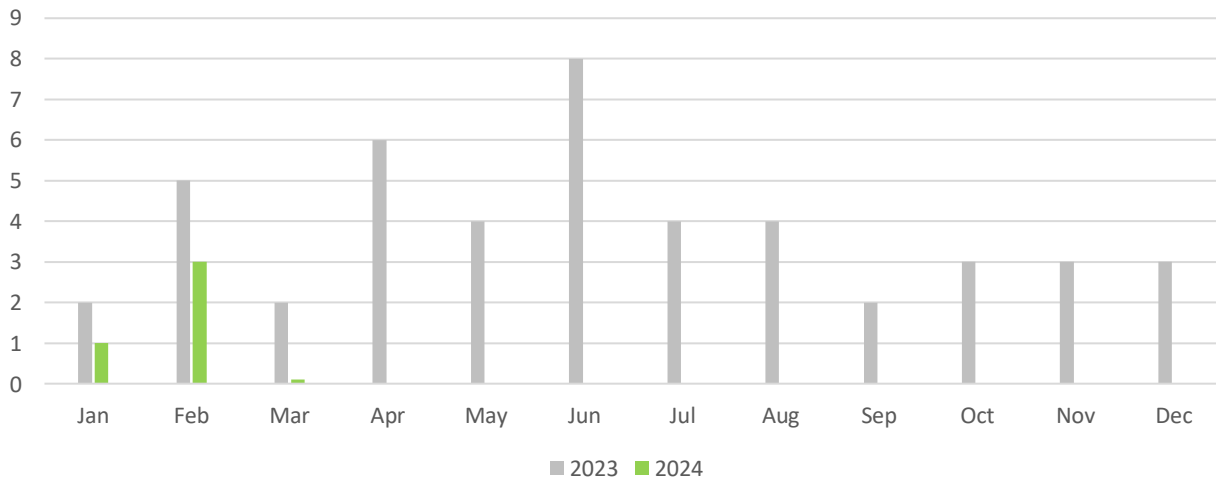

Year-to-Date Arrests by Month

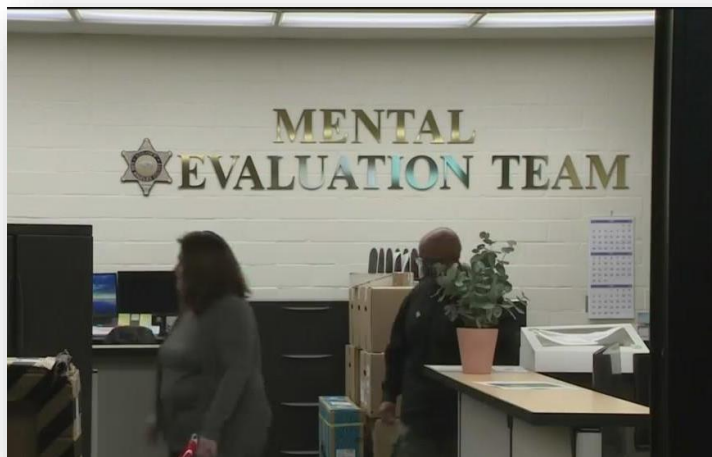


HEAT Program Update

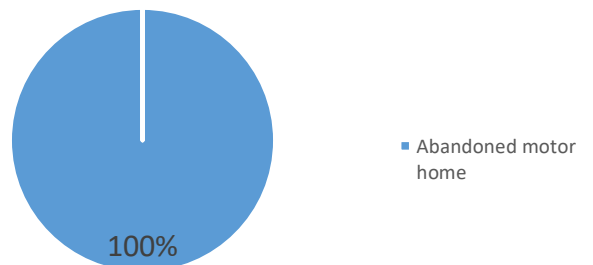
Number of Crimes Reported

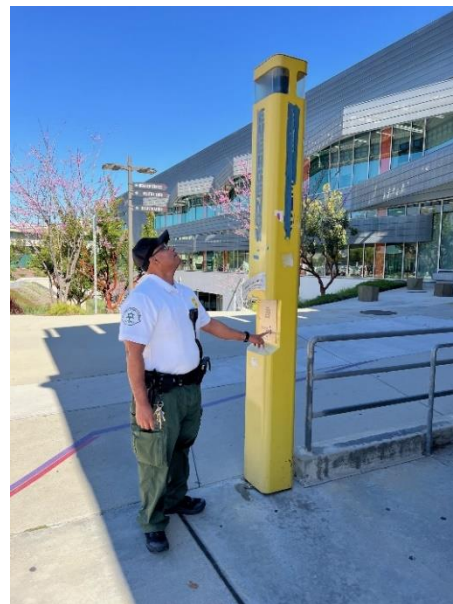

During the meetings, one of the concerns voiced from employees and students was the availability of campus Emergency Blue Phones. Prior to the meetings, LATTTC Health and Safety Specialist, Eric Clark, took the lead on conducting a survey of all campus Emergency Blue Phones in collaboration with LATTTC Sheriff's personnel. All the Emergency Blue Phones were identified and checked to see if they were in working order. The outcome of the survey was shared during the Safety Committee meeting. Deputy Lopez voiced his concerns about the inoperable Emergency Blue Phones with issues and recommended adding more phones on campus. The Safety Committee agreed with his recommendations and will seek the next process to make all repairs that are needed.

All the necessary support is provided by Community College Bureau Deputies and Security Officers, who maintain a community-oriented and safe environment for all who visit West LA College.



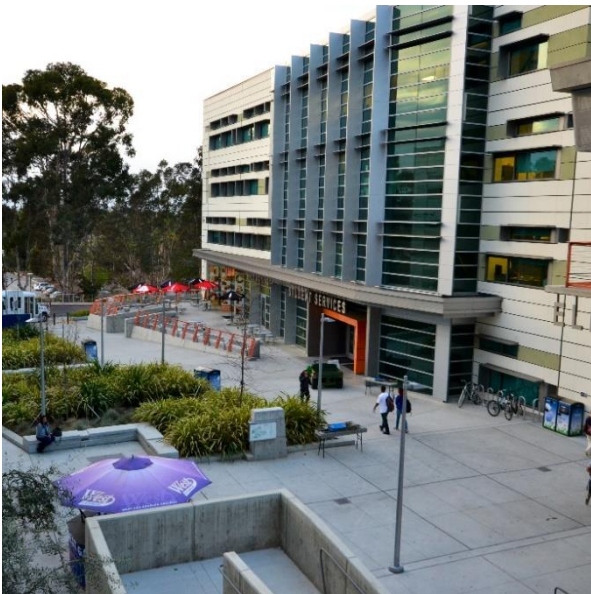
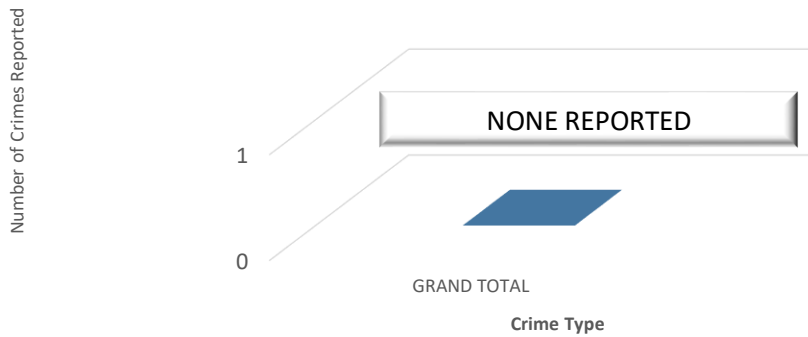

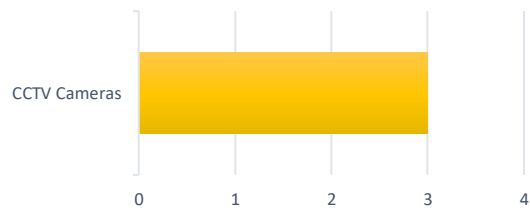
