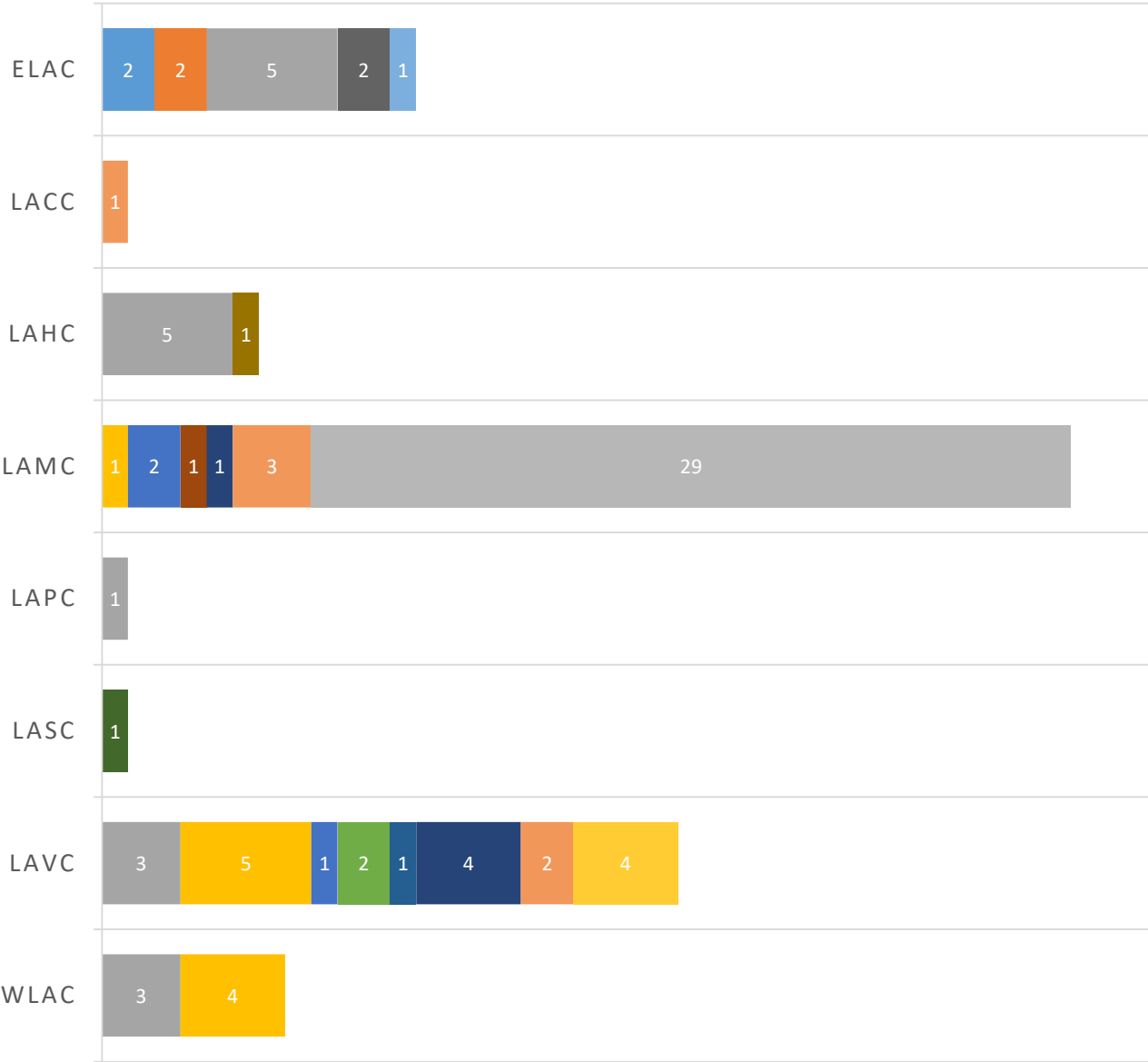

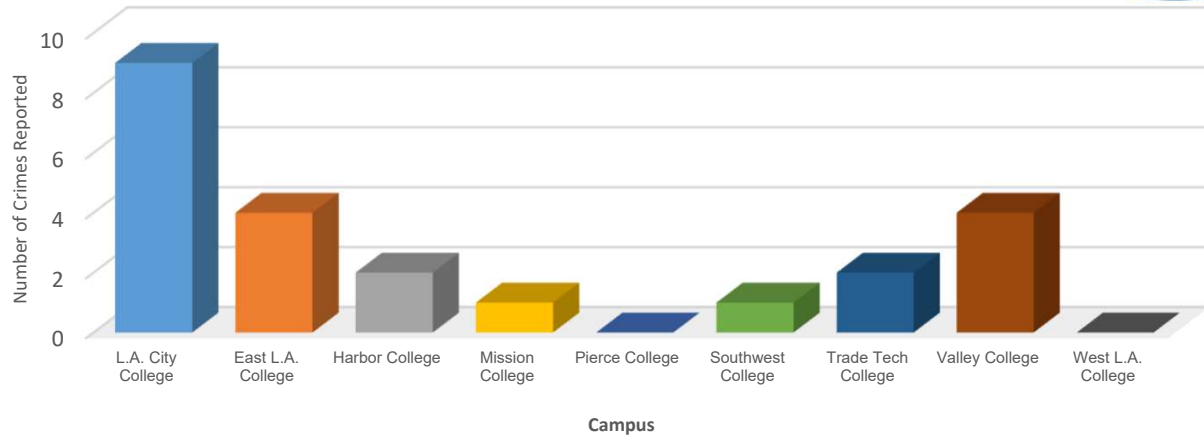

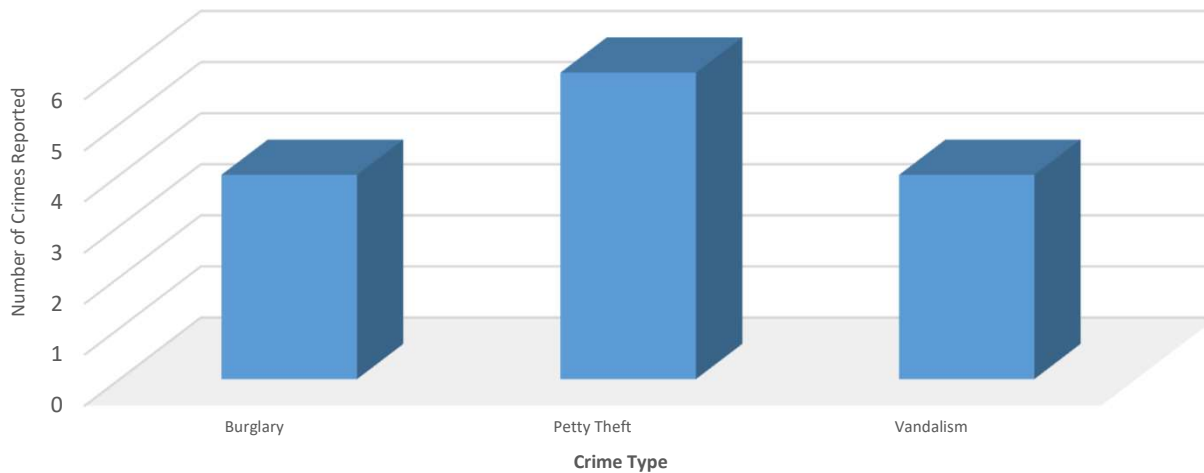

Total Part I & II By Campus

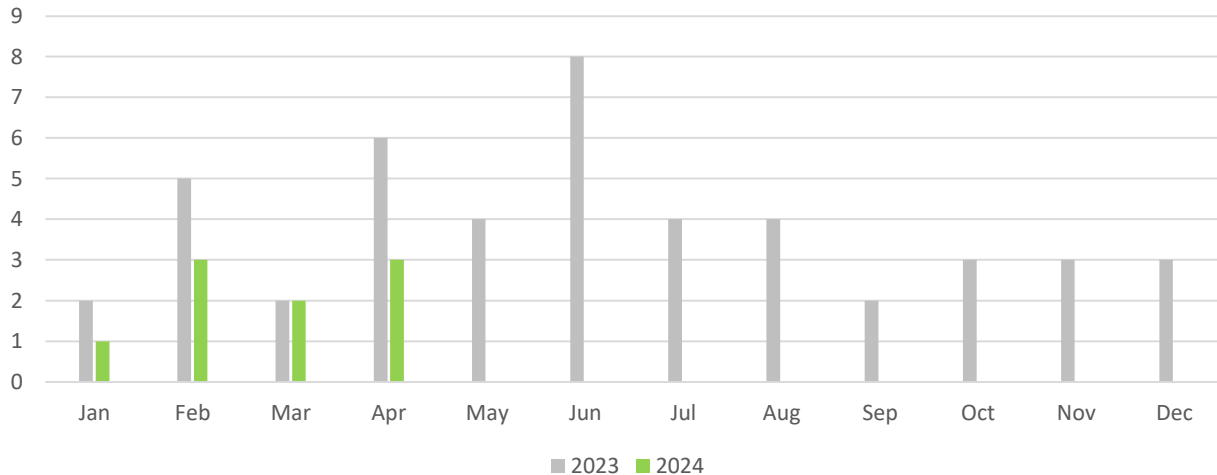

Year-to-Date Arrests by Month

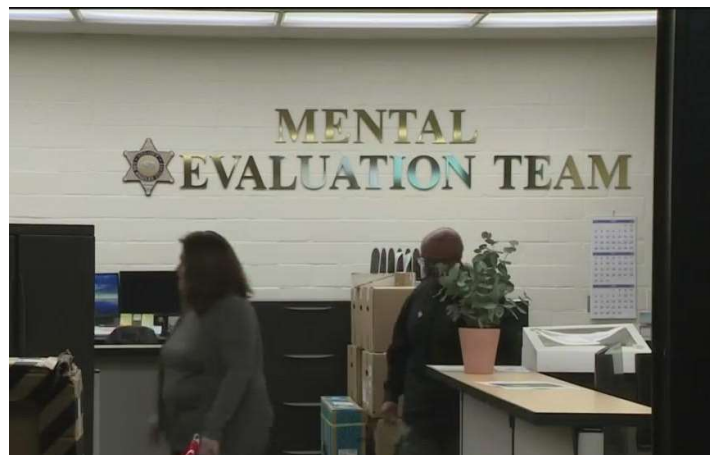

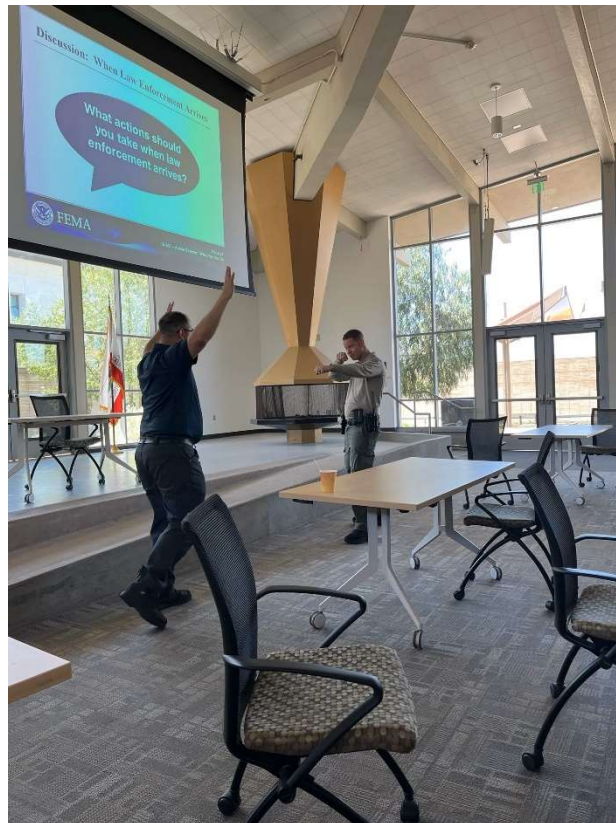


Training & Support Unit (TSU)

The Training and Support Unit conducted the following trainings in the month of April:

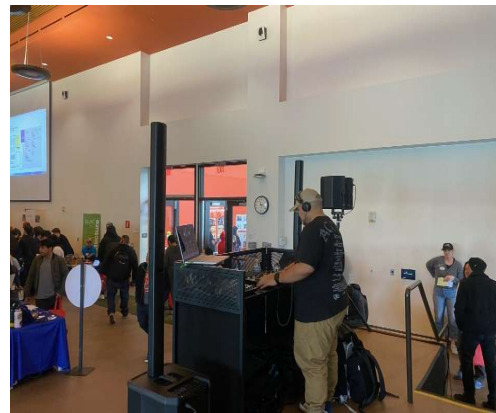
- Situational awareness walkthrough training at LAMC on 04-09.

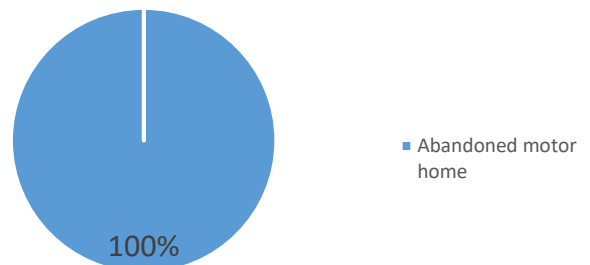
Number of Crimes Reported

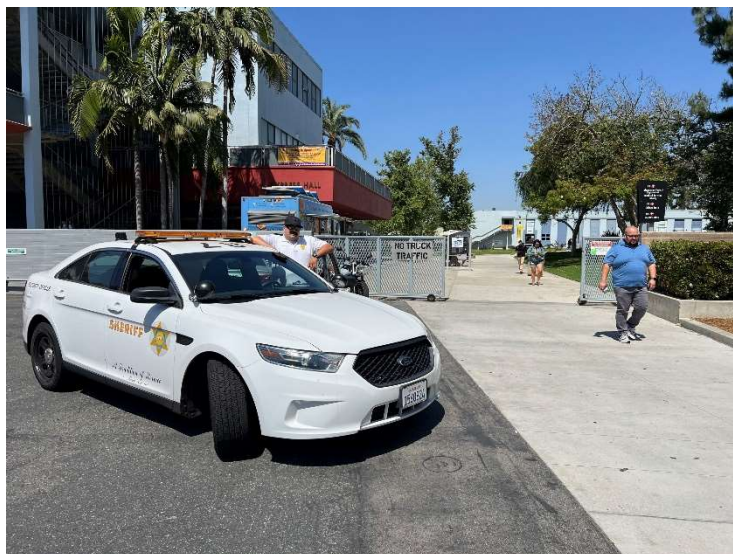


Los Angeles Trade Tech College

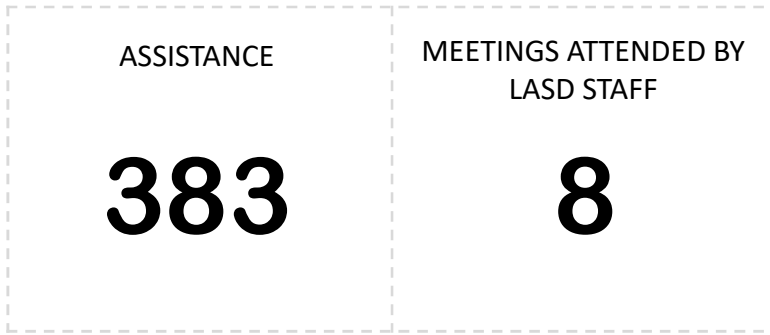
