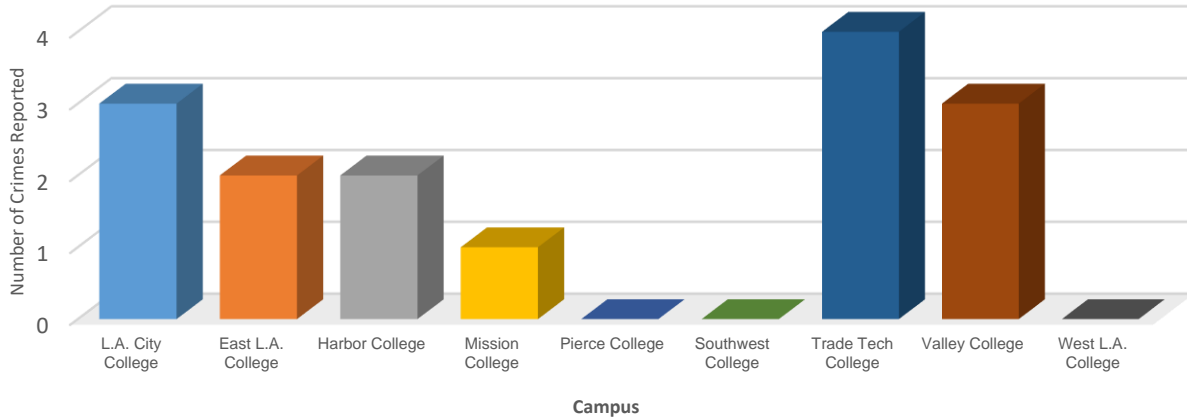

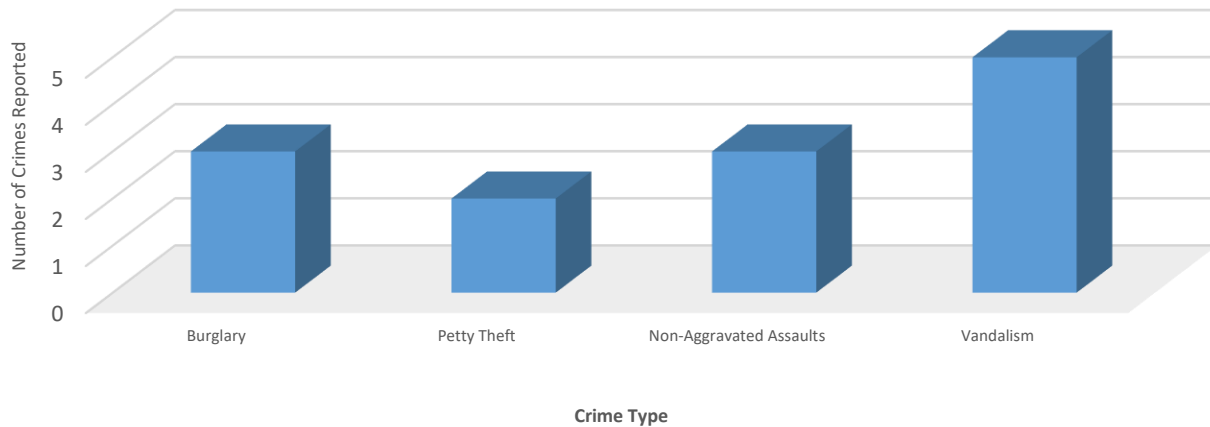

Total Part I & II By Campus

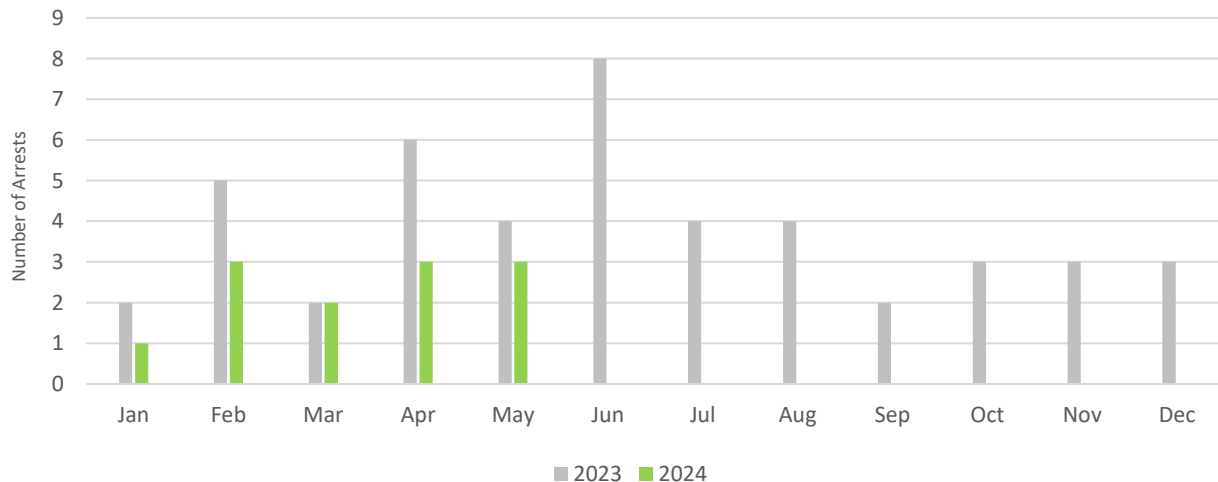

Year-to-Date Arrests by Month

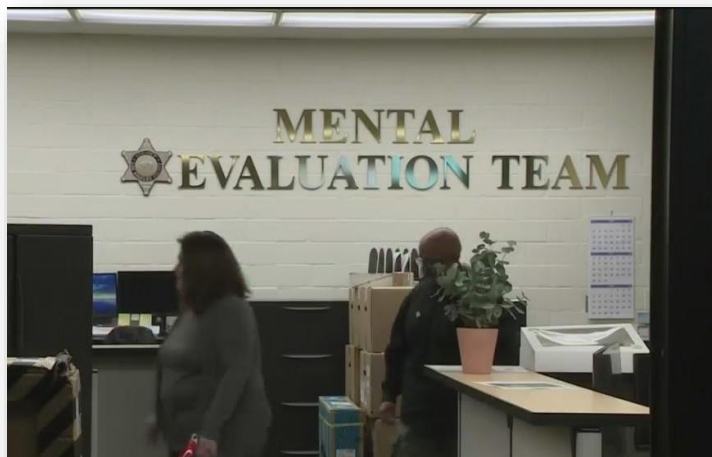

- Taser training for Security Officer personnel 05/29/2024.

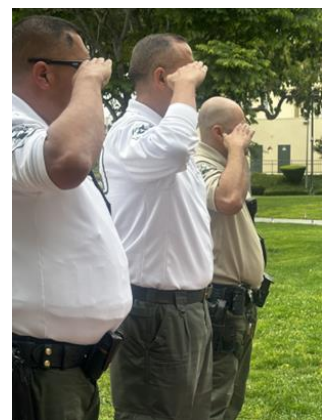


East Los Angeles College

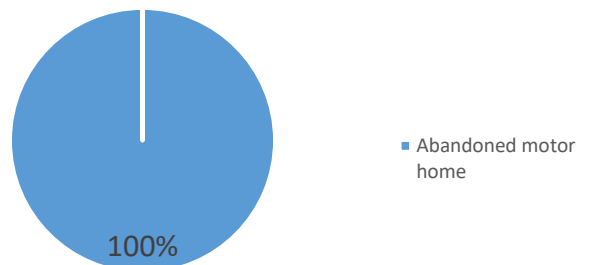
