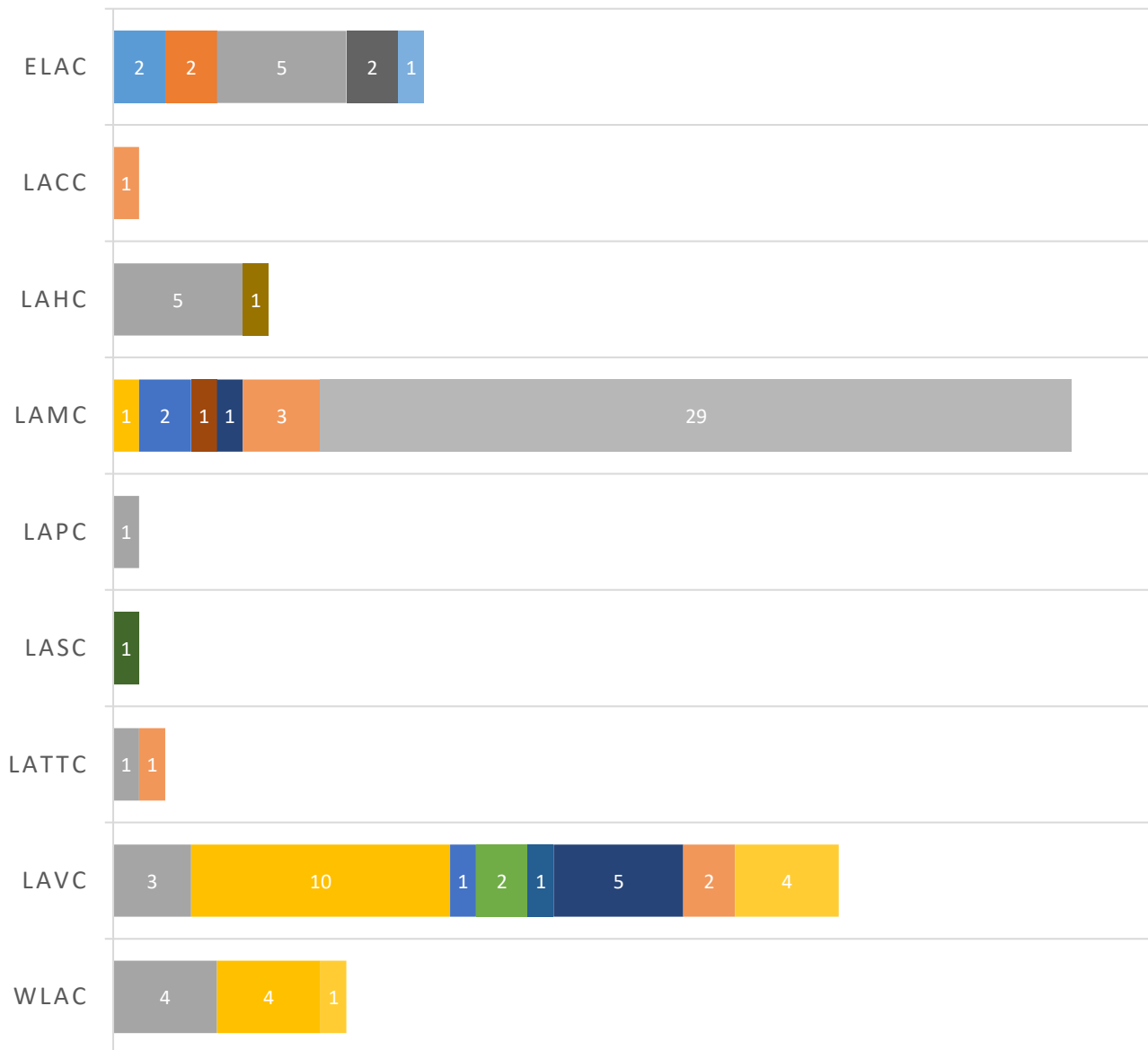

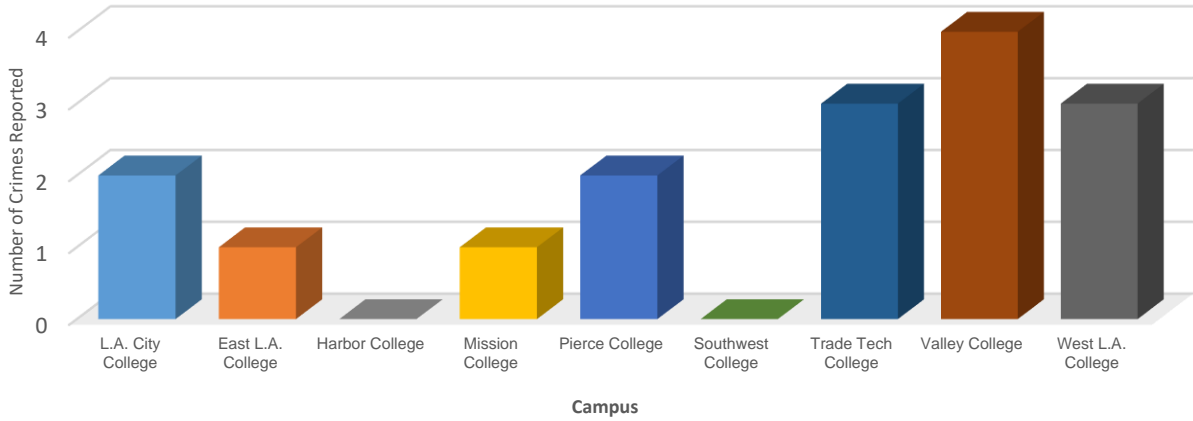

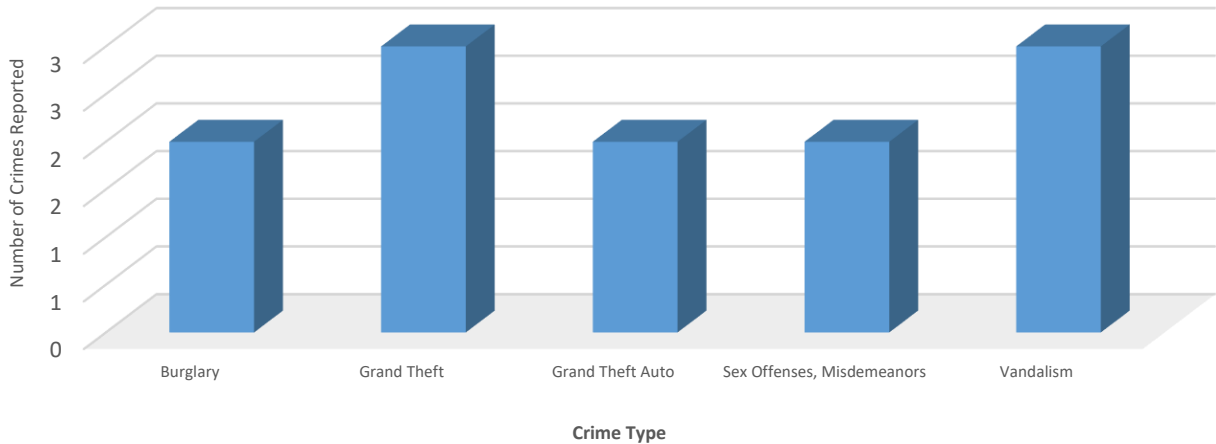

Total Part I & II By Campus

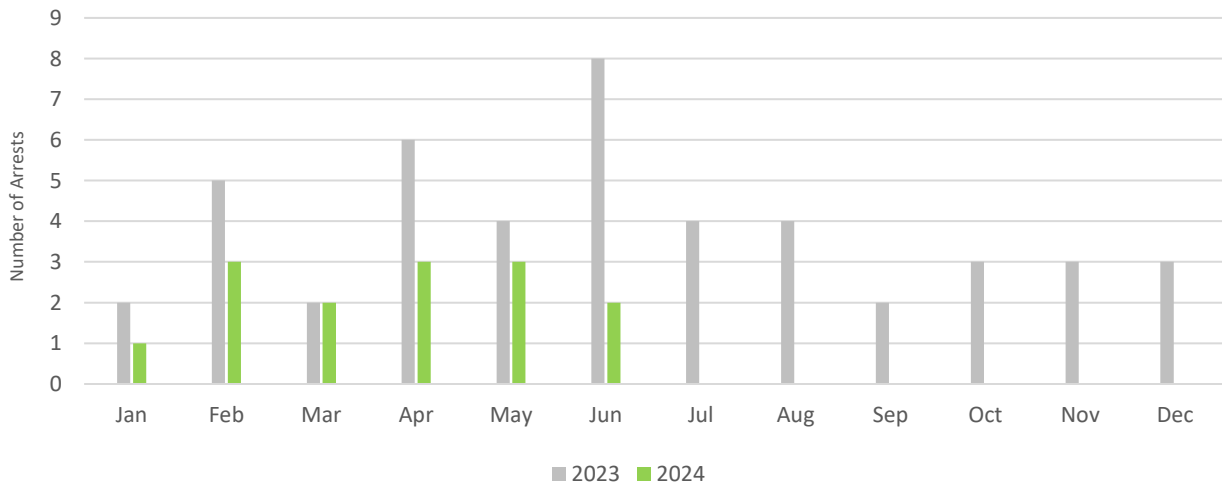

Year-to-Date Arrests by Month

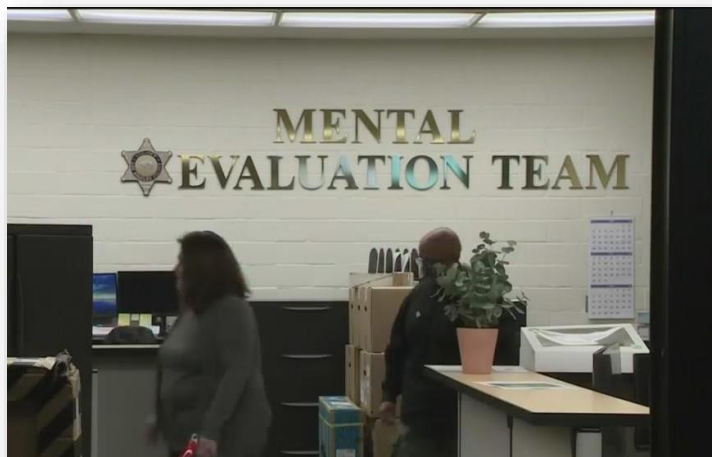

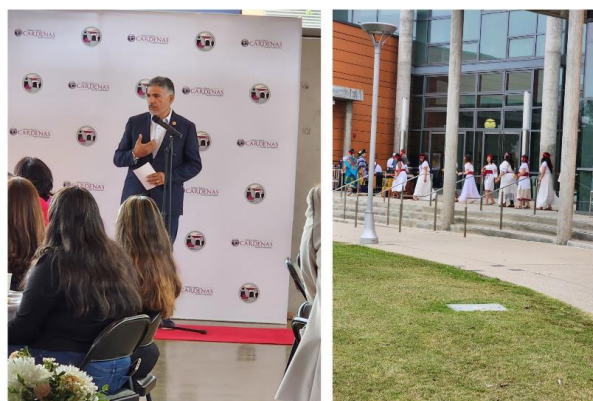

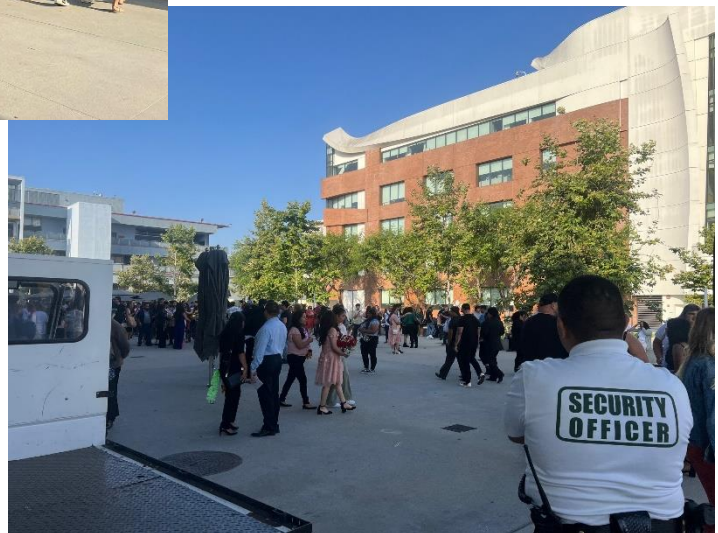


Los Angeles Trade Tech College
