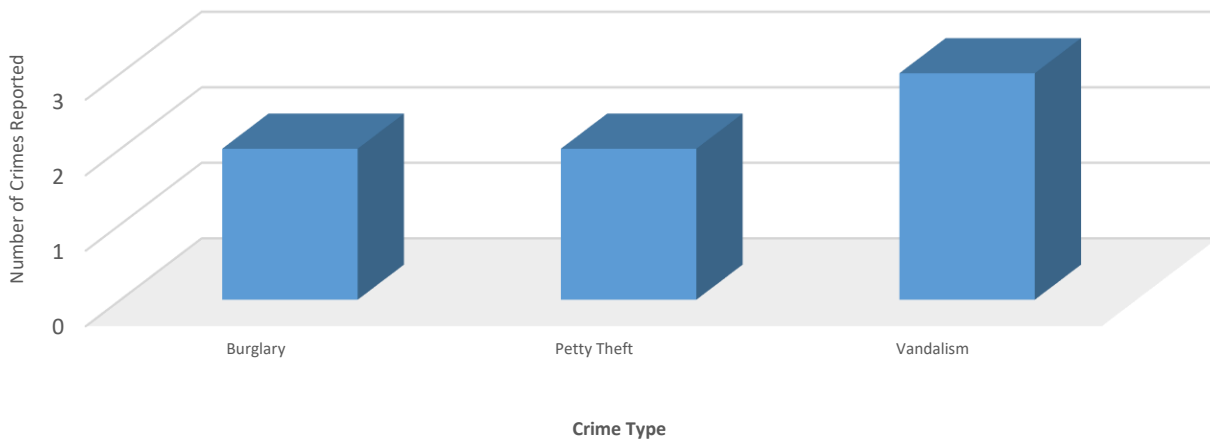

Total Part I & II By Campus

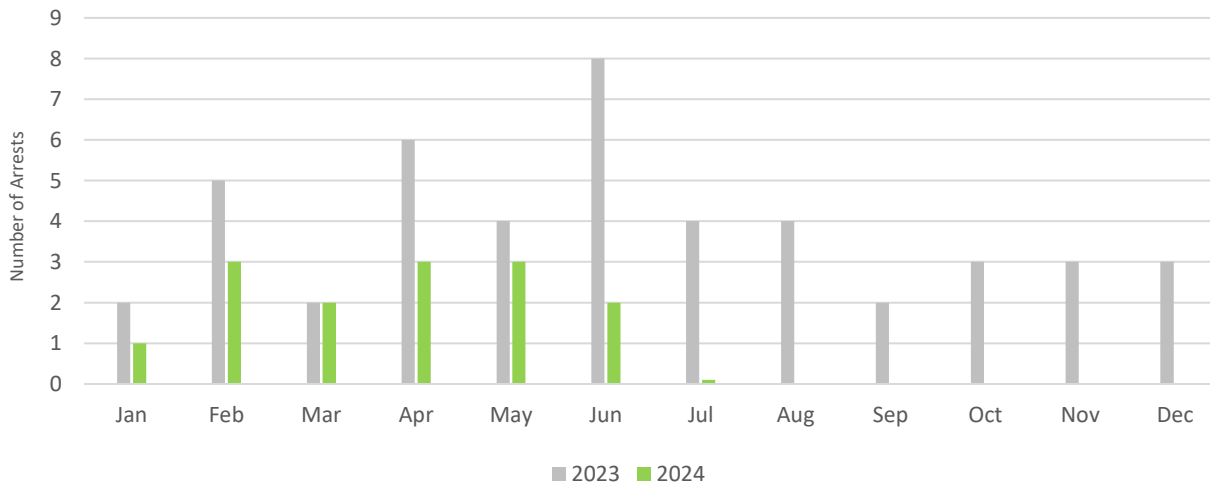

Year-to-Date Arrests by Month

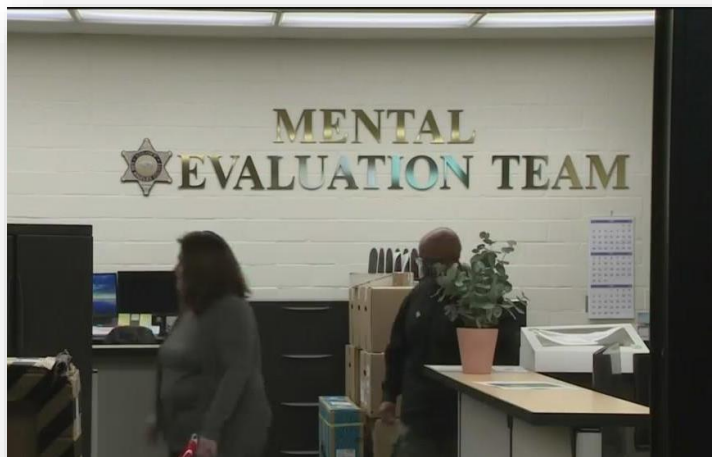


HEAT Program Update

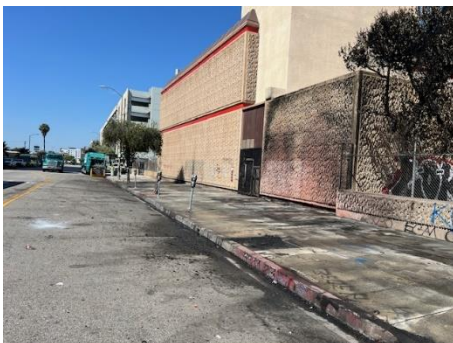
Los Angeles Trade Tech College



On July 16th, Mental Evaluation Team Deputy Mangahis and Los Angeles City Sanitation services, coordinated a removal and cleaning of two homeless encampment locations near Los Angeles Trade Tech College. Employees and students at LATIC previously voiced their concerns regarding safety and cleanliness near the college due to the increased number of visible homelessness and encampments.



Team Leader Deputy Lopez and Deputy Mangahis spoke with the individuals at the homeless encampments prior to the removal of the encampments to offer them shelter services and to give the individuals adequate time to remove their belongings. Deputies from the Community College Bureau assisted in monitoring traffic and assured the safety of Los Angeles City Sanitation employees while they conducted the removal and cleaning. The homeless encampments were removed and cleaned with no incidents to report.



The employees from a nearby business on Hill Street voiced their gratitude to the Deputies and Los Angeles City Sanitation for the removal of the encampments. LATIC employees also voiced their gratitude. LATIC Administrators were connected with the Los Angeles City Sanitation and will be requesting signage surrounding the campus indicating there will be cleaning on a weekly basis.
