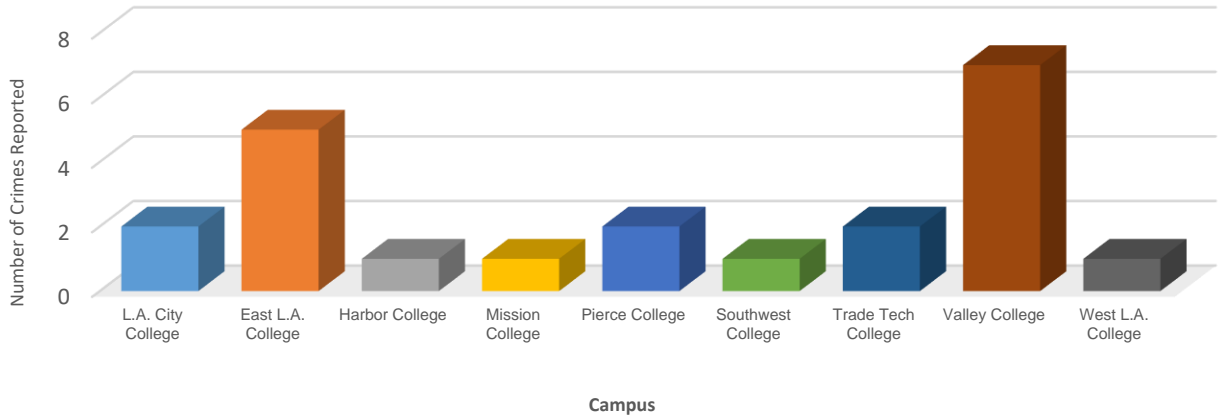

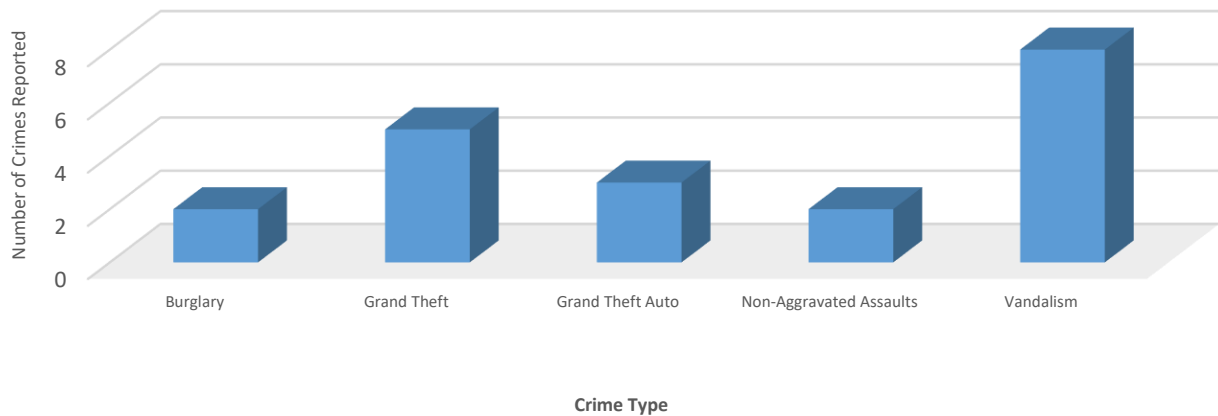

Total Part I & II By Campus

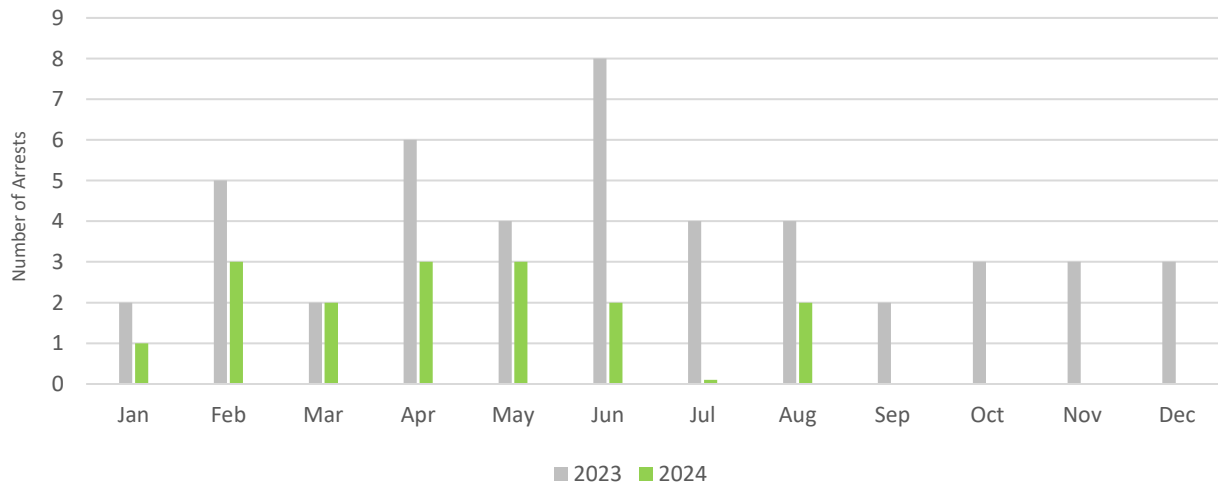

Year-to-Date Arrests by Month

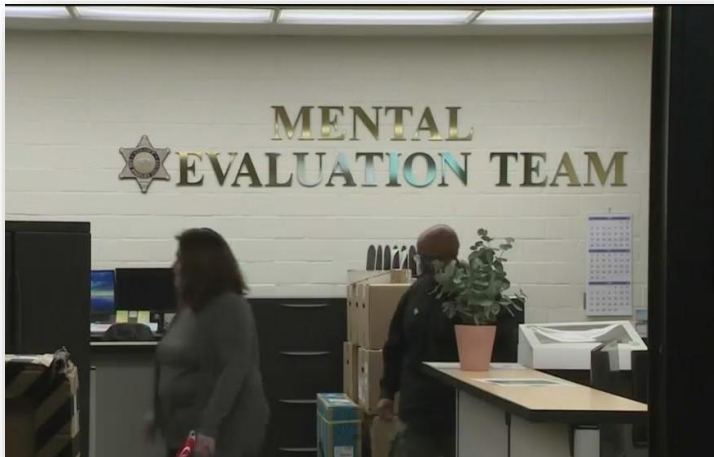


HEAT Program Update

During the month of August, Director Marcia Cagigas of the ELAC Child Development Center (CDC), hired several new staff members. Director Cagigas requested for the ELAC CCS personnel provide a quick training on what to do during an emergency situation. The CDC provides comprehensive, developmentally appropriate early childhood (ages 2-5) educational programs.

On August 20, 2024, deputies Sampson and Elias provided training to the CDC staff. The training included what to do in case of an earthquake, fire, active shooter, etc. Creating a comprehensive emergency response plan helps preventing chaos and confusion during a crisis but also builds a sense of security for parents and staff.

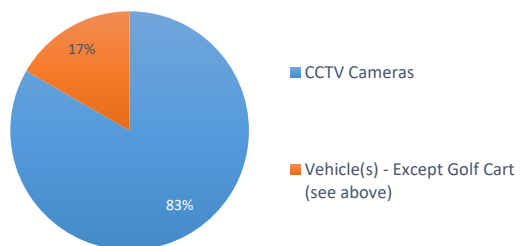

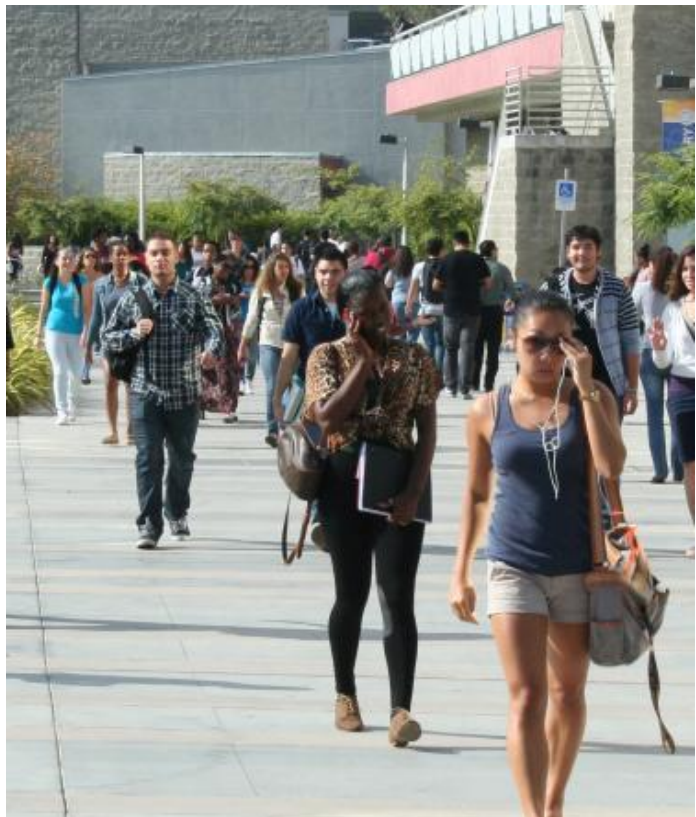
West Los Angeles College

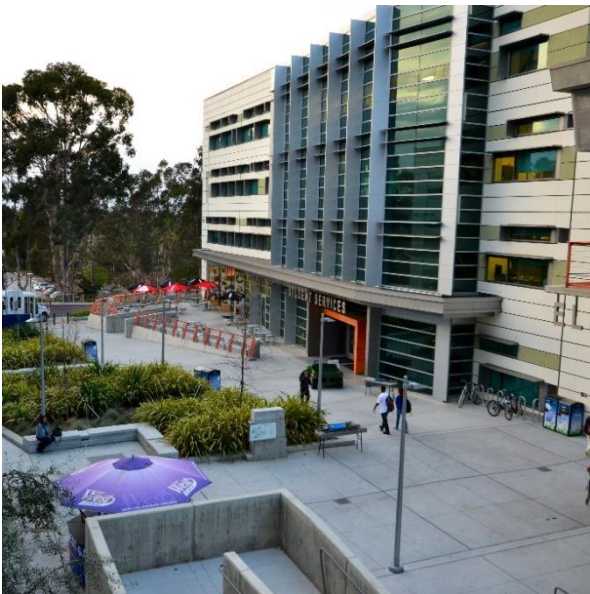
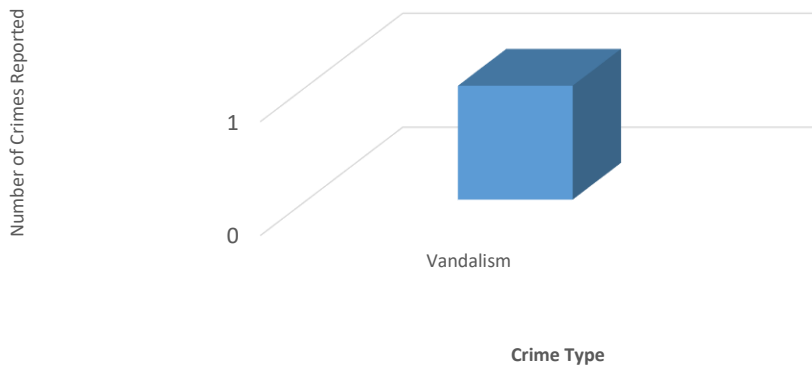

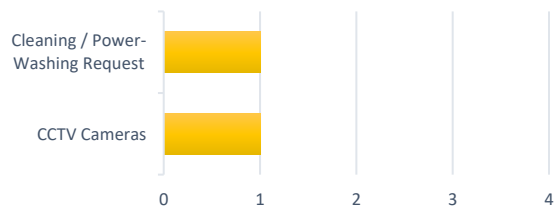
