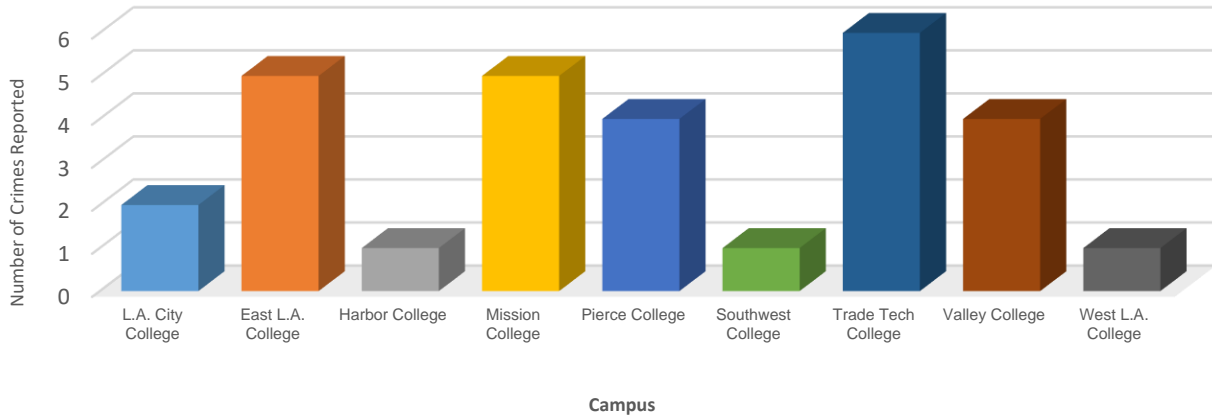

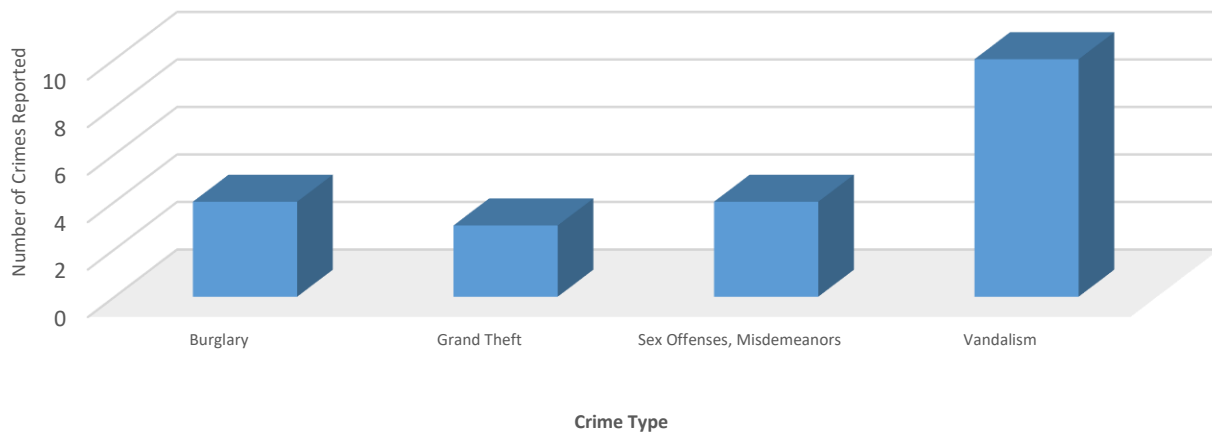

Total Part I & II By Campus

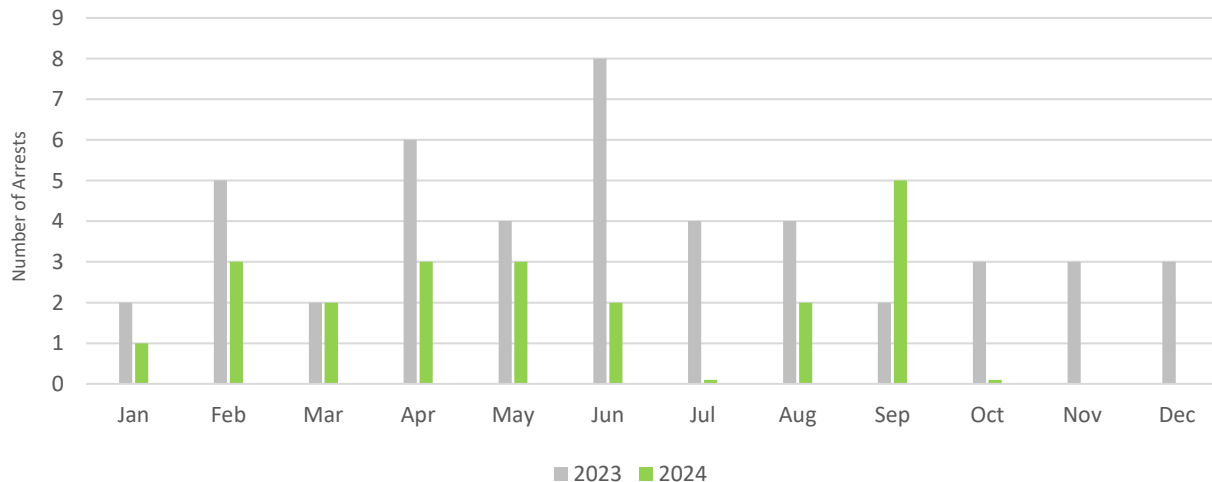

Year-to-Date Arrests by Month

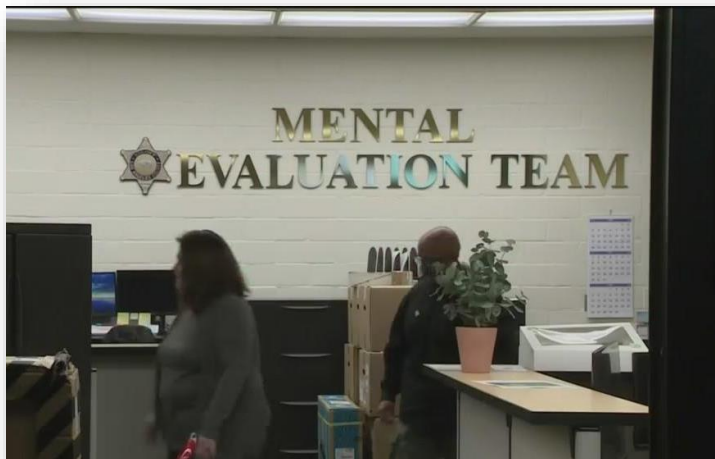


HEAT Program Update
