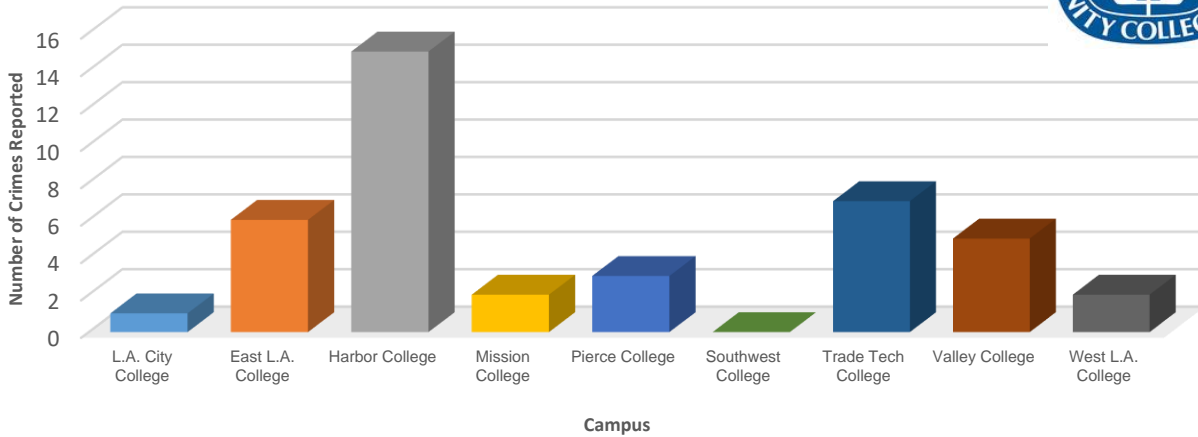

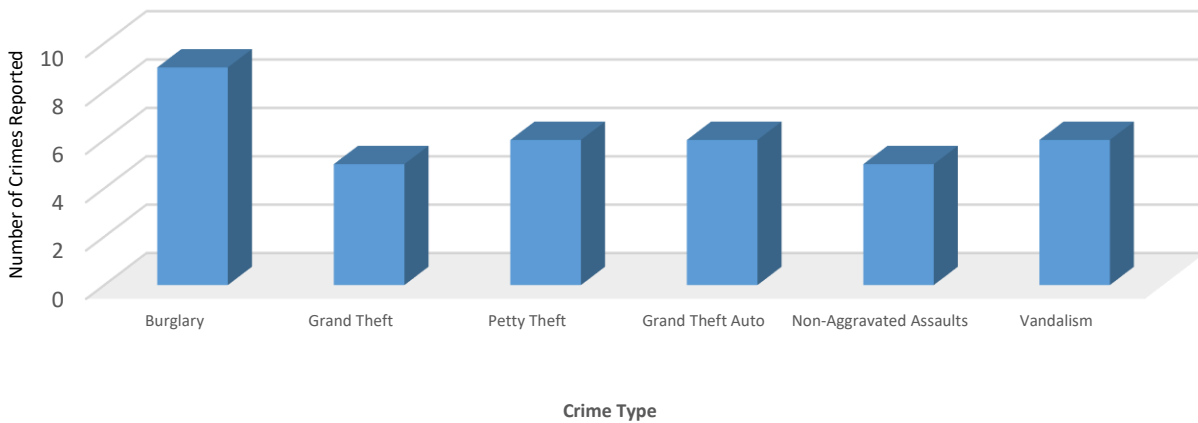

Total Part I & II By Campus

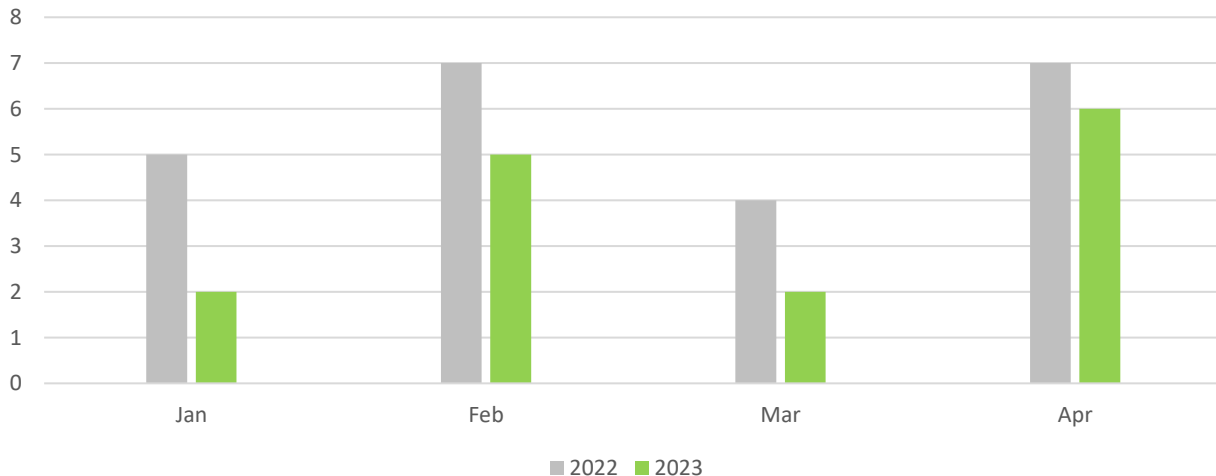

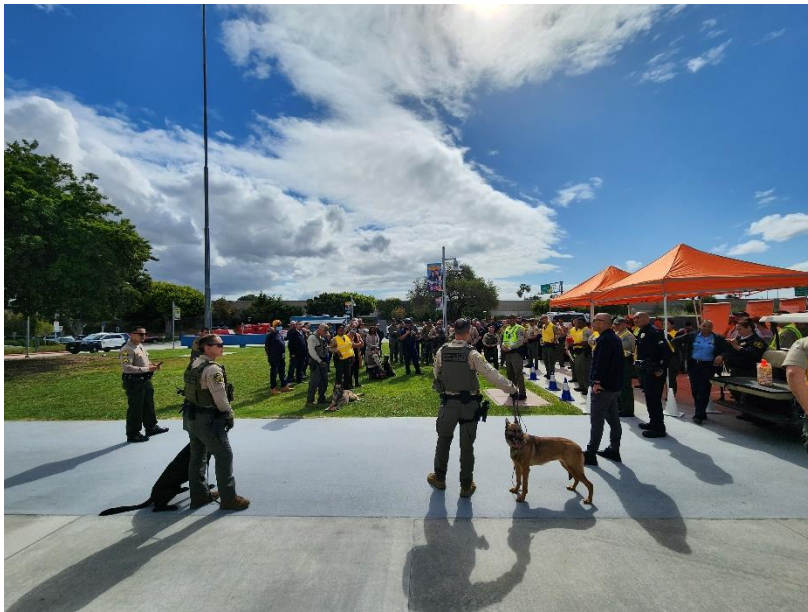

ELAC had six crimes reported in the month of April and one felony warrant arrest.

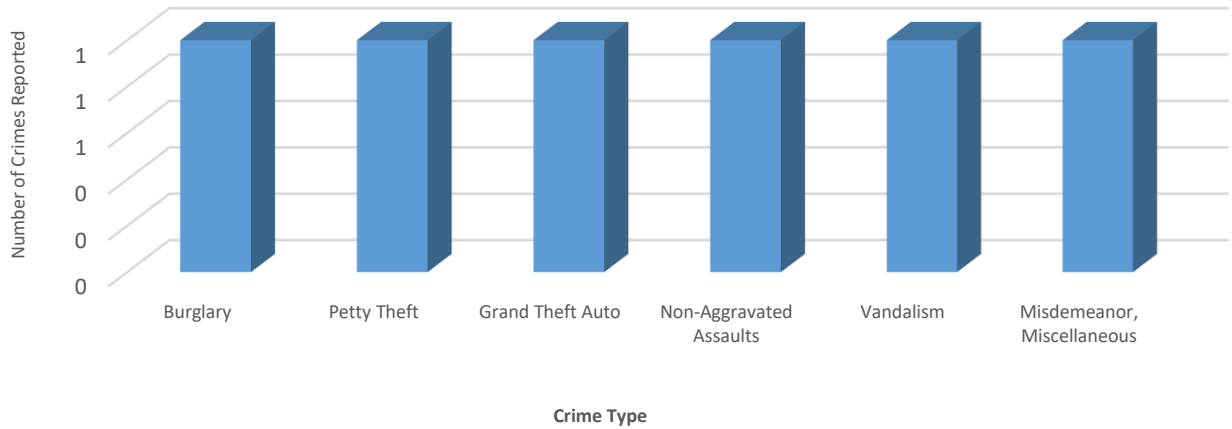

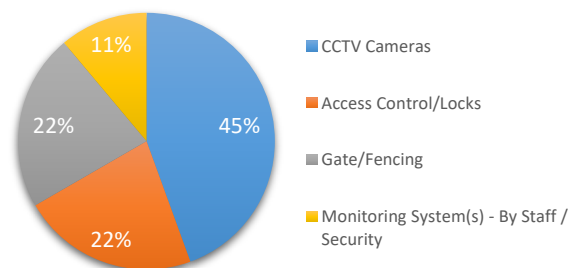

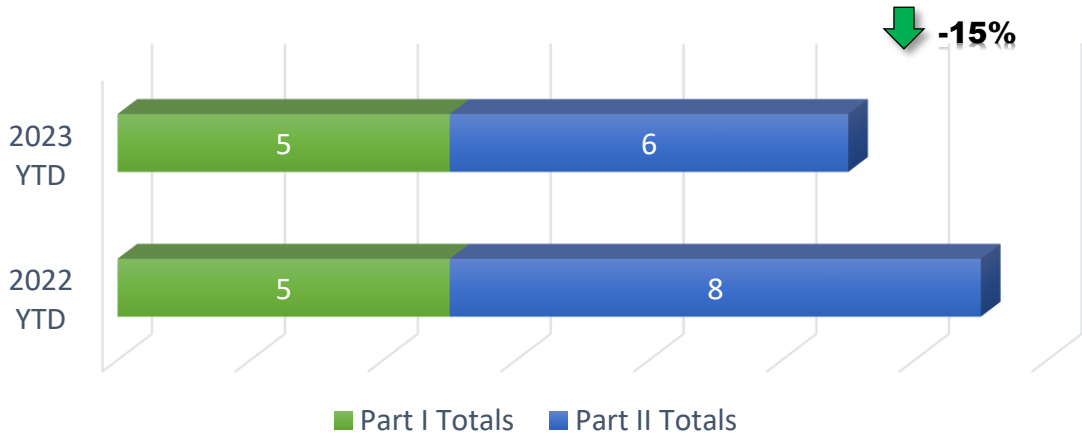

CCTV camera issues was the top concern this month as well as year-to-date.

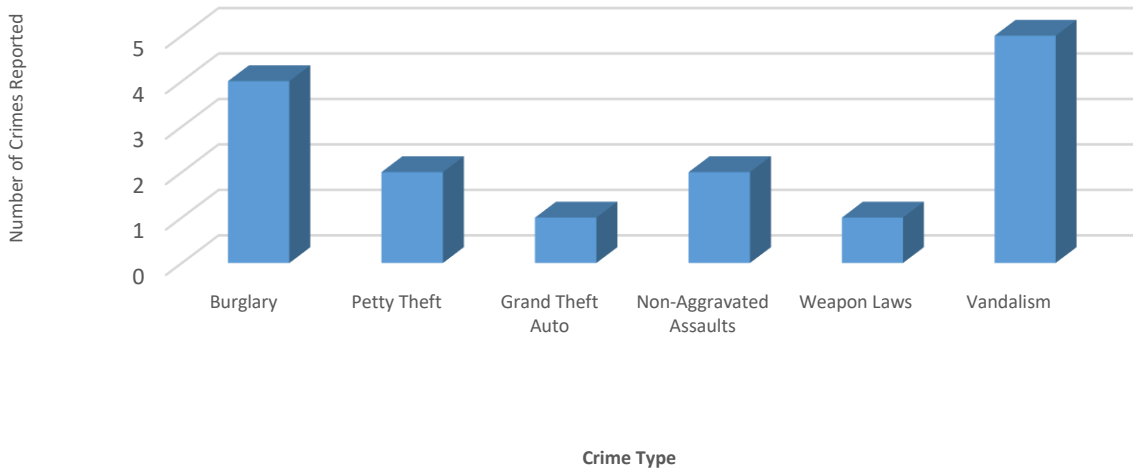

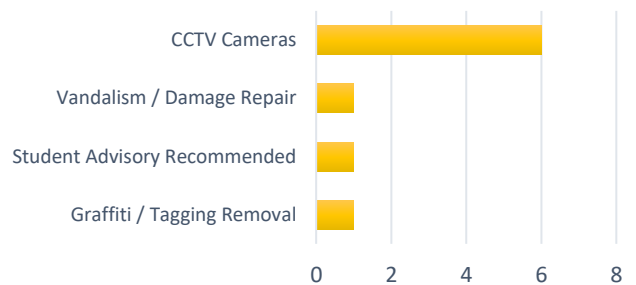

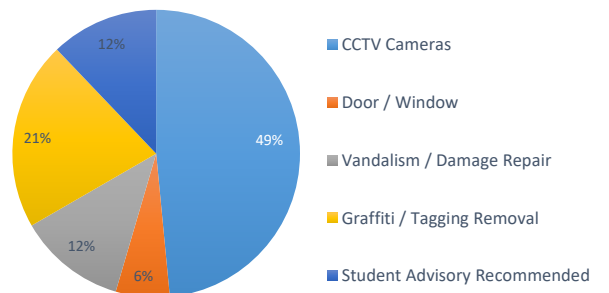
Two people were arrested, who were suspected of committing several vandalism crimes on campus. LASD personnel have been actively patrolling the campus to help prevent further crimes.

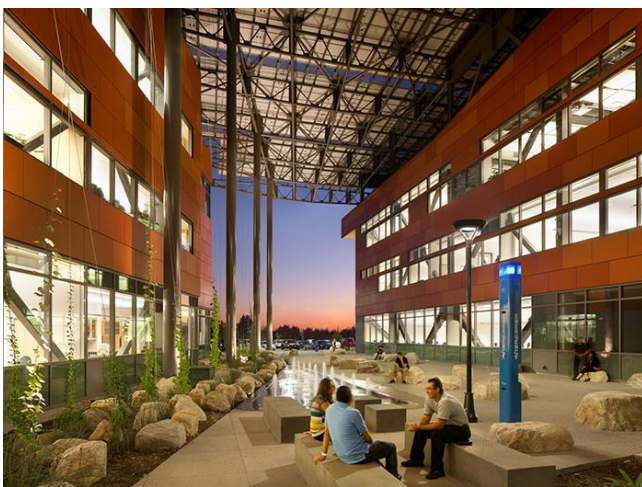
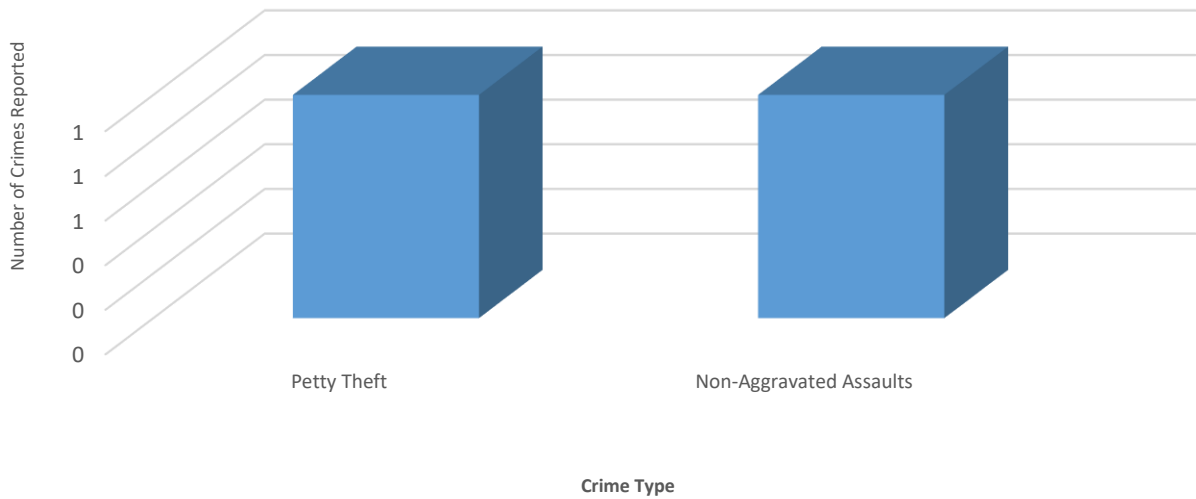
LAMC had two crimes reported for the month of April and no arrests.

Doors/windows as well as CCTV camera issues were the top safety and security concerns reported for the month with doors/windows begin the top concern year-to-date.

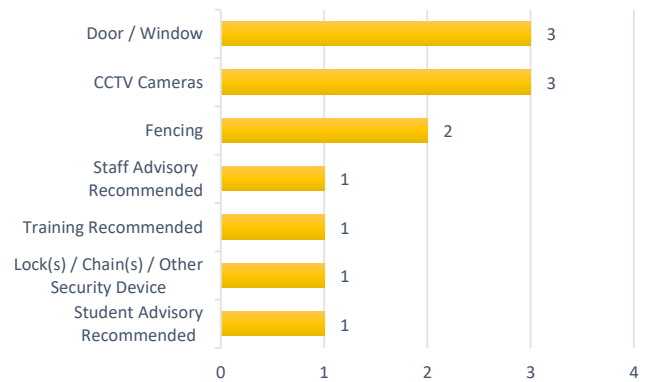

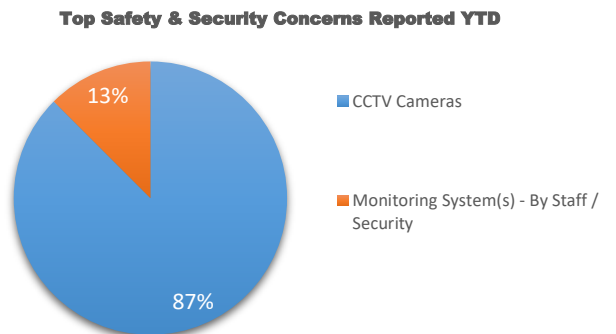
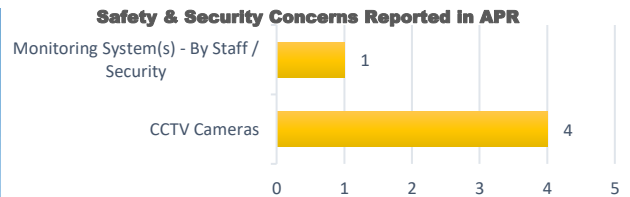
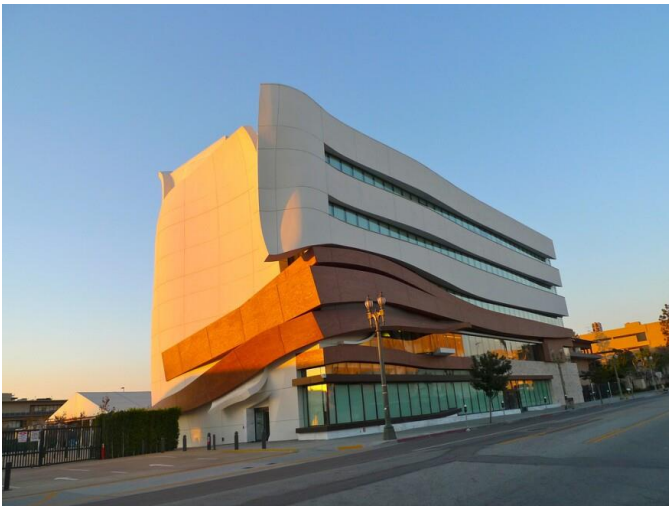
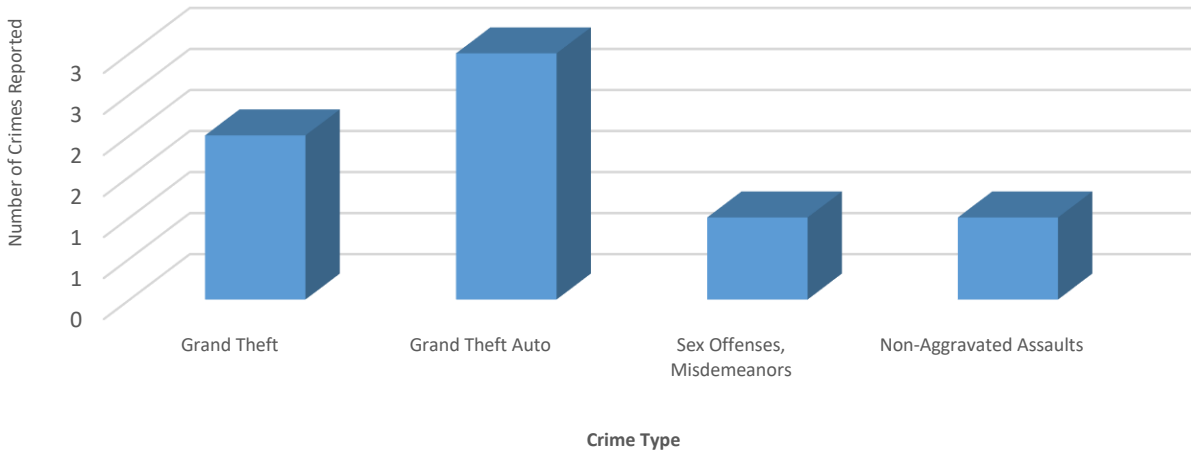
LATTC had seven crimes reported in the month of April and no arrests.

A suspect was identified in a vehicle theft that occurred in the 24th St. Parking Structure. A crime bulletin was distributed which led to his arrest in early May. Detectives are currently investigating similar crimes from the parking structures to see if he is possibly responsible for those as well. A second suspect has been identified in connection with recent vehicle thefts. Detectives assigned to Community College Bureau have been actively looking for the suspect. Additional patrol checks by Community College Bureau detectives, TSU, and sergeants have been conducted.

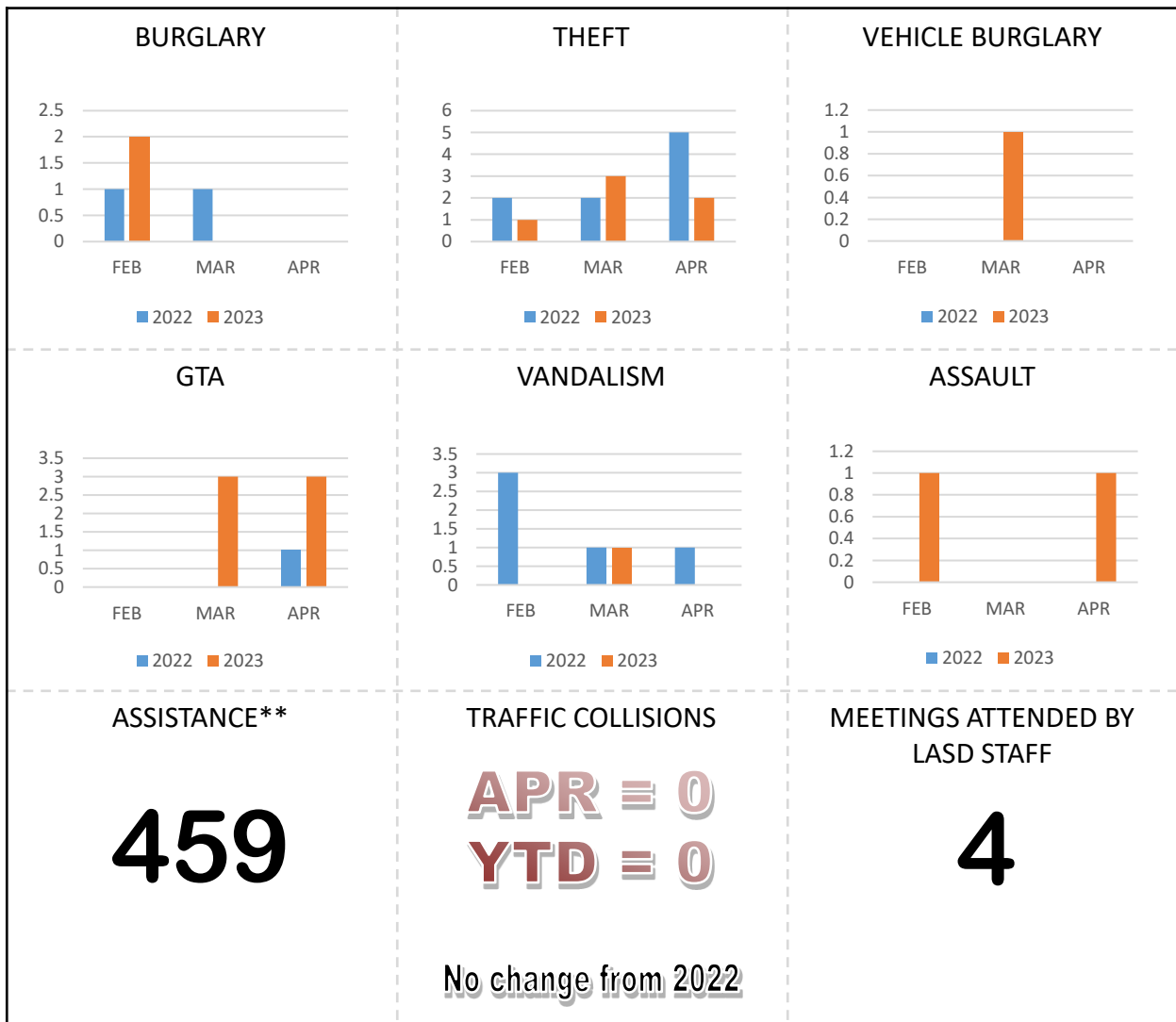
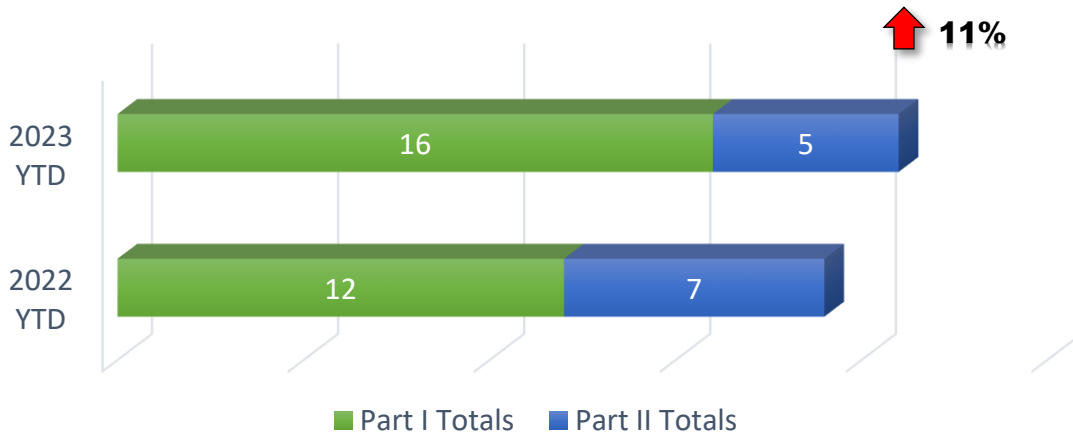

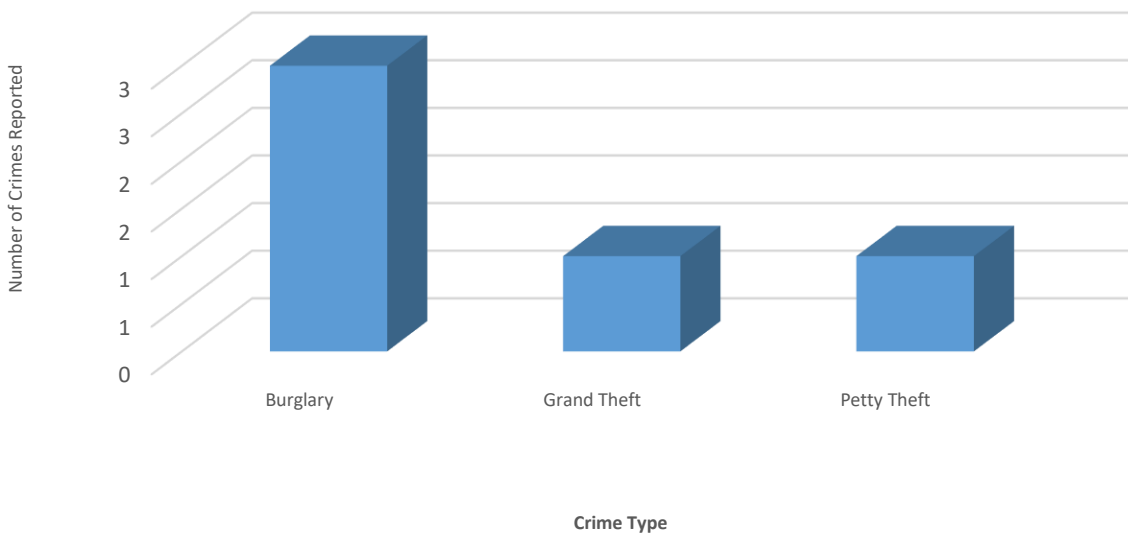
LAVC had five crimes reported for the month of April and one misdemeanor warrant arrest for loitering.

Safety and security concerns are being regularly reported, with CCTV camera issues as the primary concern year-to-date.

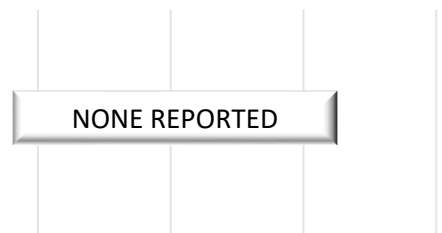

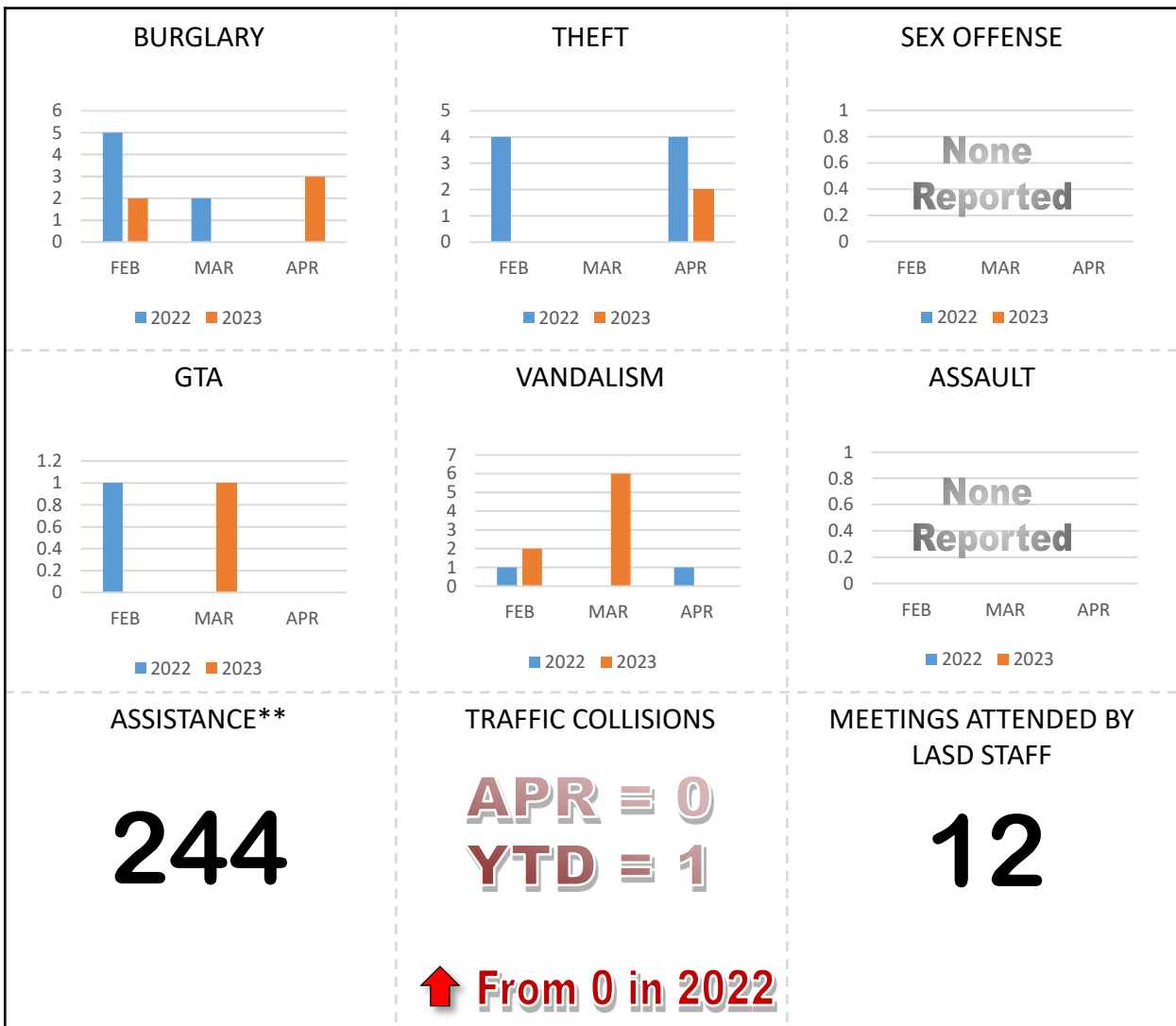
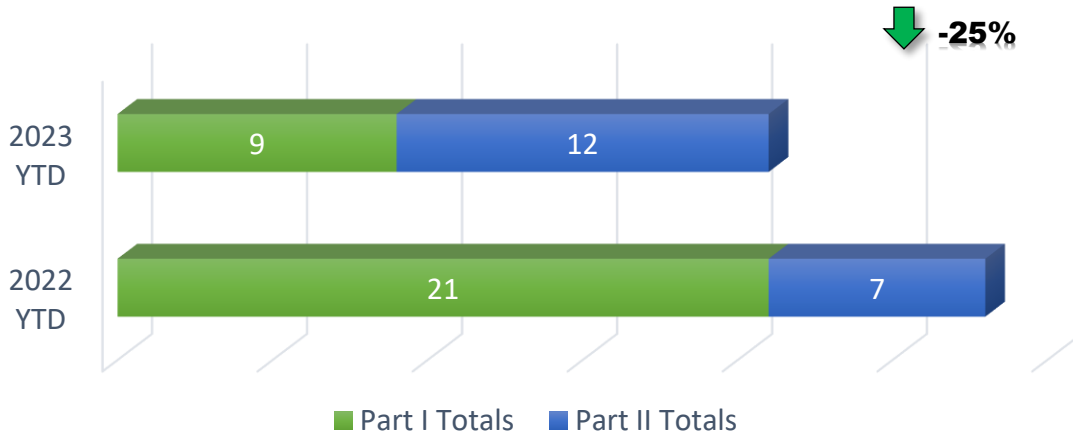


Top Safety & Security Concerns Reported YTD

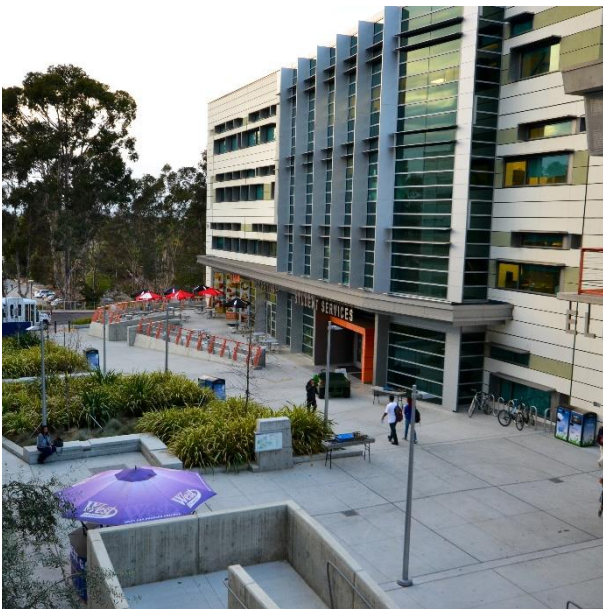
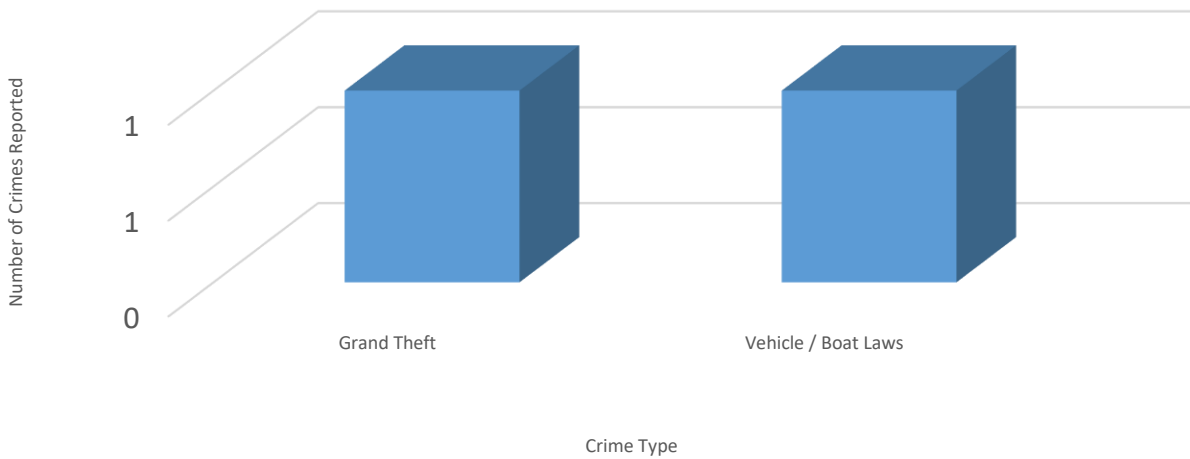
There were two crimes and no arrests reported for the month of April at WLAC.

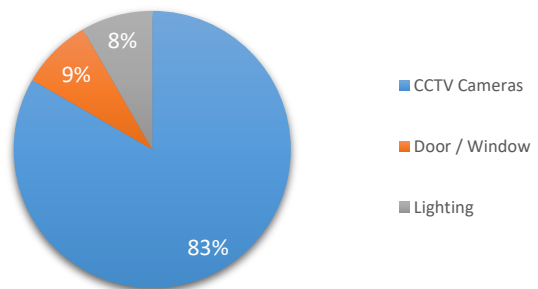

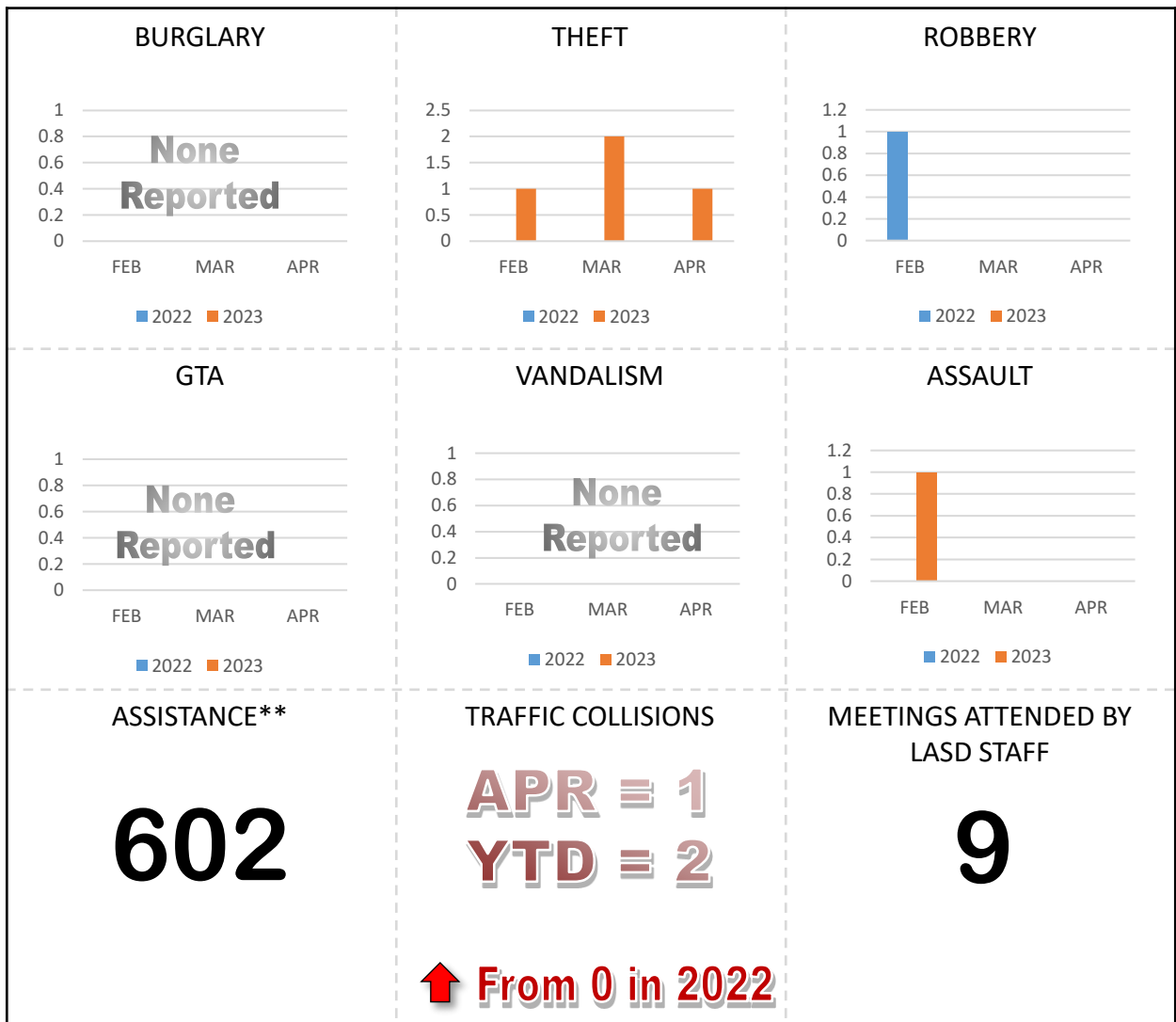
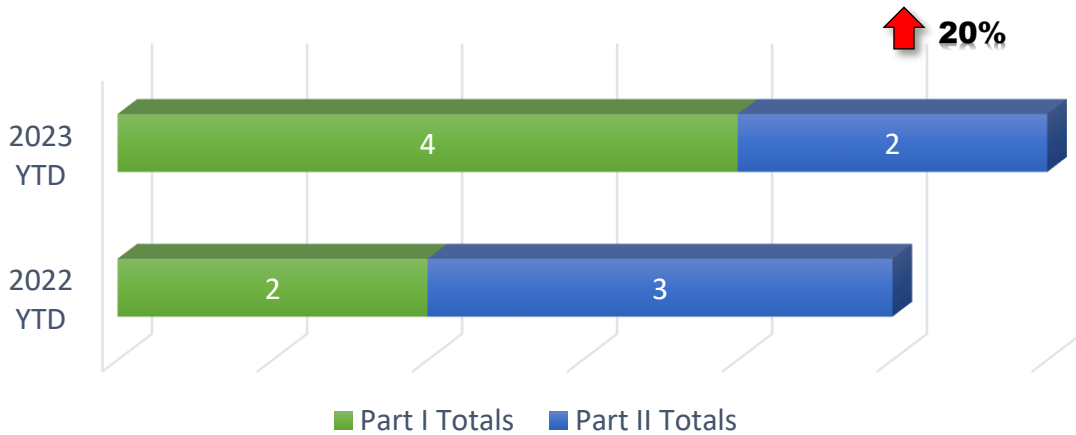


Top Safety & Security Concerns Reported YTD
