# **Monthly Report Community College Bureau**

During the month of May, LASD Community College Bureau conducted an active shooter exercise at Los Angeles Harbor College. This wide scale



exercise collaborated with surrounding agencies who worked in unison to ensure the safety of all.

This exercise took place at LAHC Library to which the acting suspect shot multiple blank rounds simulating a shooting. LAHC Deputies and Security Officers responded in seconds, barricading the acting suspect to the second floor LAHC Library. LAHC Administration was notified and initiated a full lock down.

Using both the Everbridge Mass Notification System and the phone

intercoms throughout all LAHC Buildings,
Students and Faculty were notified. LAHC
Faculty was able to utilize their previous active shooter training from our Training and Support Unit such as locking all doors,



blocking entrances to the classrooms, and silencing cellphones.

The Los Angeles City Fire Department along with Deputies entered the LAHC Library and treated all acting gunshot wound victims (LAHC Students/Faculty Volunteers). Once the acting suspect was arrested, LAHC lockdown was lifted and LAHC Administration activated their Incident Command System.

This exercise illustrated the different aspects of an active shooter scenario and allowed cooperation between multiple agencies. A special thank you to all who participated in this exercise. Our priority at LASD Community College Bureau is to create a safe learning environment for students and faculty.











#### Top Security & Safety Concerns (YTD by Campus)





#### Training & Support Unit (TSU)

#### May Update...

- TSU and LACCD Safety and Security Services conducted Active Shooter trainings for over 250 students, staff, and faculty at ELAC, Mission, Valley and Pierce College.
- TSU conducted an active shooter training specifically for the Welcome Center at ELAC on 05/30/23.
- TSU conducted a Veteran Cultural Competition training on 05/06/23.
- TSU conducted a full-scale active shooter exercise at Harbor College on 05/02/23 that included over 50 deputies. This full-scale exercise was done in cooperation with LA Fire Department, LASD K9, LASD Sheriff Information Bureau, and the participation of the LAHC Administration staff along with Safety and Security Services. The exercise simulated an active shooter at Harbor College's Library and employed student workers who acted as victims, a Deputy Sheriff who acted as the armed assailant, and the Library Staff practicing lockdown procedures. <a href="https://rb.gy/fc17n">https://rb.gy/fc17n</a>

### East Los Angeles College

ELAC had 10 crimes reported in the month of May and two felony arrests.


The first arrest involved a male student who threatened his ex-girlfriend and her male friend with a firearm. He was charged with aggravated assault with a deadly weapon.

The second arrest involved a non-student male who resisted arrest by deputies while being questioned on harassing students in the library. He was charged with assault and resisting a peace officer. These two incidents account for the five aggravated assaults for the month since each victim is counted as a separate crime stat.

CCTV camera problems were the top reported safety and security concerns for the month as well as year-to-date.


Overall, crime is up 29% from the previous year. Additional patrol checks have been conducted throughout the campus to help address the rise in crime.







#### Los Angeles City College

LACC had two crimes reported in May and no arrests.



CCTV camera issues are the highest safety and security concerns reported year-to-date. Overall, crime is down 13% from 2022.






### Los Angeles Harbor College

LAHC had three crimes reported for the month of May and no arrests.


CCTV camera issues were the top concerns this month as well as year-to-date.

Overall, crime is up 600% year-to-date from last year but the overall small numbers of crime are creating the larger than usual statistical changes. Crime is reported significantly less often on campus than is occurring off campus according to LAPD's locally reported crime data. 





The top safety and security concern reported for the month as well as year-to-date is inoperable emergency blue phones. The crime rate stayed the same as it was during this time last year.






Safety & Security Concerns Reported in MAY







LAPC had two crimes reported for the month of May and no arrests.


Doors/windows were the top safety and security concerns reported for the month as well as year-to-date.


LASC had two crimes reported in the month of May and no arrests.






LATTC had six crimes reported in the month of May and two arrests.




Two suspects were identified in a vehicle theft that occurred in the 24<sup>th</sup> St. Parking Structure. A crime bulletin was distributed which led to both of their arrests in the month of May.

The three vehicle burglaries were all window smashes with the vehicles ransacked that all occurred around the same time/location, most likely by the same suspect. Detectives are currently investigating these incidents.




Crime Type





Top Safety & Security Concerns Reported YTD






#### Los Angeles Valley College

Safety and security concerns are being regularly reported, with vandalism/damage repair as the primary concern year-to-date.


Overall, crime is down 6% from 2022.




Crime Type




Safety & Security Concerns Reported in MAY




Top Safety & Security Concerns Reported YTD









Top Safety & Security Concerns Reported YTD
