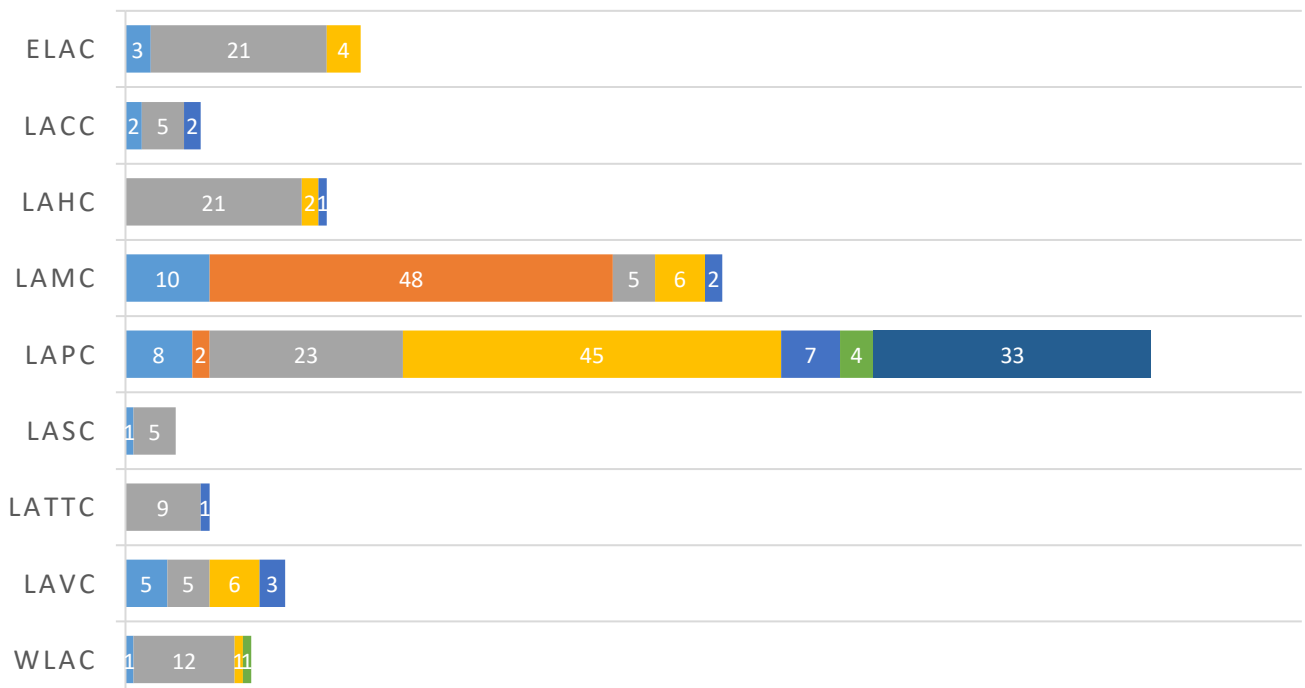
Community College Bureau (cont.)

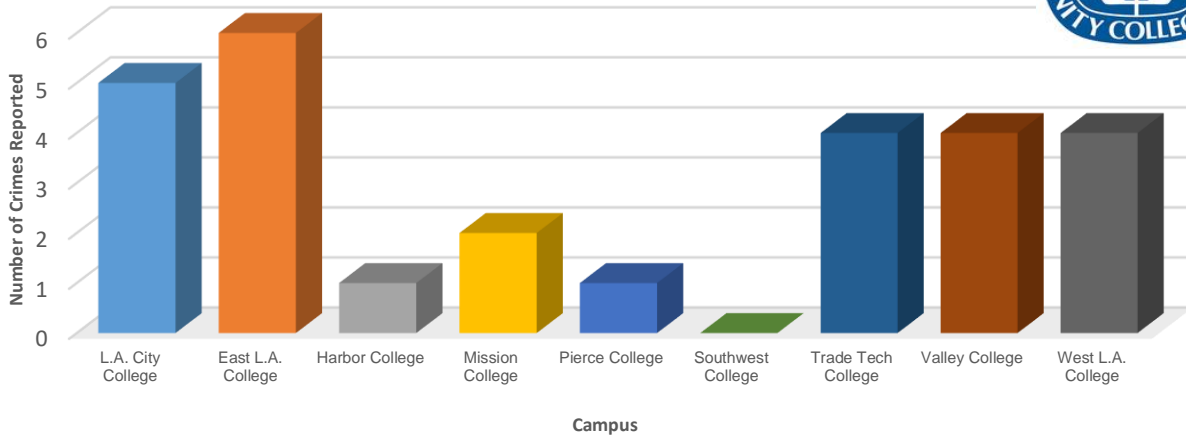

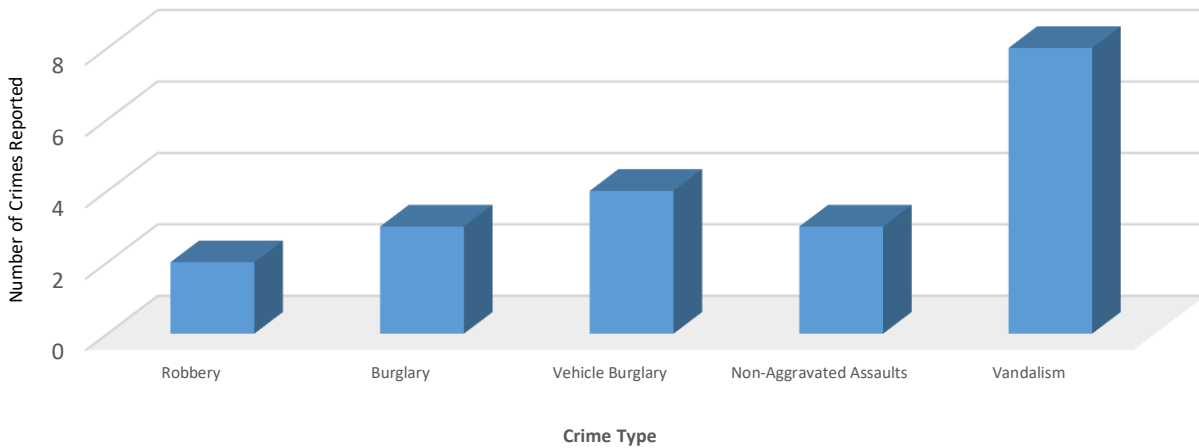

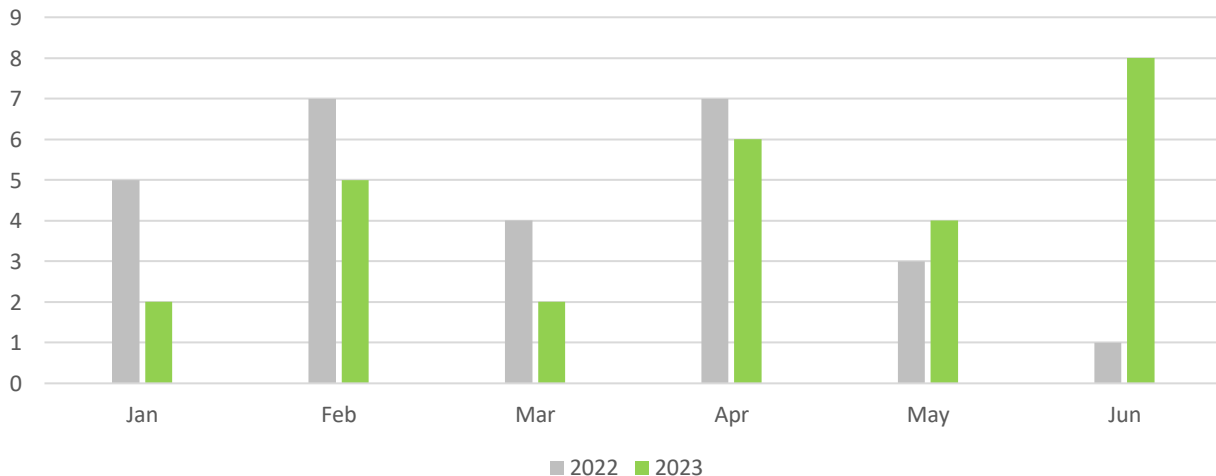

ELAC had six crimes reported in the month of June and one arrest. A female (unknown if student) was arrested for being drunk in public after causing a disturbance and screaming profanities.

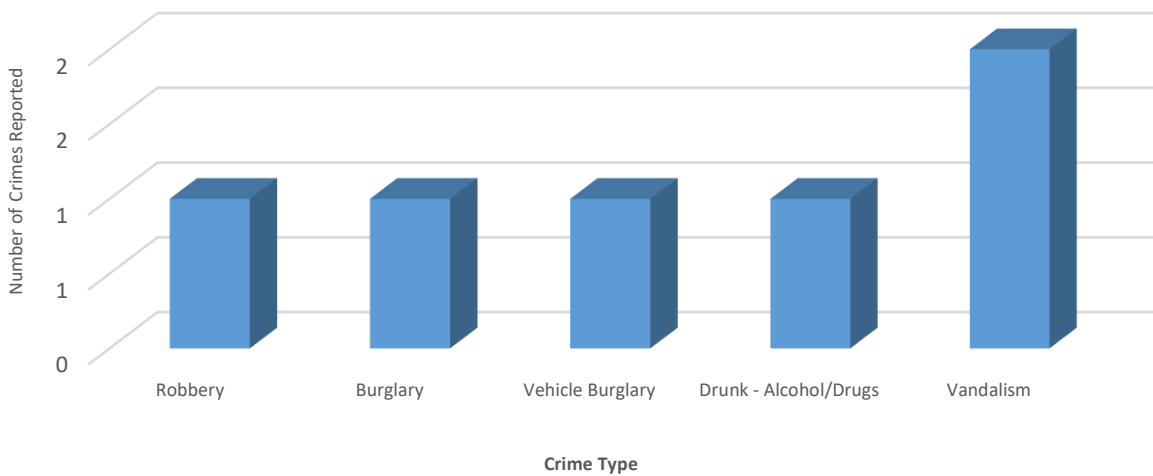

CCTV camera problems were the top reported safety and security concerns for the month as well as year-to-date.

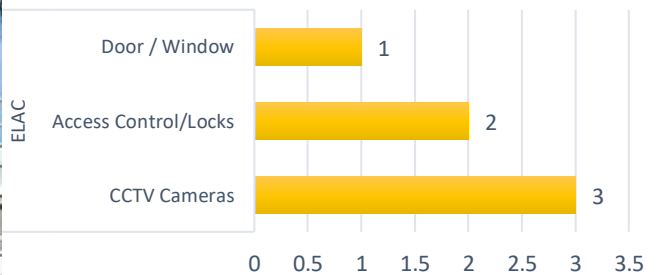

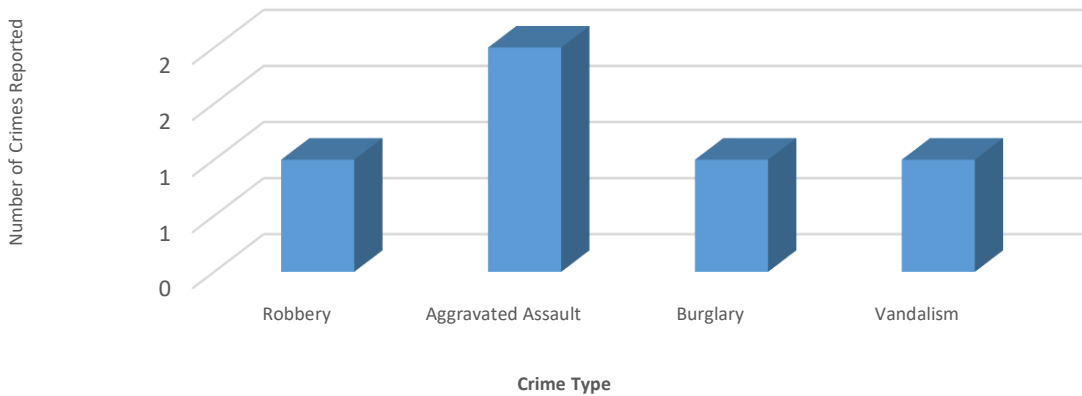
LACC had five crimes reported in June and one arrest of a male assault suspect. The male suspect (unknown if student) was arrested for assault on two victims.

CCTV camera issues were the top concerns this month as well as year-to-date.

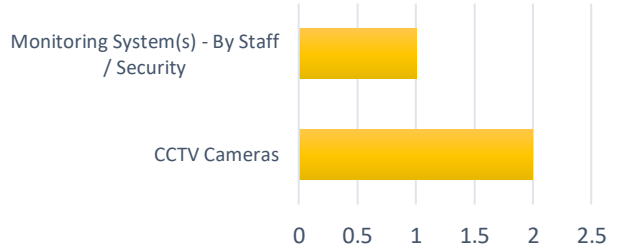

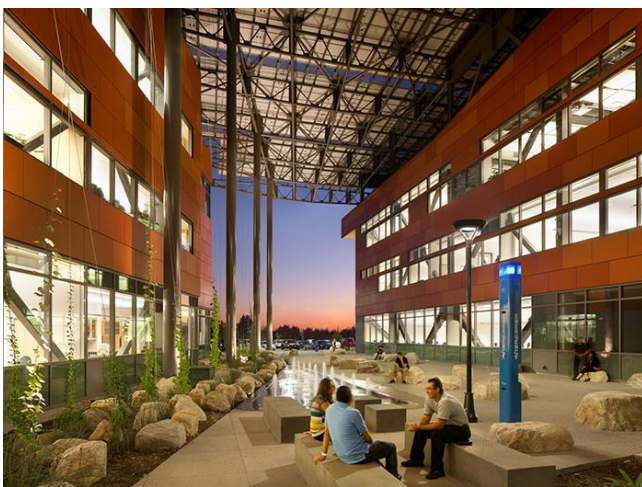
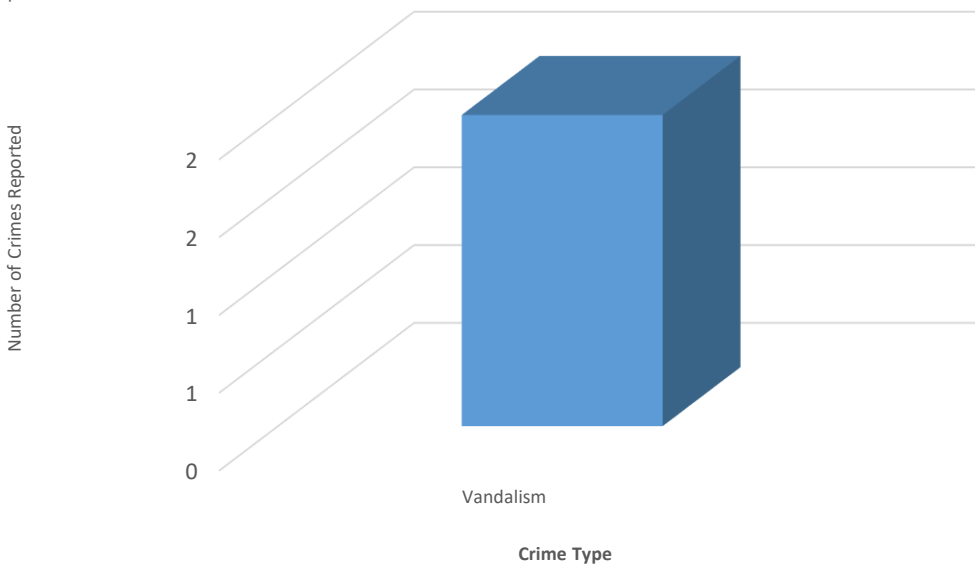
There were two crimes reported for the month of June and two arrests at LAMC.

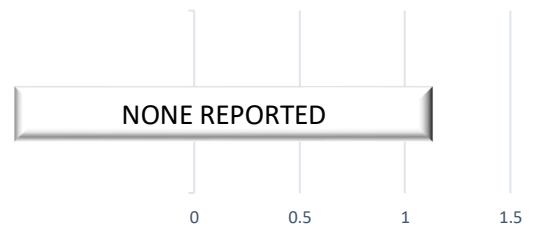
The top safety and security concern reported year-to-date is inoperable emergency blue phones. The crime rate stayed the same as it was during this time last year.

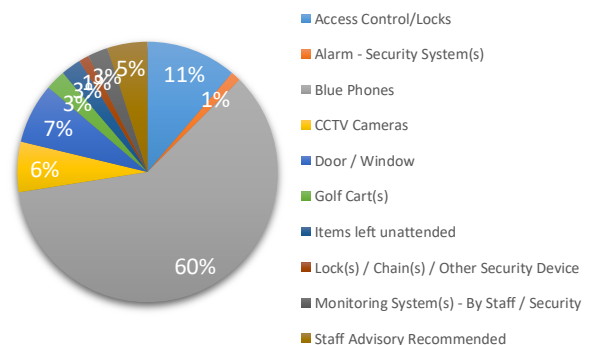

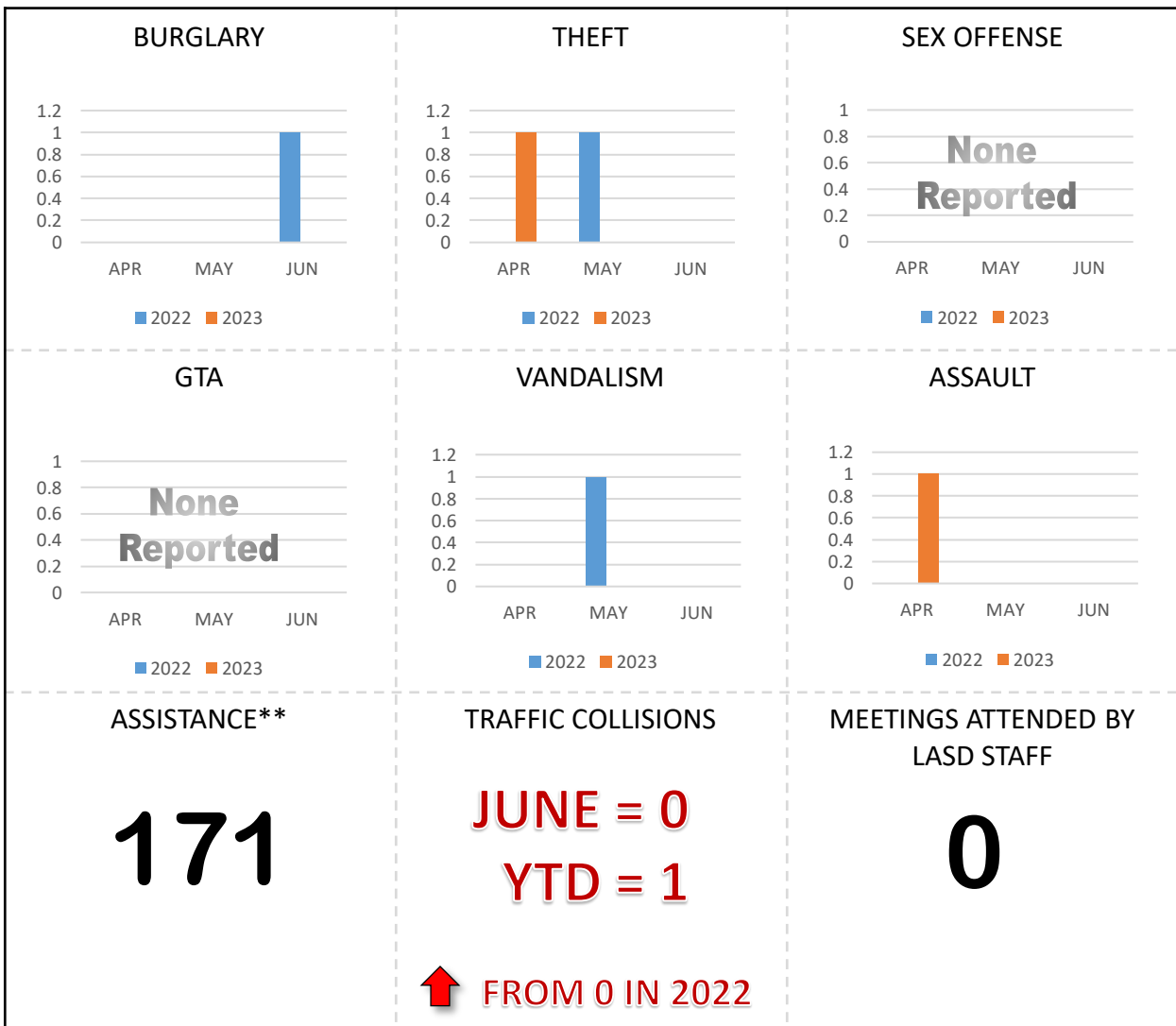
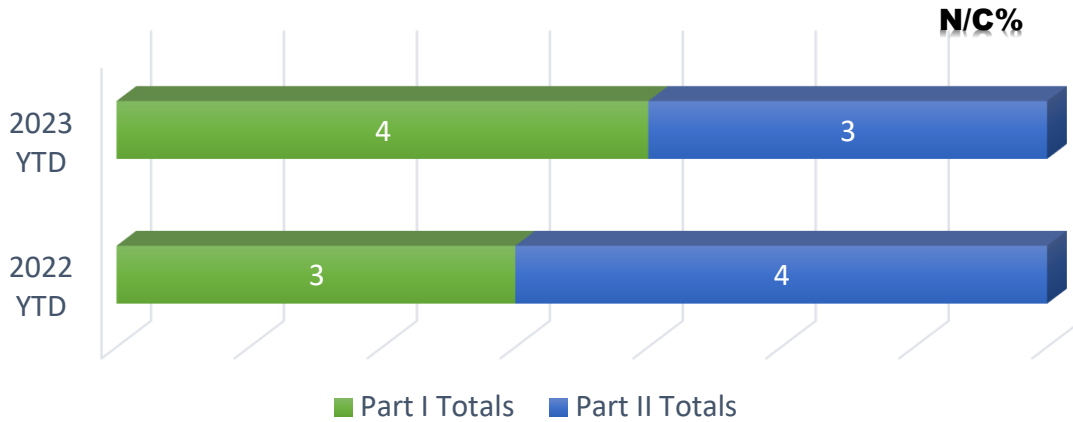

LAPC had one crime reported for the month of June and no arrests.

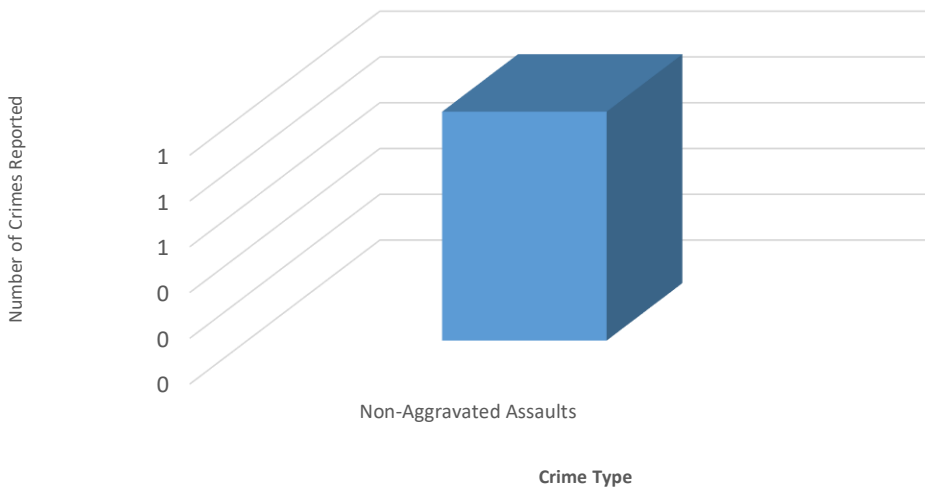

Doors/windows were the top safety and security concerns reported for the month as well as year-to-date.

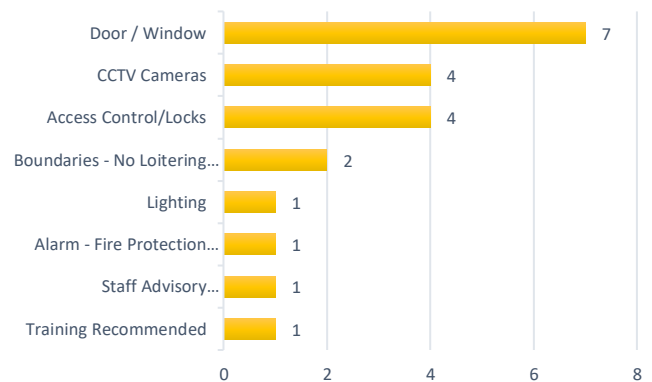
Reported crimes are currently down 50% from the previous year.

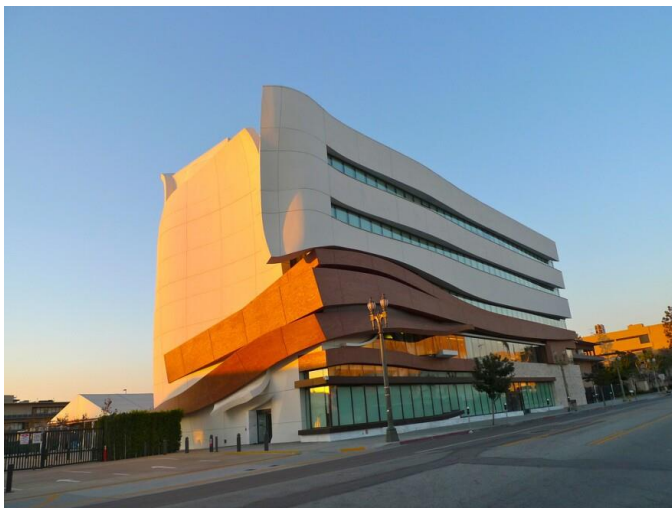
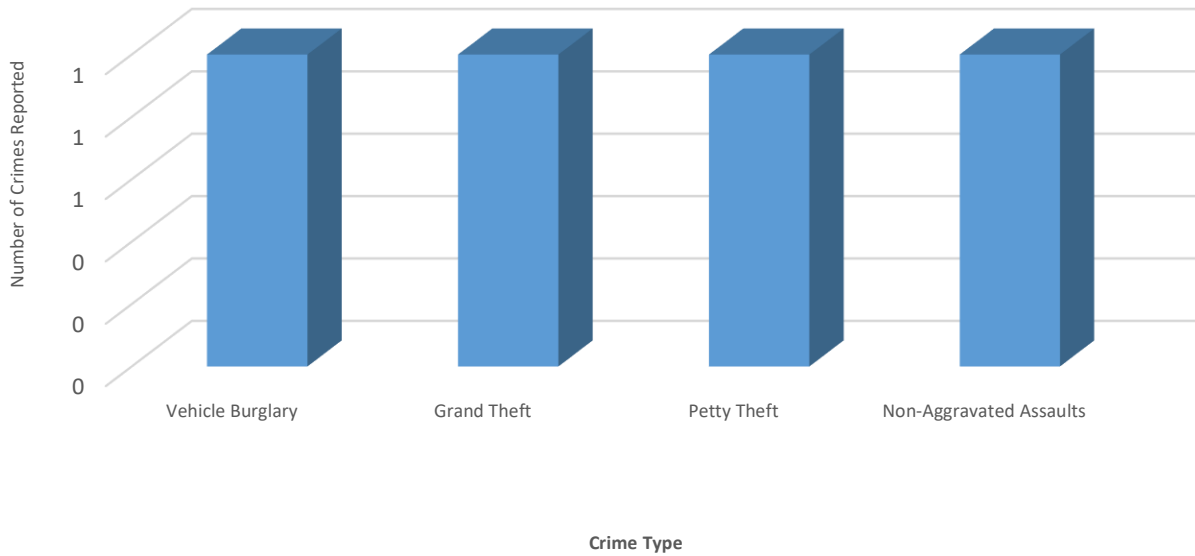
LATTTC had four crimes reported in the month of June and two arrests.

A fight between two students resulted in one of the students being arrested and charged with assault. He also had an outstanding trespassing warrant which accounted for the second arrest.

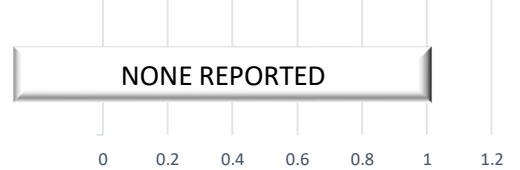
CCTV camera issues were the top safety and security concerns reported year-to-date. The crime rate has stayed the same as it was during this time last year.

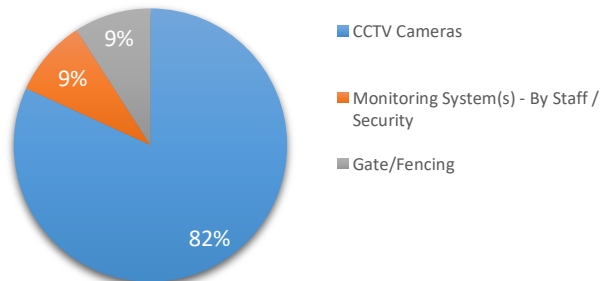

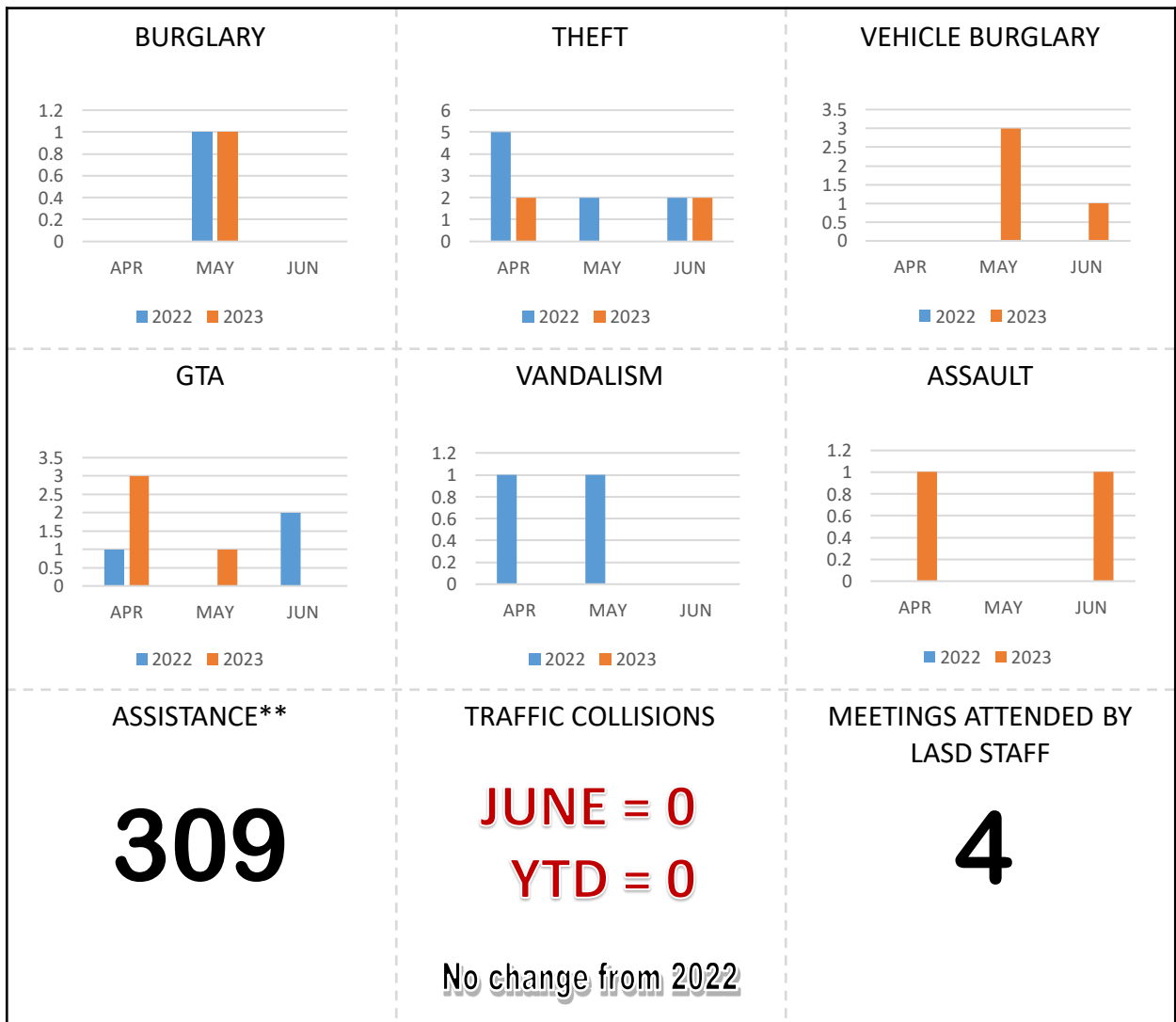
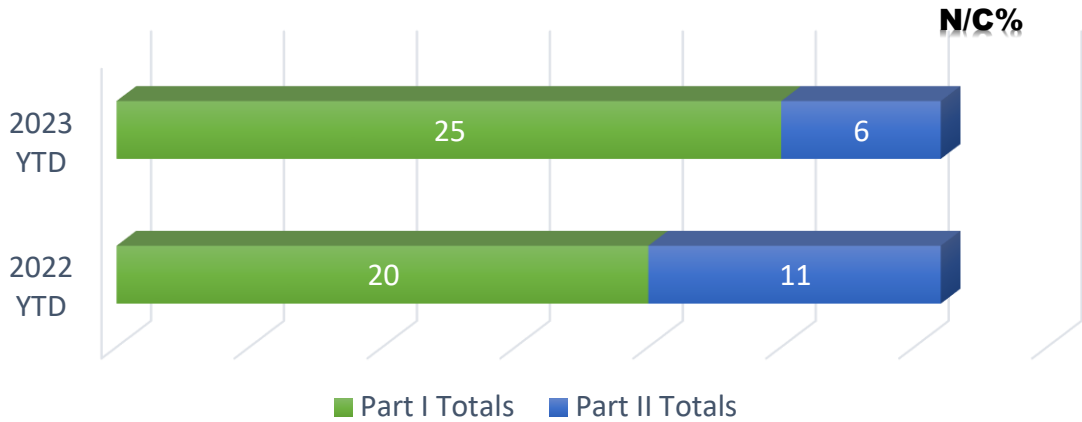

LAVC had four crimes reported for the month of June and no arrests.

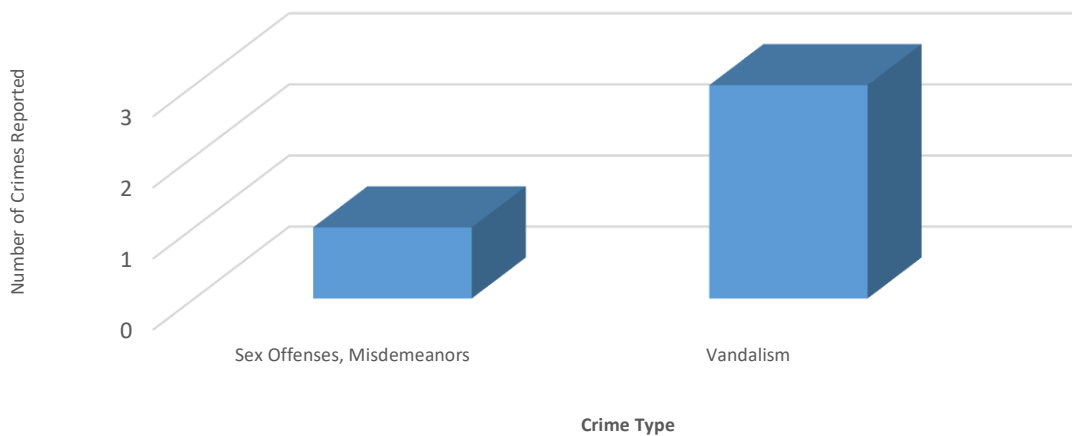
A crime bulletin was created for the indecent exposure that occurred and the suspect was identified. Detectives are actively investigating this case.

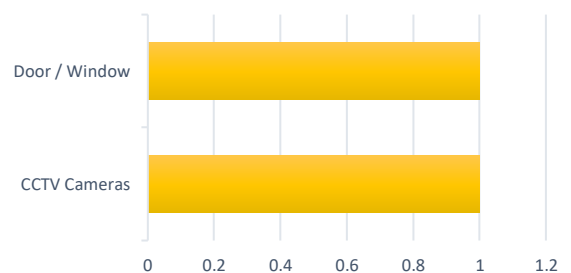
Overall, crime is down from 2022.

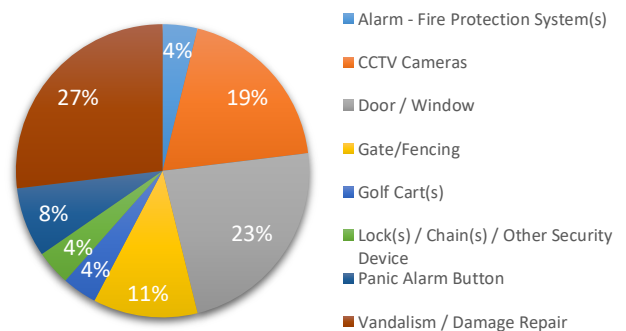

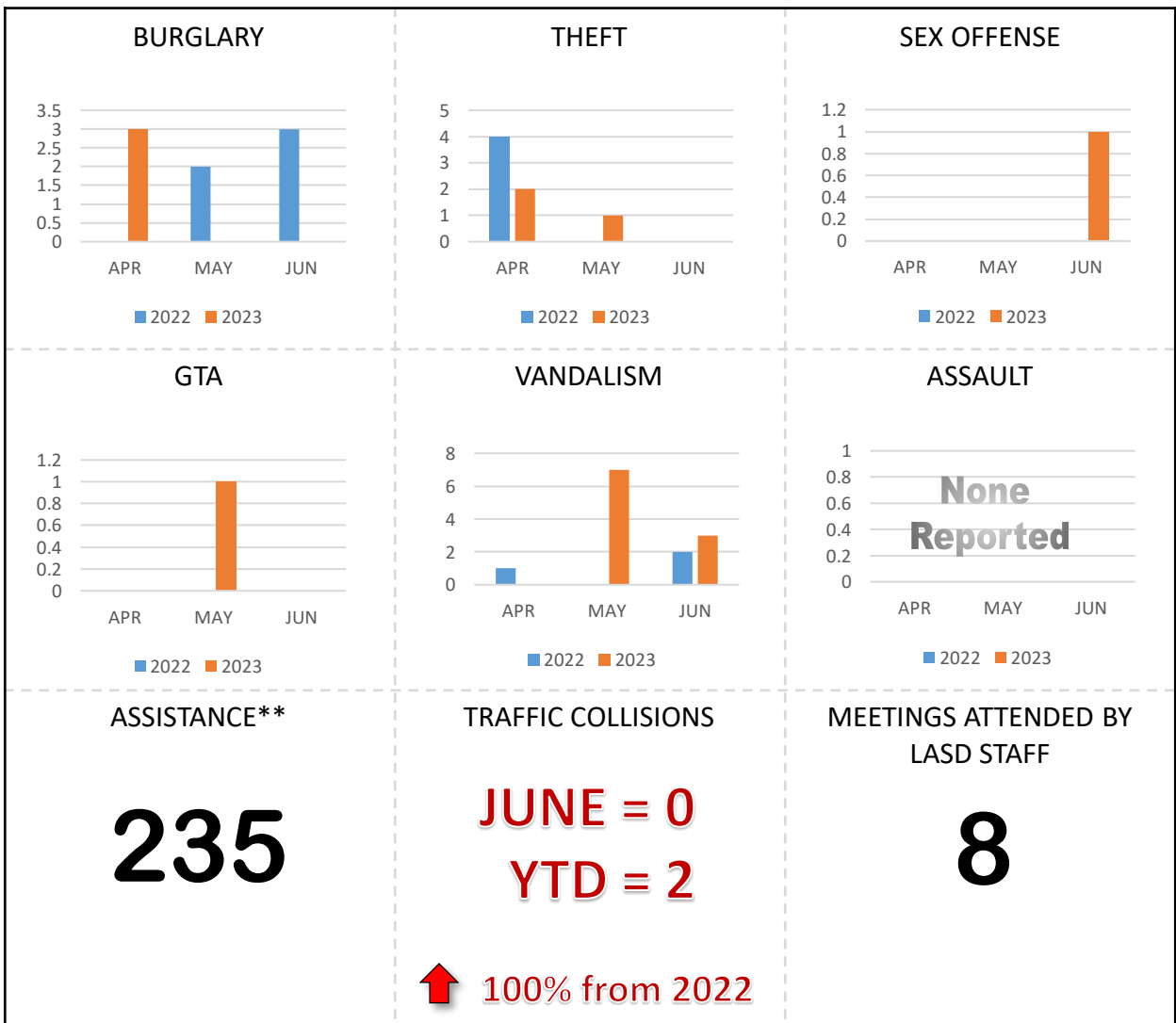
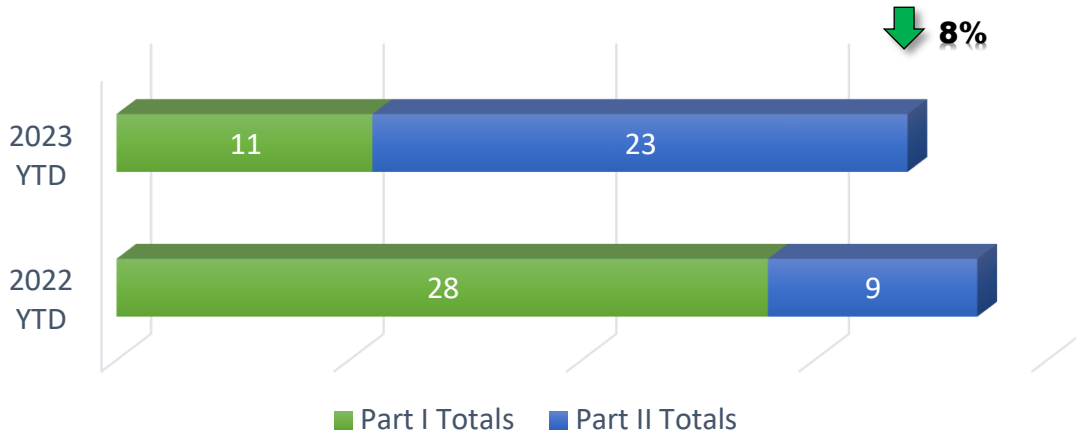

There were four crimes and two arrests for the month of June at WLAC.

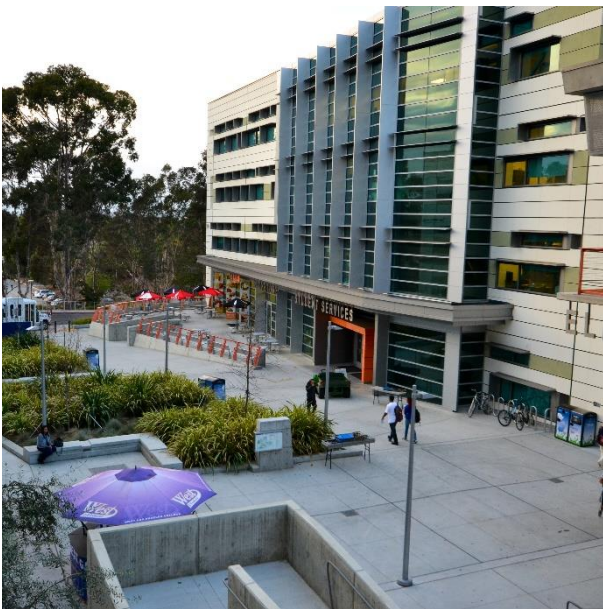
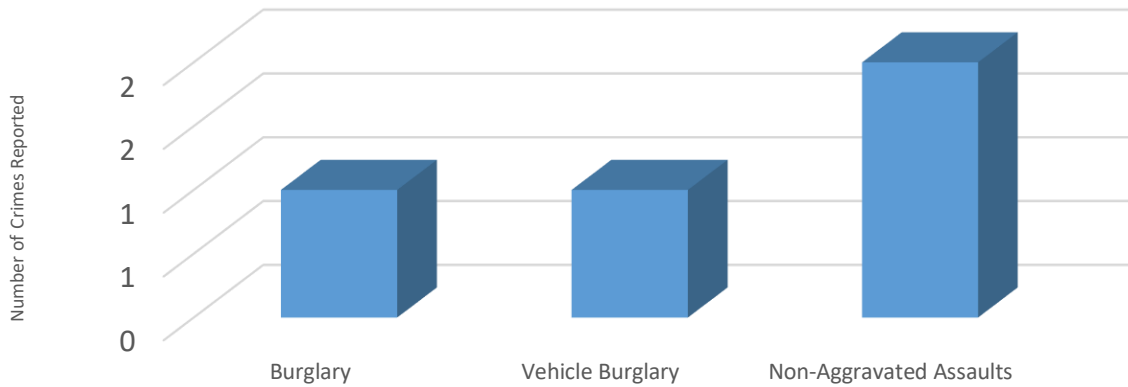
A fight between two sibling students during a disagreement resulted in their arrests. Both siblings were charged with misdemeanor assault.

CCTV camera issues were the top safety and security concerns reported this month, as well as year-to-date.

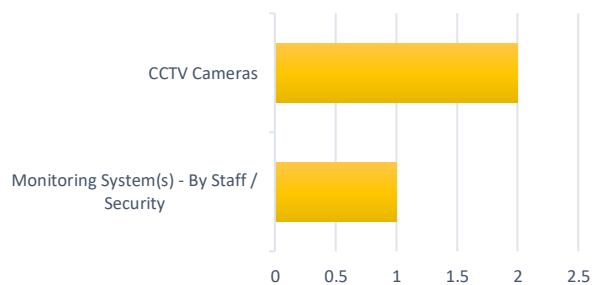
Overall, there was a small increase in part 1 crimes from last year. Additional patrol checks have been conducted throughout the campus to help address the rise in crime.

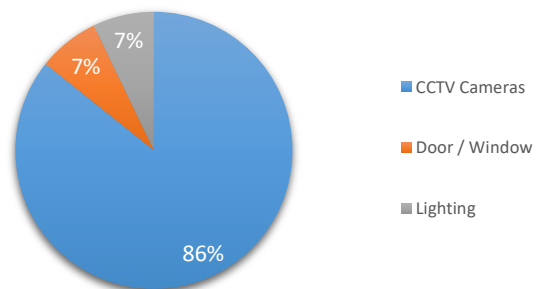

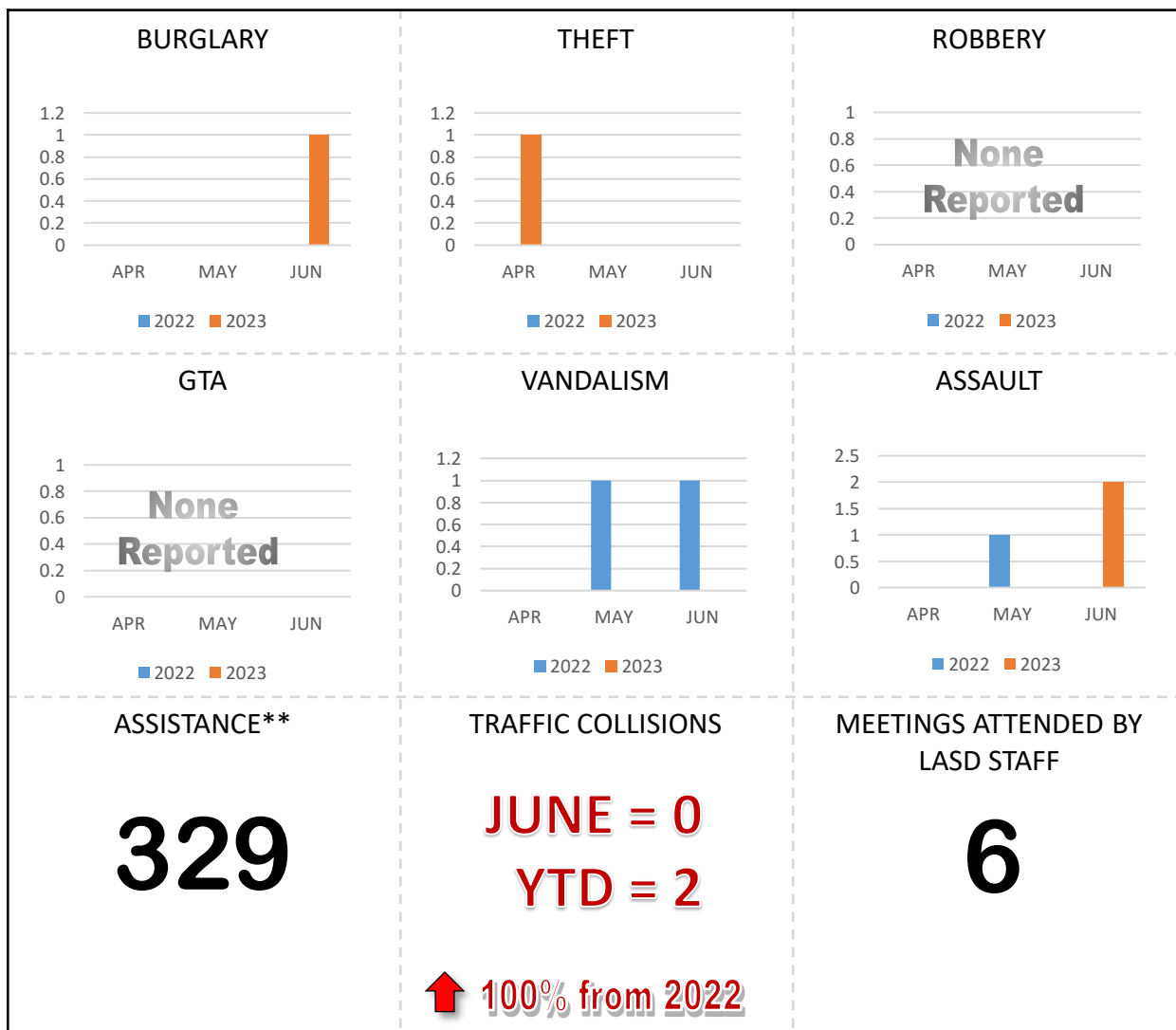
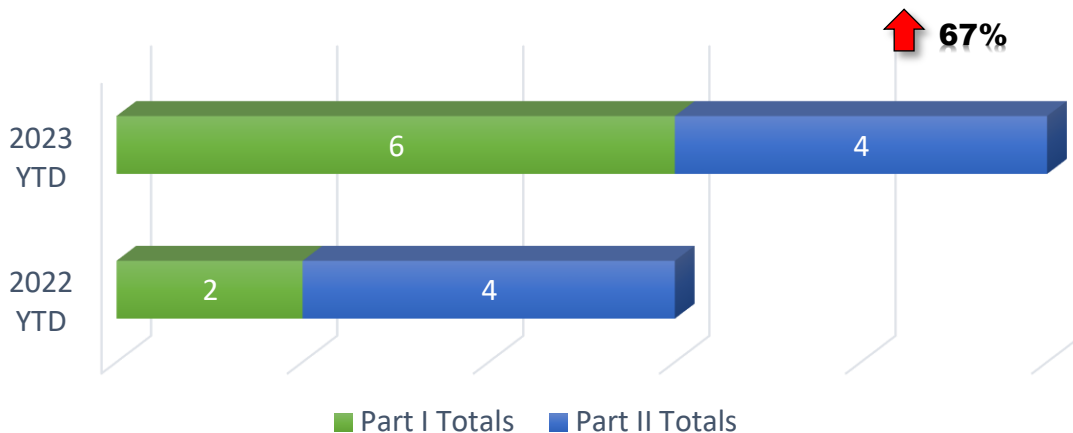


Top Safety & Security Concerns Reported YTD
