November is the month to be thankful for many things. The average person spends Thanksgiving with their families in which they show how thankful they are for what the year has brought them, as well as what is in store for the future.

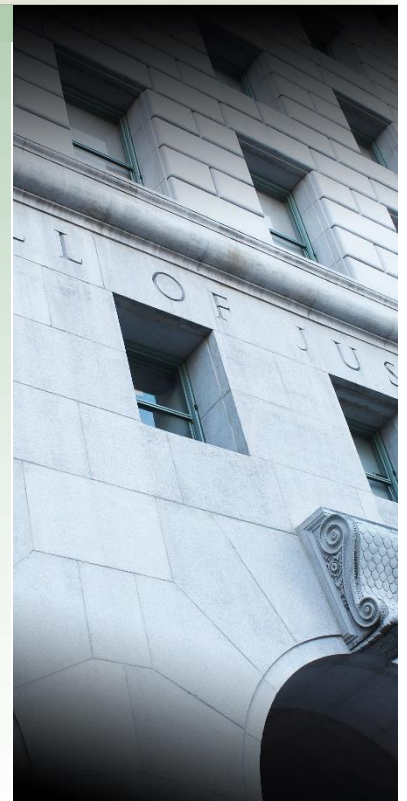
Los Angeles Southwest Community College (LASC) showed their appreciation to Dolores Sheen, commonly known to many as "Auntie Dolores."

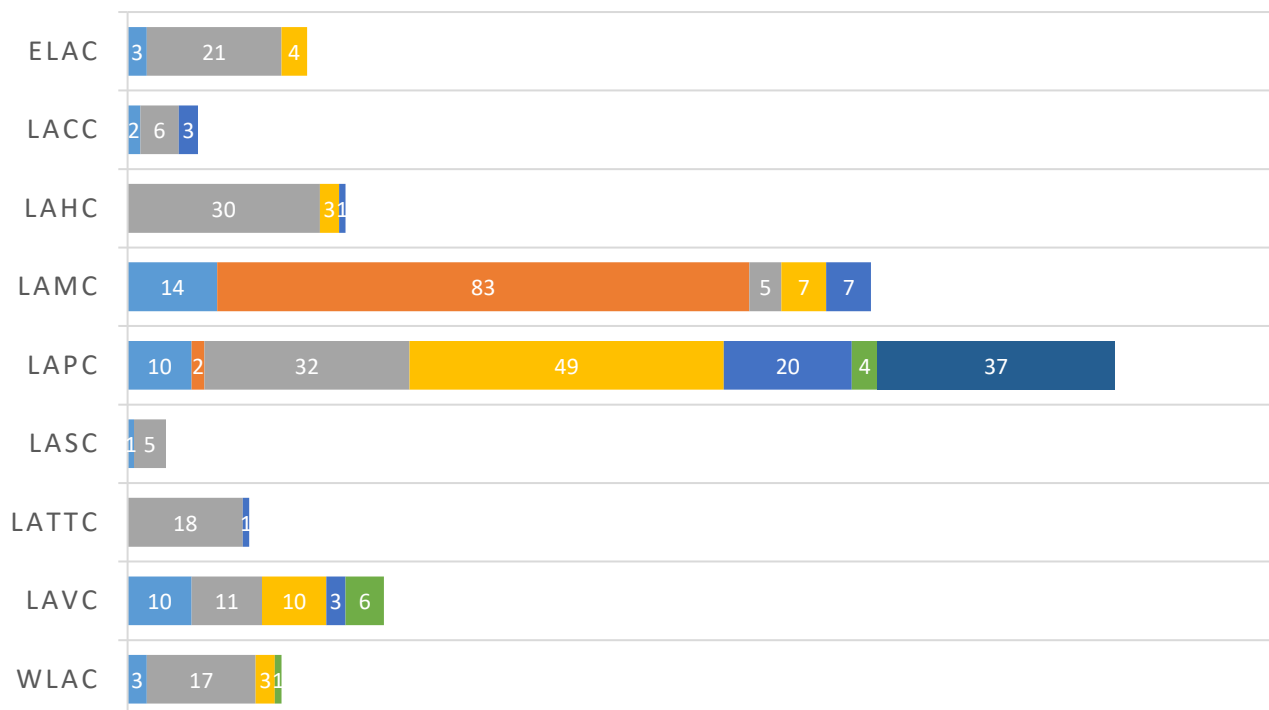

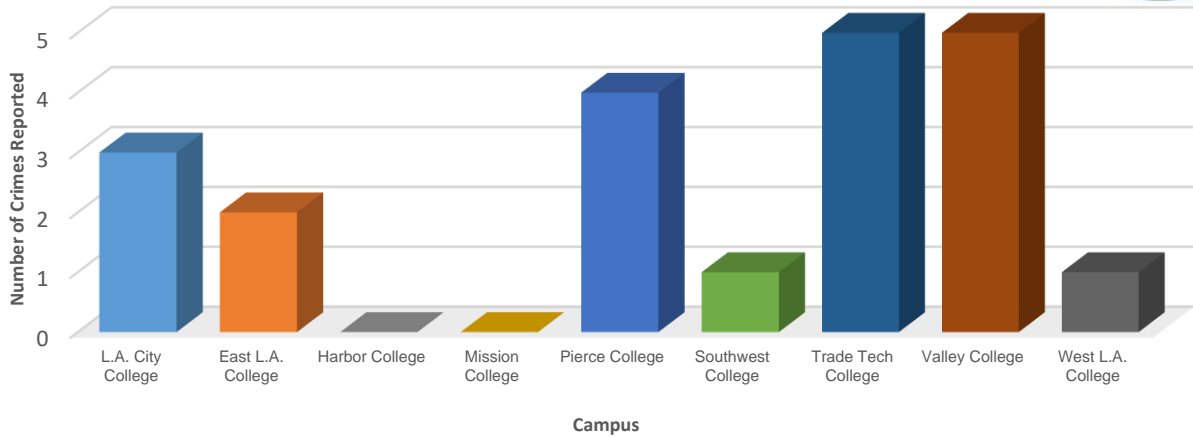

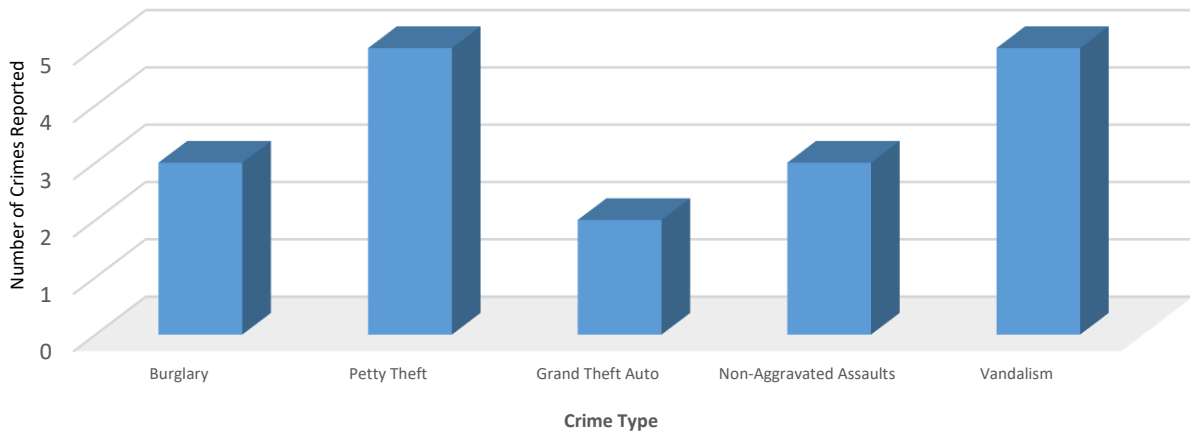

Total Part I & II By Campus

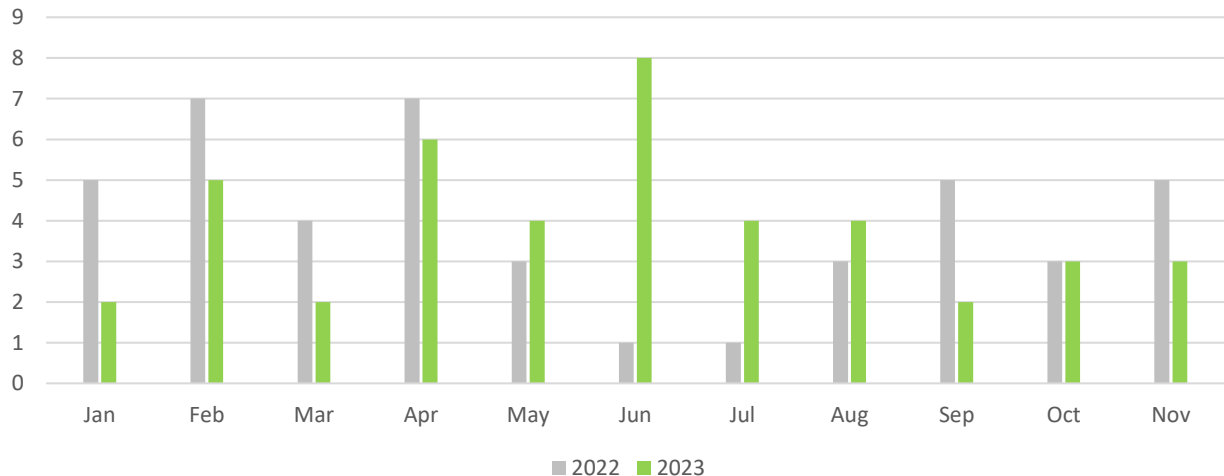

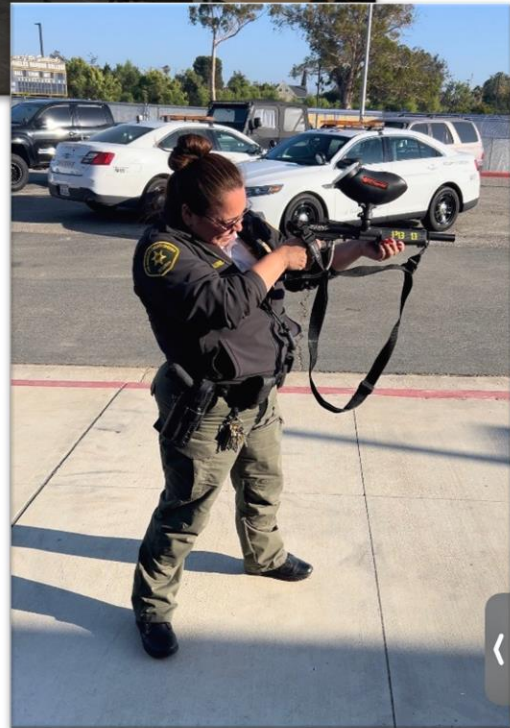

- Conducted a workplace violence prevention training for LAPC Financial Aid Office.





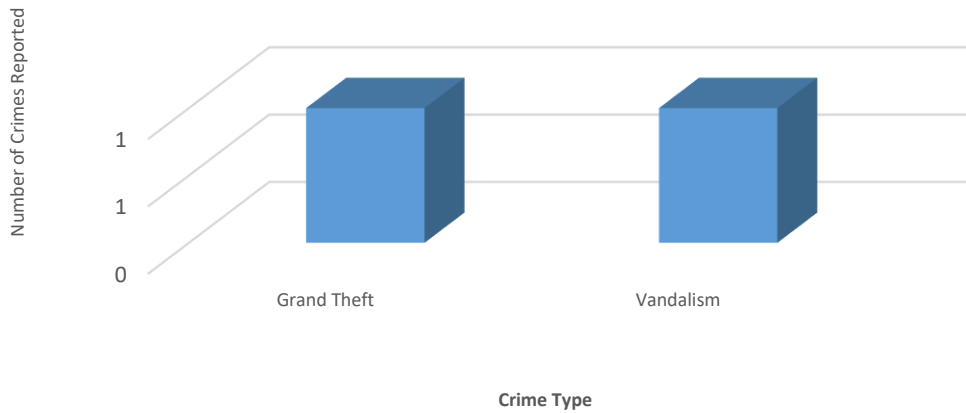

# Los Angeles Mission College



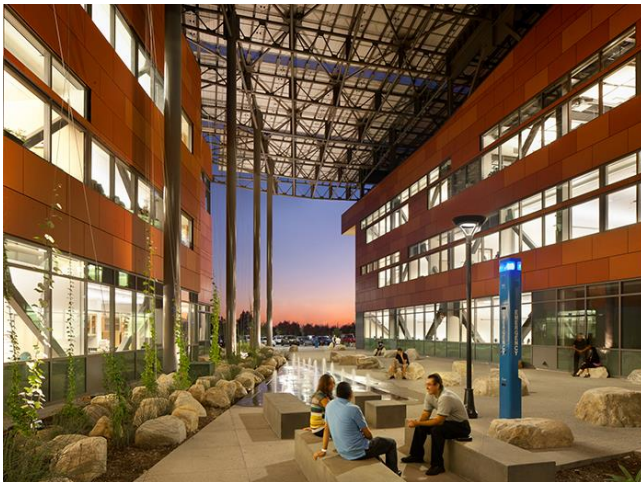
There were no crimes or arrests reported for the month of November at Los Angeles Mission College (LAMC).

Los Angeles Trade-Tech (LATTTC) had five crimes reported in the month of November and two arrests.

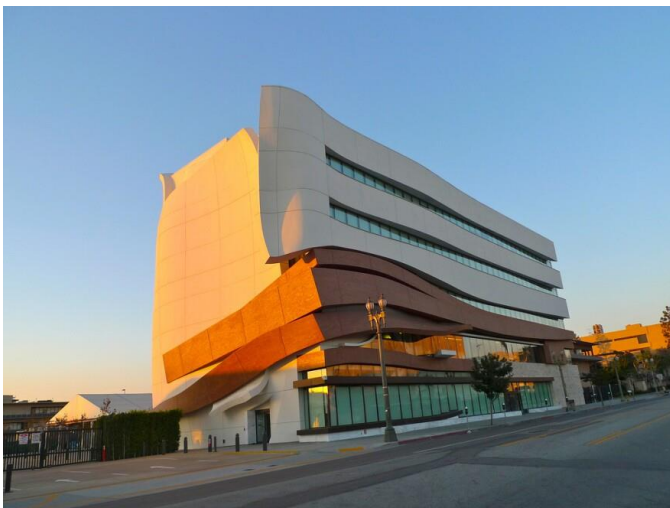
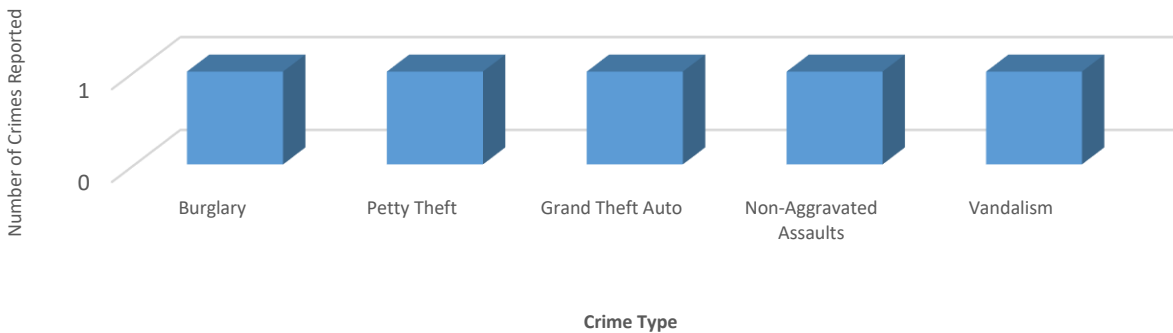
An irate, male student was arrested for resisting/fighting deputies as they attempted to escort him off campus. Another male (non-student) was arrested for an outstanding felony warrant.

# Los Angeles Valley College

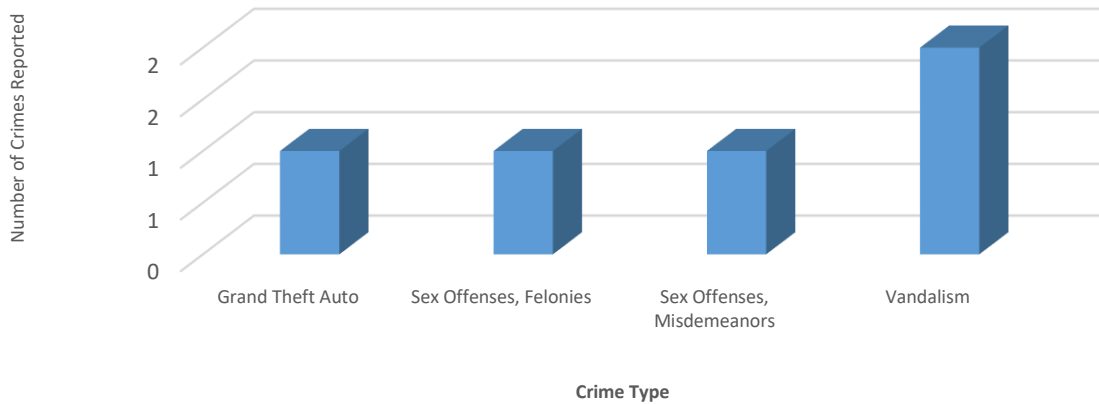

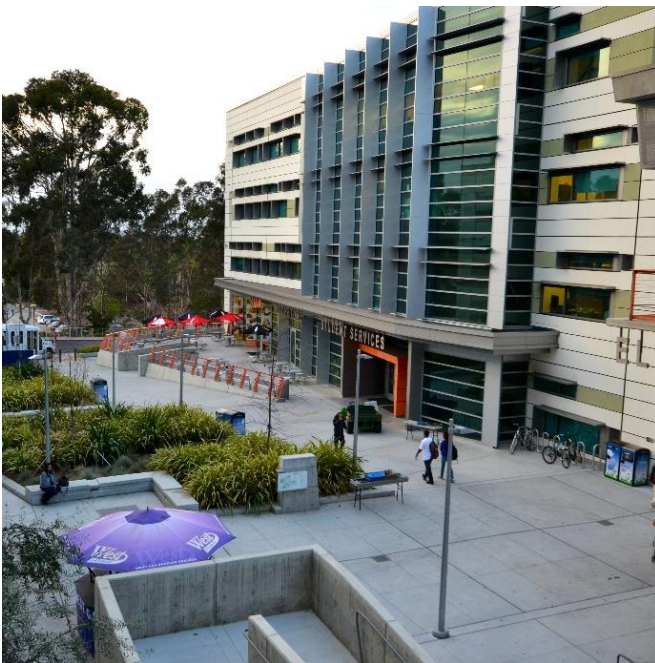
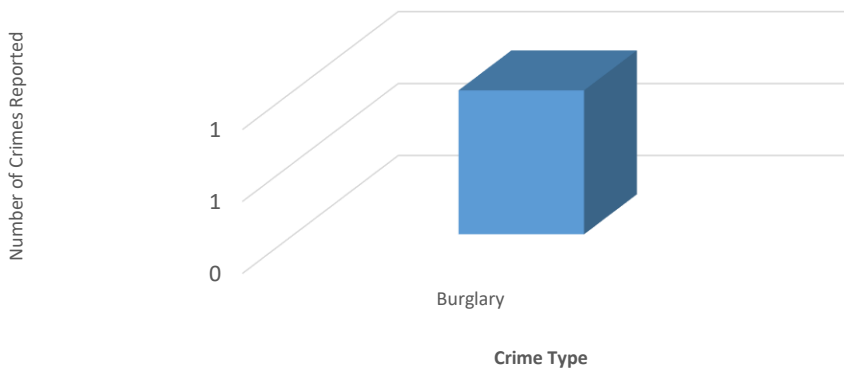
There was one crime reported in the month of November and no arrests at West Los Angeles College (WLAC).
