

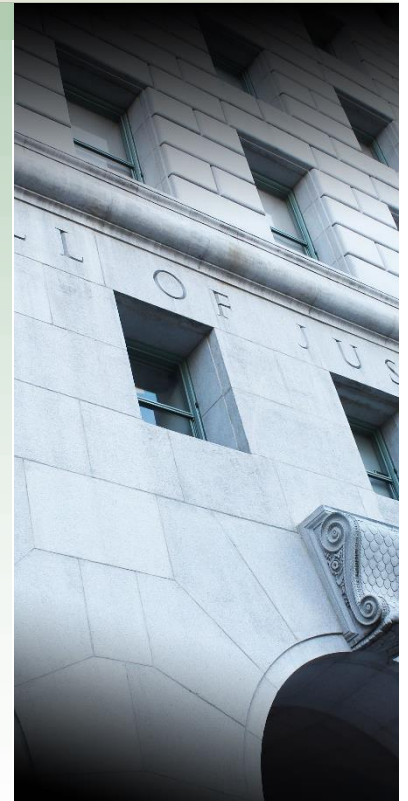

Wow... December already. 2023 has been such a blur. Likely, the reason this year has zoomed by is the Training and Support Unit (TSU) has been busy meeting and working alongside LACCD students, staff, and faculty. We haven't only been working with you; we've had the amazing opportunity to provide training for you in multiple areas!

The TSU coordinated and conducted over 300 trainings in 2023! With the majority of the trainings for security officers and deputies assigned to all nine of the LACCD campuses. Some of your staff might not know our personnel by their title of Security Officer or Deputy because they know them as: Rubi, who always opens their classroom in the morning with a smile; Rosales, who is posted at the parking structure protecting vehicles and providing escorts; or Roxanna (affectionately as "Rox"), driving the campus and is never too busy to stop and answer a question.

In 2023, TSU conducted real-world practical training to give your security officers and deputies the latest tools in community oriented policing to serve their campuses. Your feedback identified some of the favorite trainings from this year: mental health, de-escalation tactics, and tactical movement training. These trainings and more were designed to foster and promote a safe learning and working environment for students, staff, and faculty.

While training the LASD personnel is a major part of what TSU does, it isn't the ONLY thing we do. At the direction of Captain Renteria and with the support of the LACCD administration, TSU has worked to strengthen the bond between LACCD and LASD by providing training to LACCD students staff and faculty. The most popular course TSU conducted in 2023 was Active Shooter Training in collaboration with LACCD's Safety and Emergency Manager Adam Saurin. This training was conducted multiple times at nearly every campus and had over 575 participants! The Active Shooter Training focused on real-world applicable tools and best practices in the event of an active shooter. During this training, participants learned what to do in the rare case of an active shooter, practiced barricading classrooms (often with hilarious results), and were exposed to the duties of their LASD response team. Additionally, TSU coordinated a full-scale active shooter event at Harbor College with multiple agencies participating and working together.

TSU also conducted Workplace Violence Training with small workgroups at multiple campuses. The goal of this training was to take a more personalized approach to personal safety. During this course, the TSU team walked through specific workplace environments and gave participants the tools needed to take ownership of their own personal safety during any workplace violence encounter.

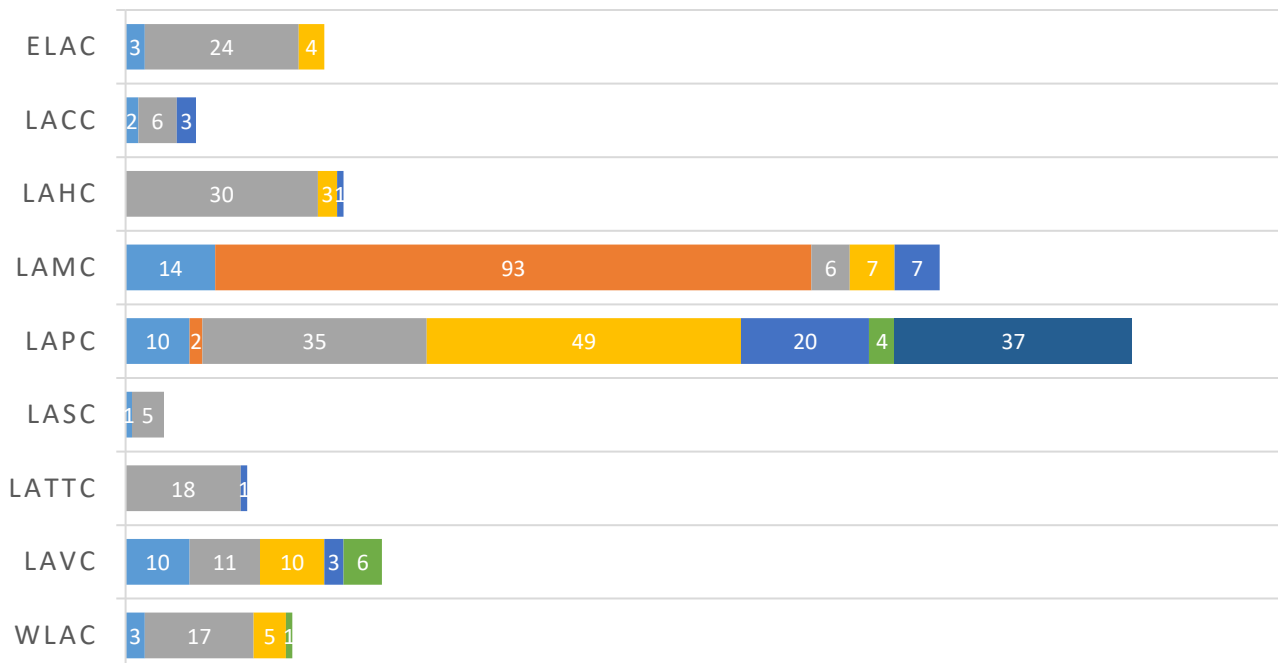
Finally, the TSU team partnered with most of the campuses Behavioral Intervention Team's (BIT) to give specific training on how to de-escalate tense situations and tactics on how to help individuals experiencing panic attacks. These trainings focused on ACTIVE listening skills and grounding techniques that BIT Teams can utilize to assist students in crisis.

While we are proud of these accomplishments, we are even more excited for 2024! Coming to a campus near you will be trainings that your students, faculty, and staff have asked for! We are dedicated to giving LASD and LACCD the tools to foster a safer learning and work environment. See you in 2024!

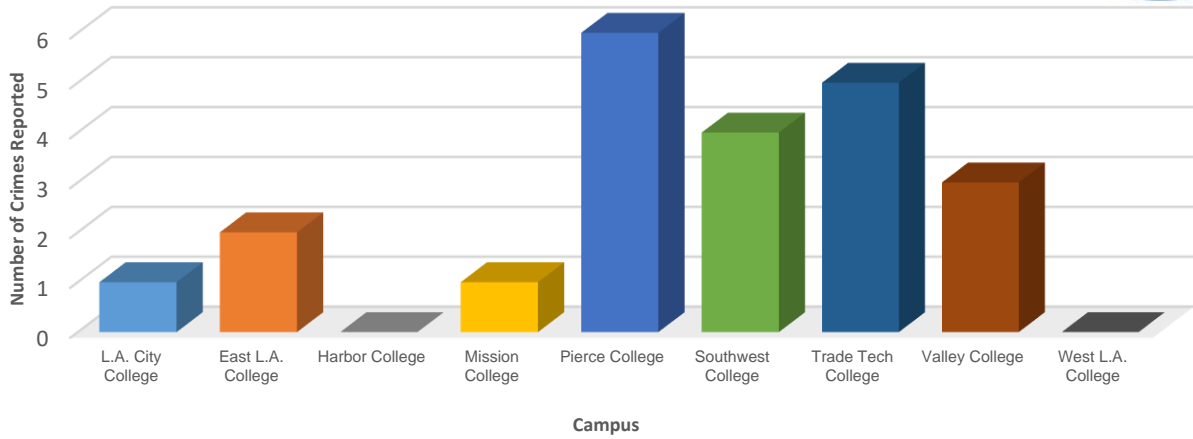

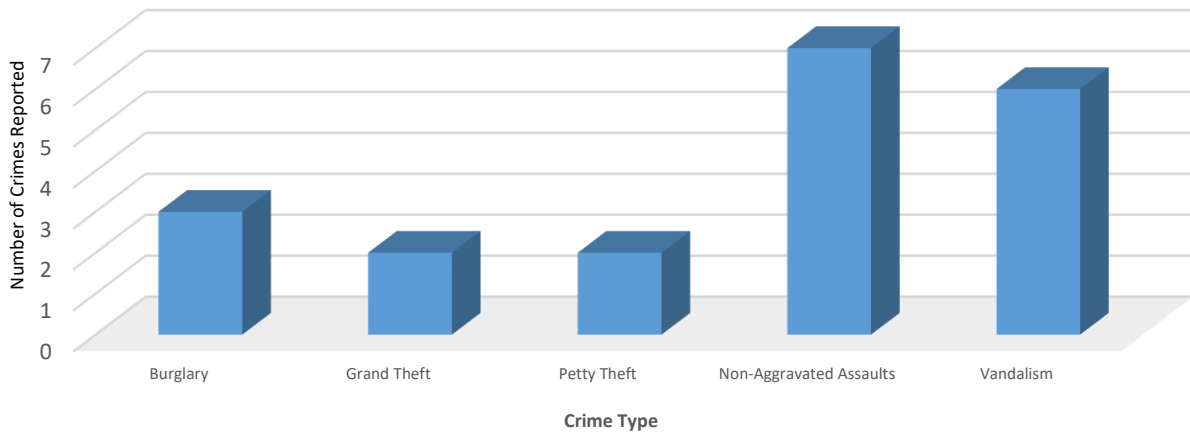

Total Part I & II By Campus

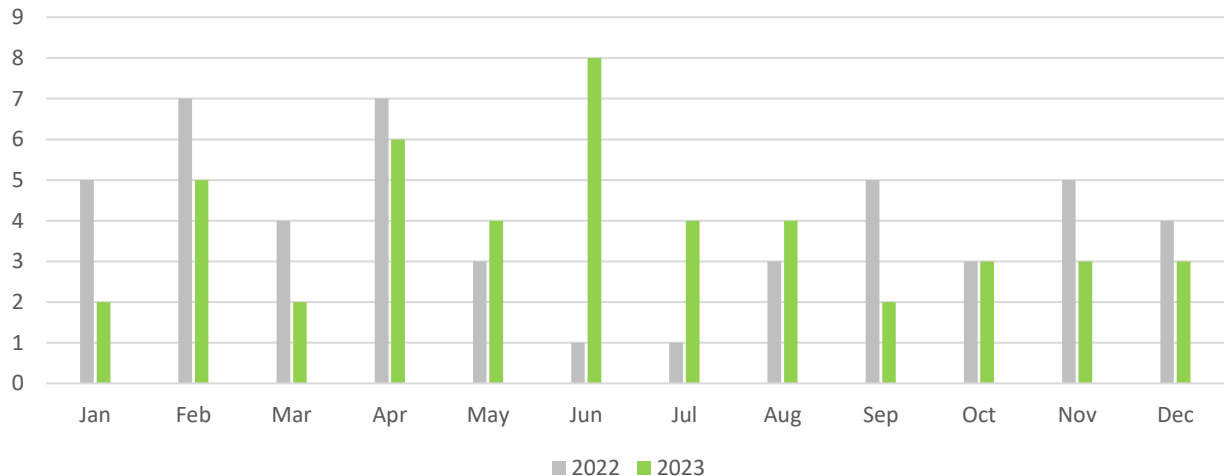

Year-to-Date Arrests by Month

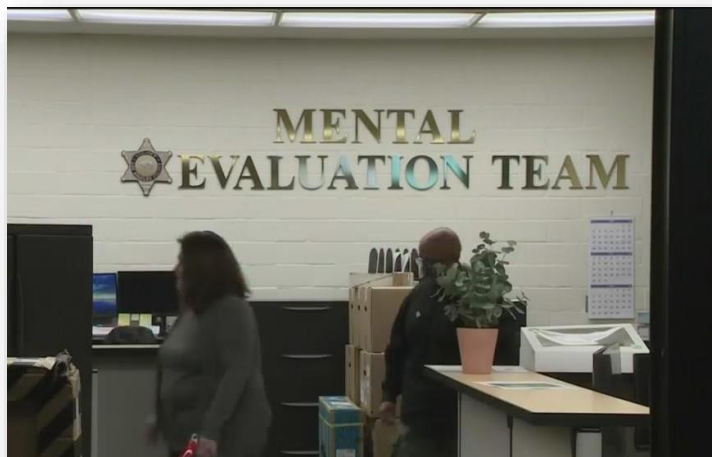


HEAT Program Update

East Los Angeles College

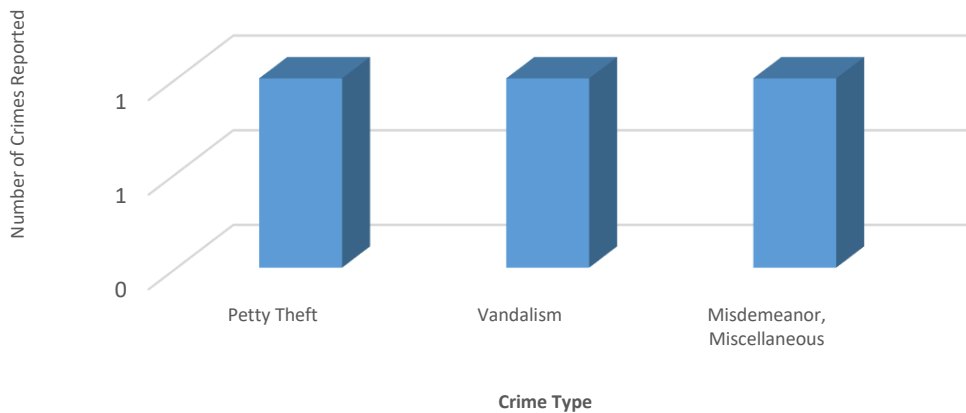

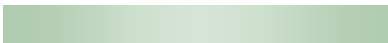


YTD PART I & II CRIME* 2-YR COMPARISON

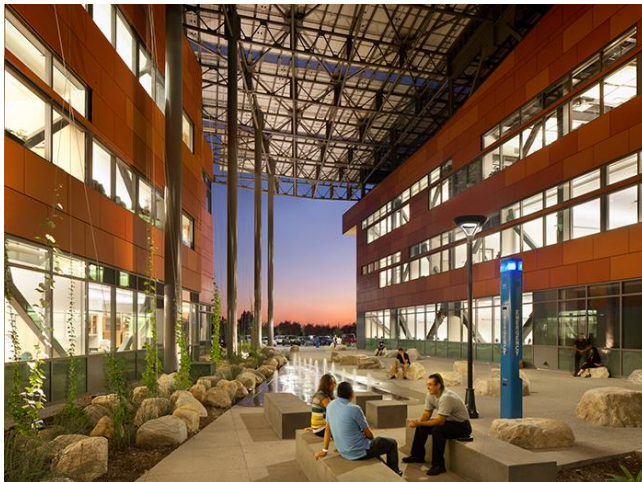
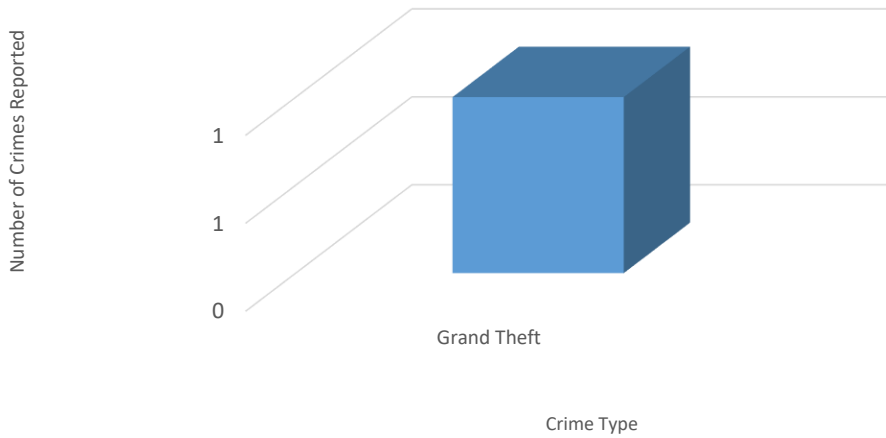
There was one crime and no arrests reported for the month of December at Los Angeles Mission College (LAMC).

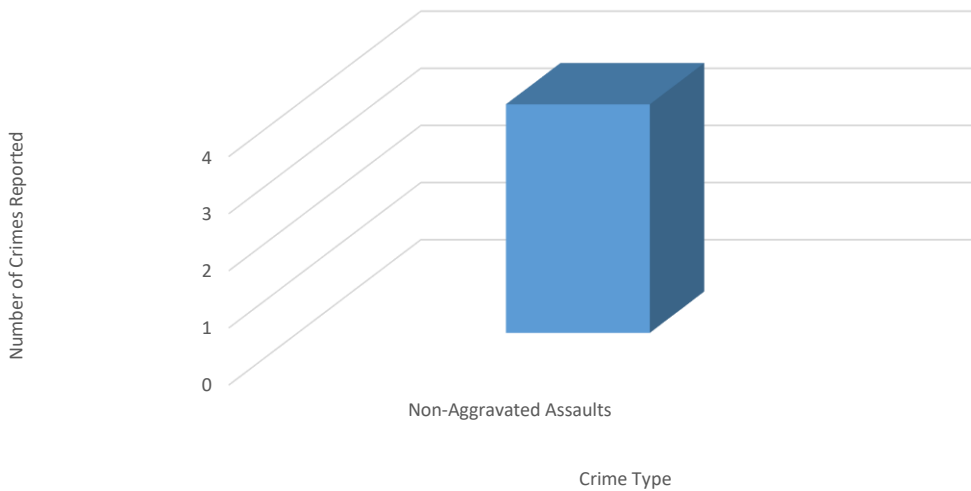
Los Angeles Southwest College (LASC) had four crimes reported in the month of December and no arrests.

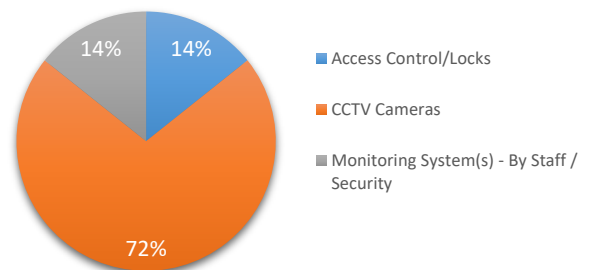

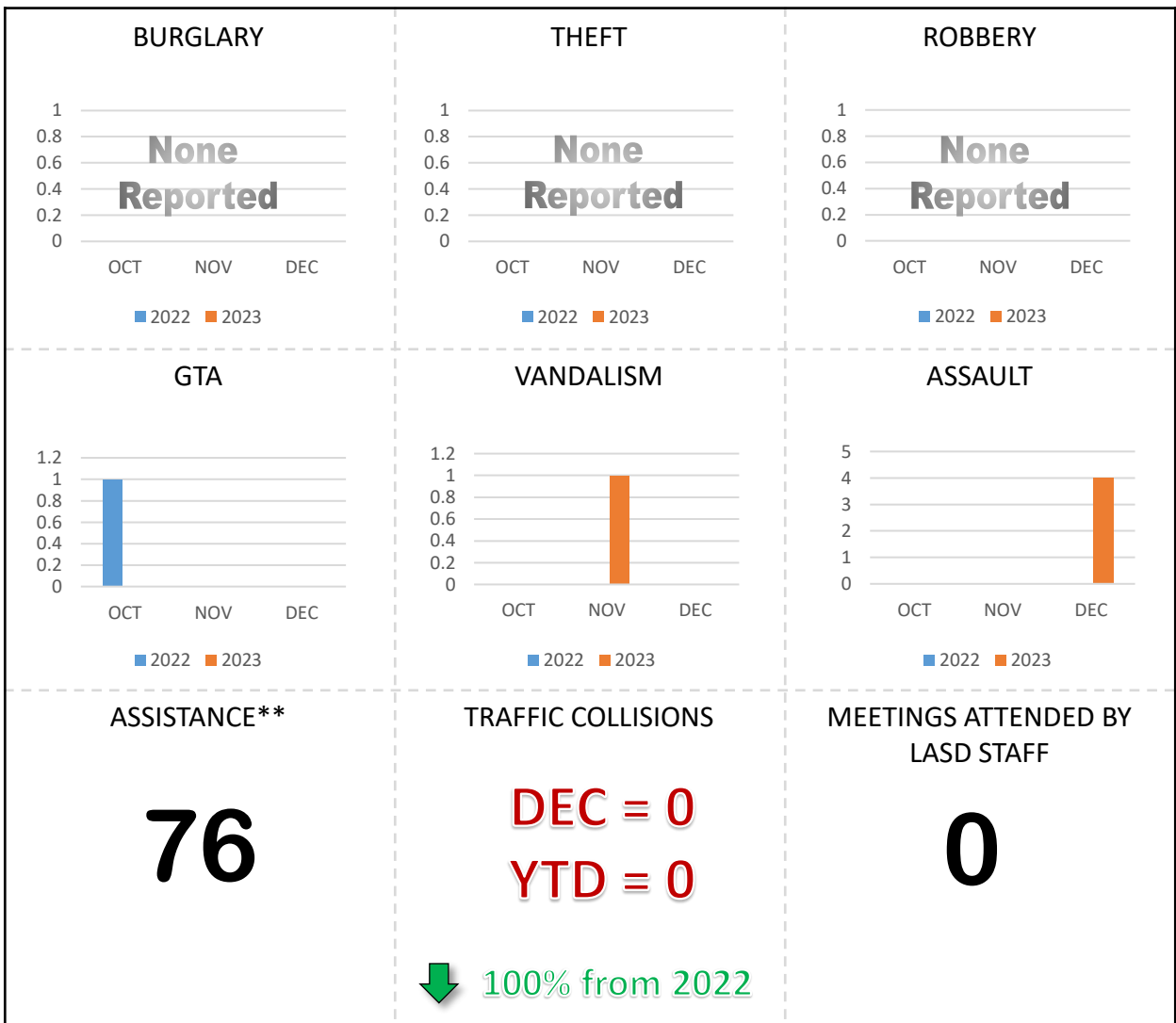
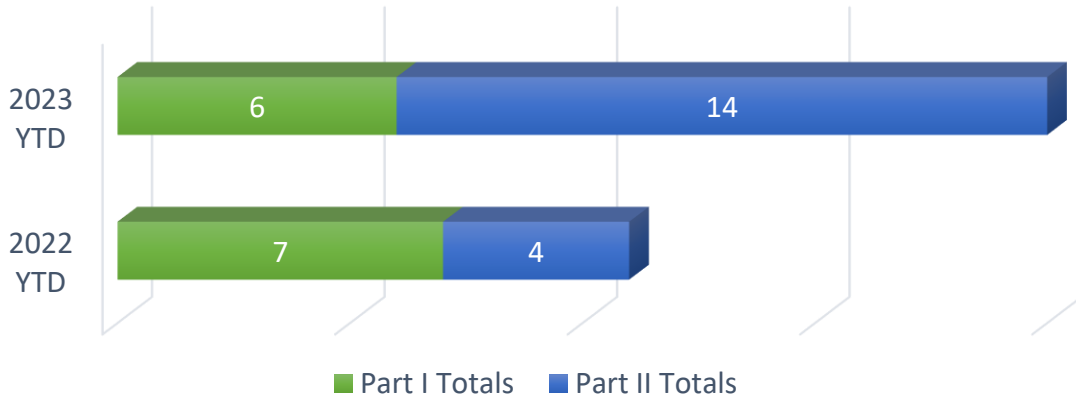

Los Angeles Trade-Tech (LATTC) had four crimes reported in the month of December and two arrests.

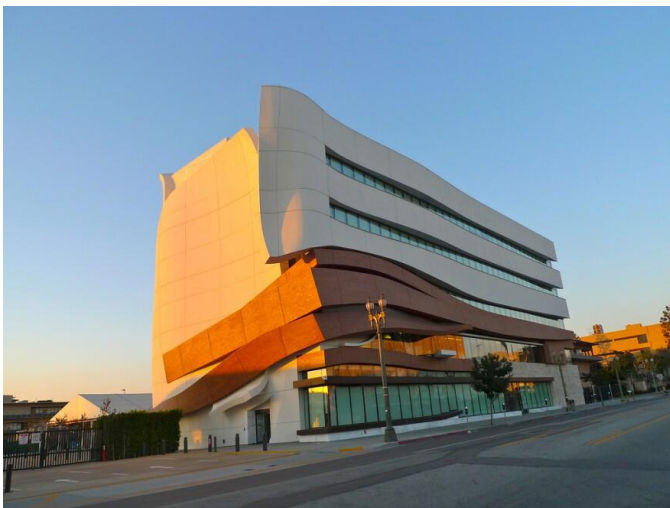
A male (non-student) was arrested for graffiti vandalism. Another male (unknown if student) was arrested for an outstanding felony warrant for parole violation.

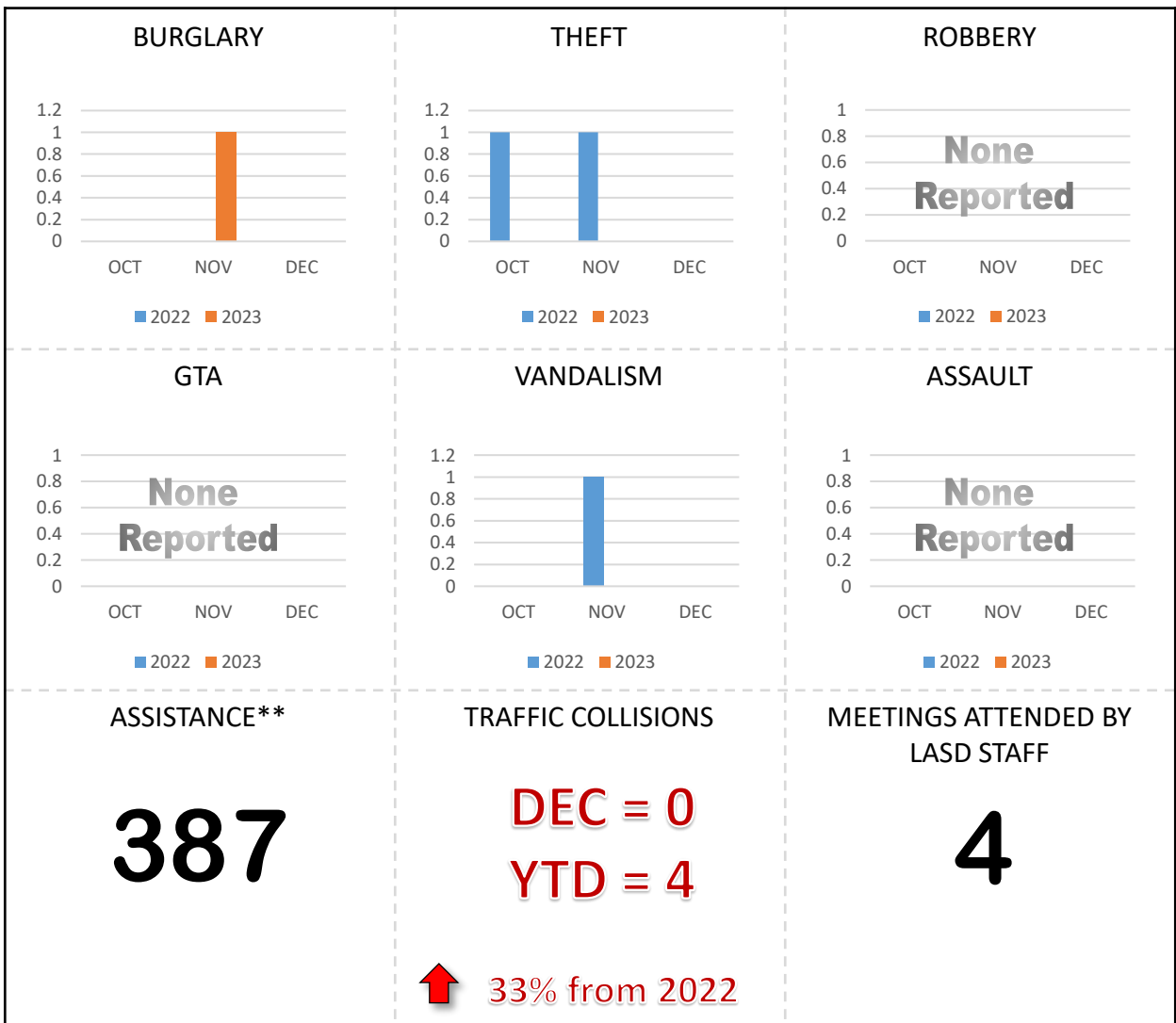
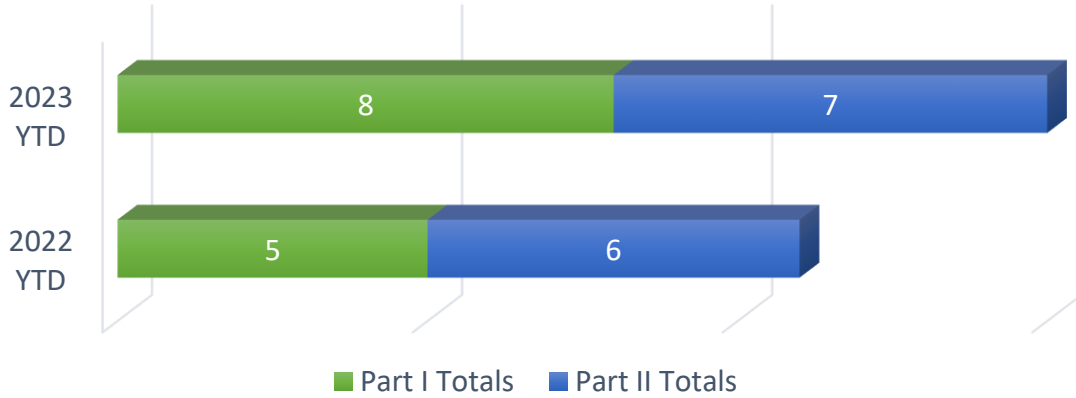


Top Safety & Security Concerns Reported YTD
