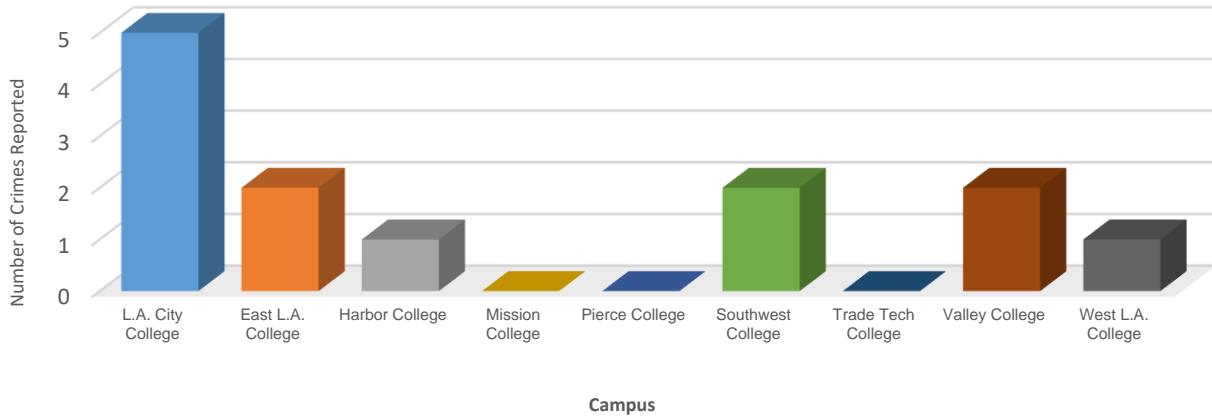

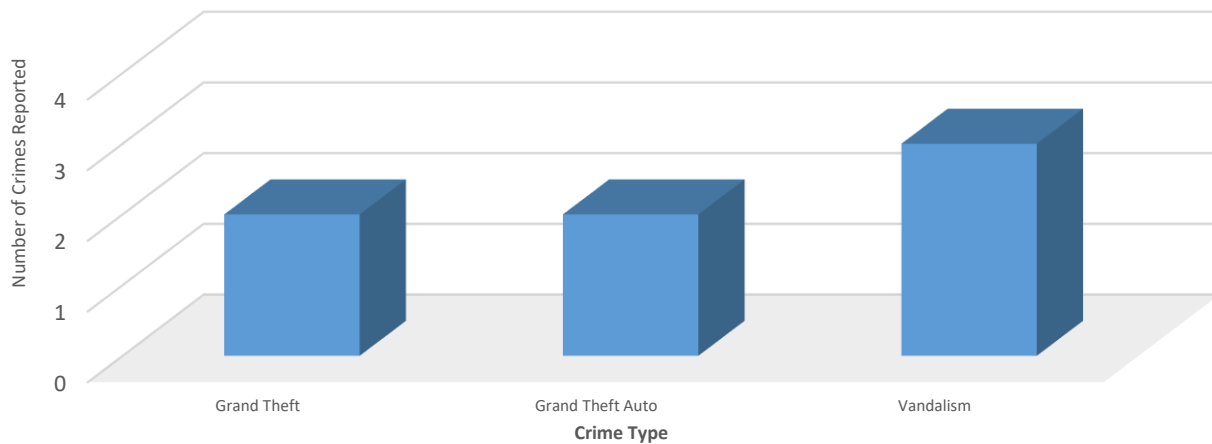

Total Part I & II By Campus

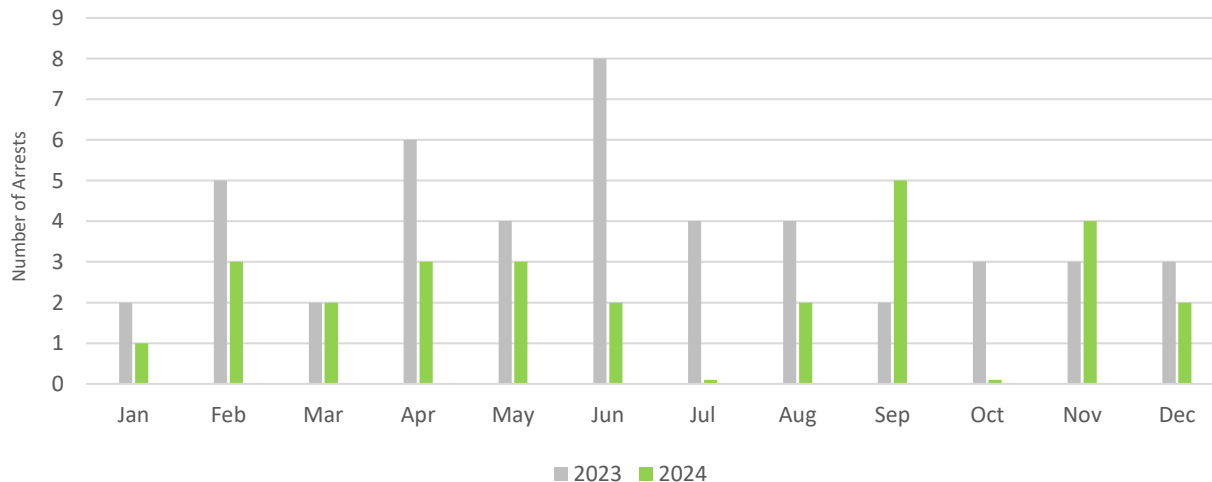

Year-to-Date Arrests by Month

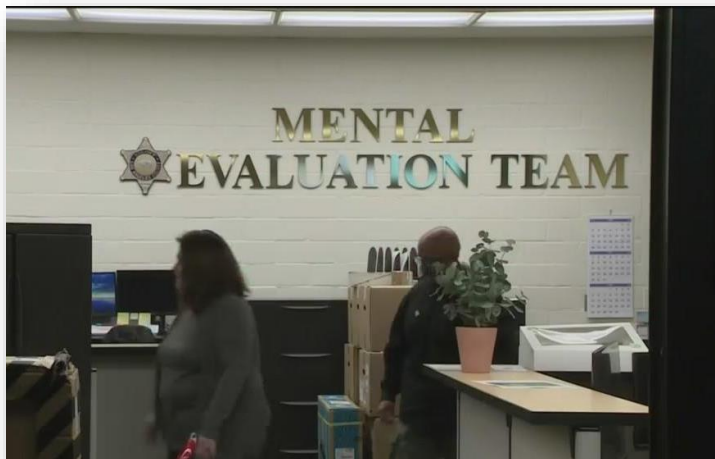


HEAT Program Update

Number of Crimes Reported



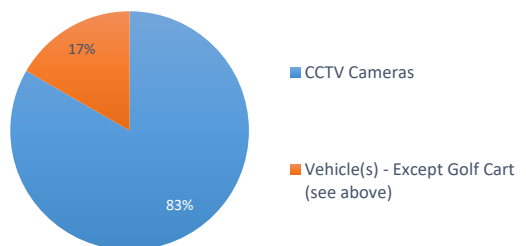

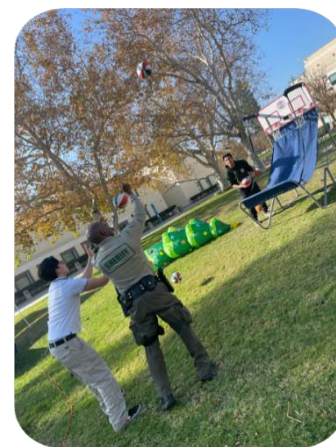
A Tradition of Service

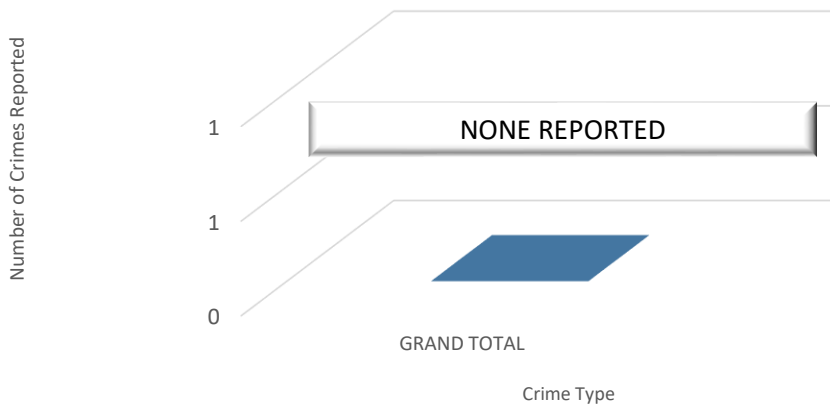

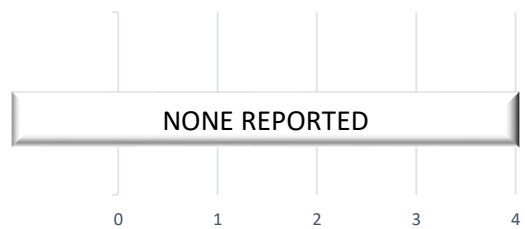

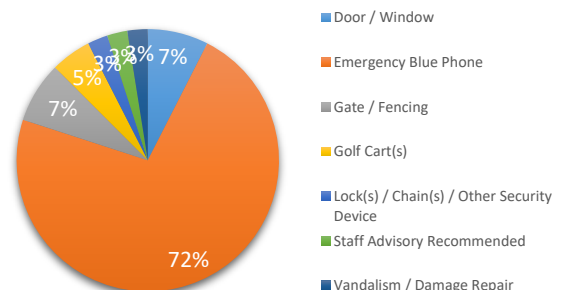

Our very own Security Officer Felipe Anguiano again dressed up as the Grinch and handed out candy to the kids.

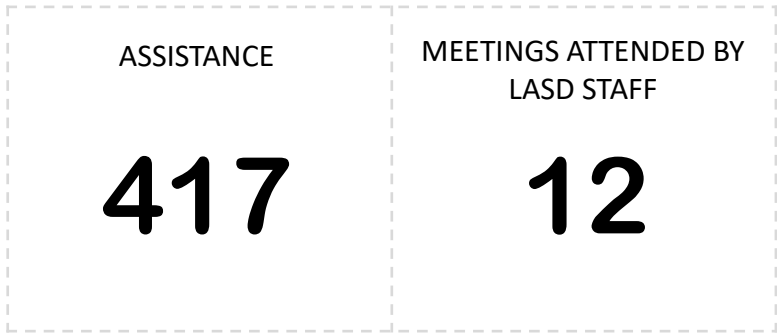
Thanks to everyone's efforts, this year's event was a tremendous success. With the bar set high, plans are already underway to make next year's toy drive even bigger and better!

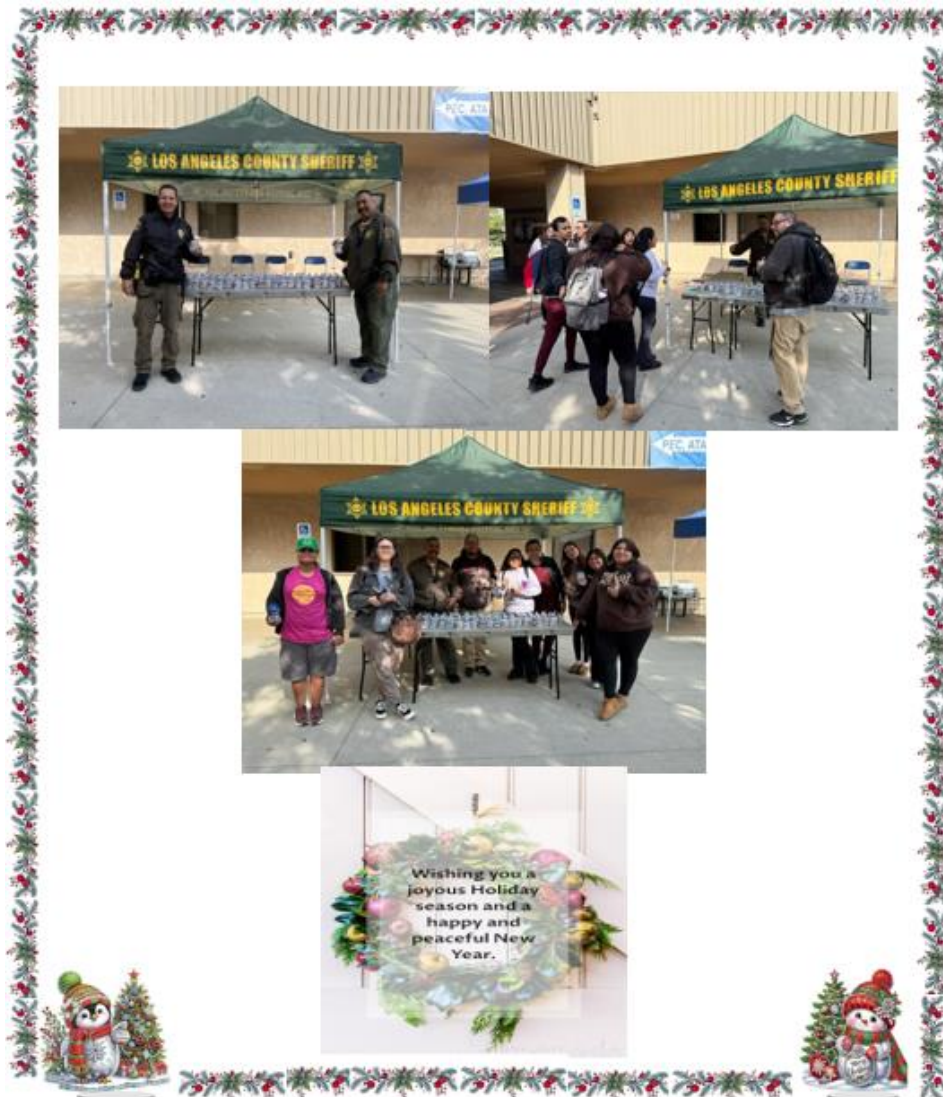


West Los Angeles College

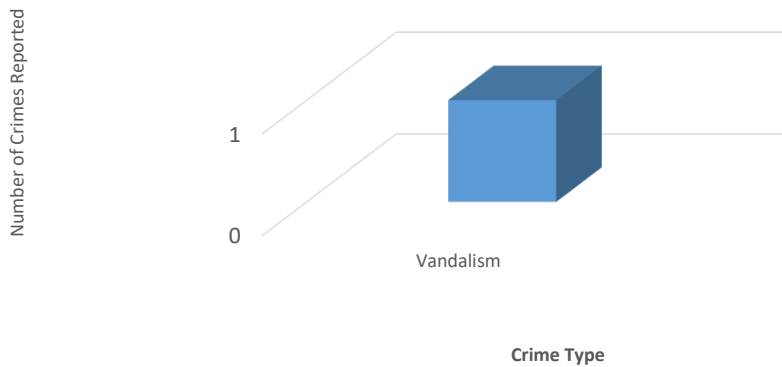
