

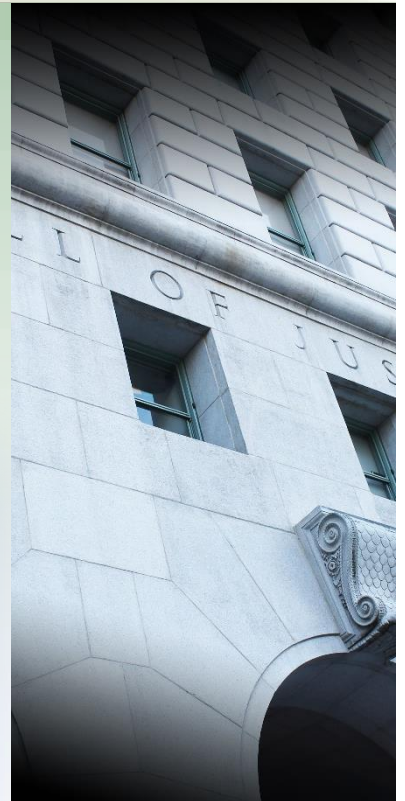

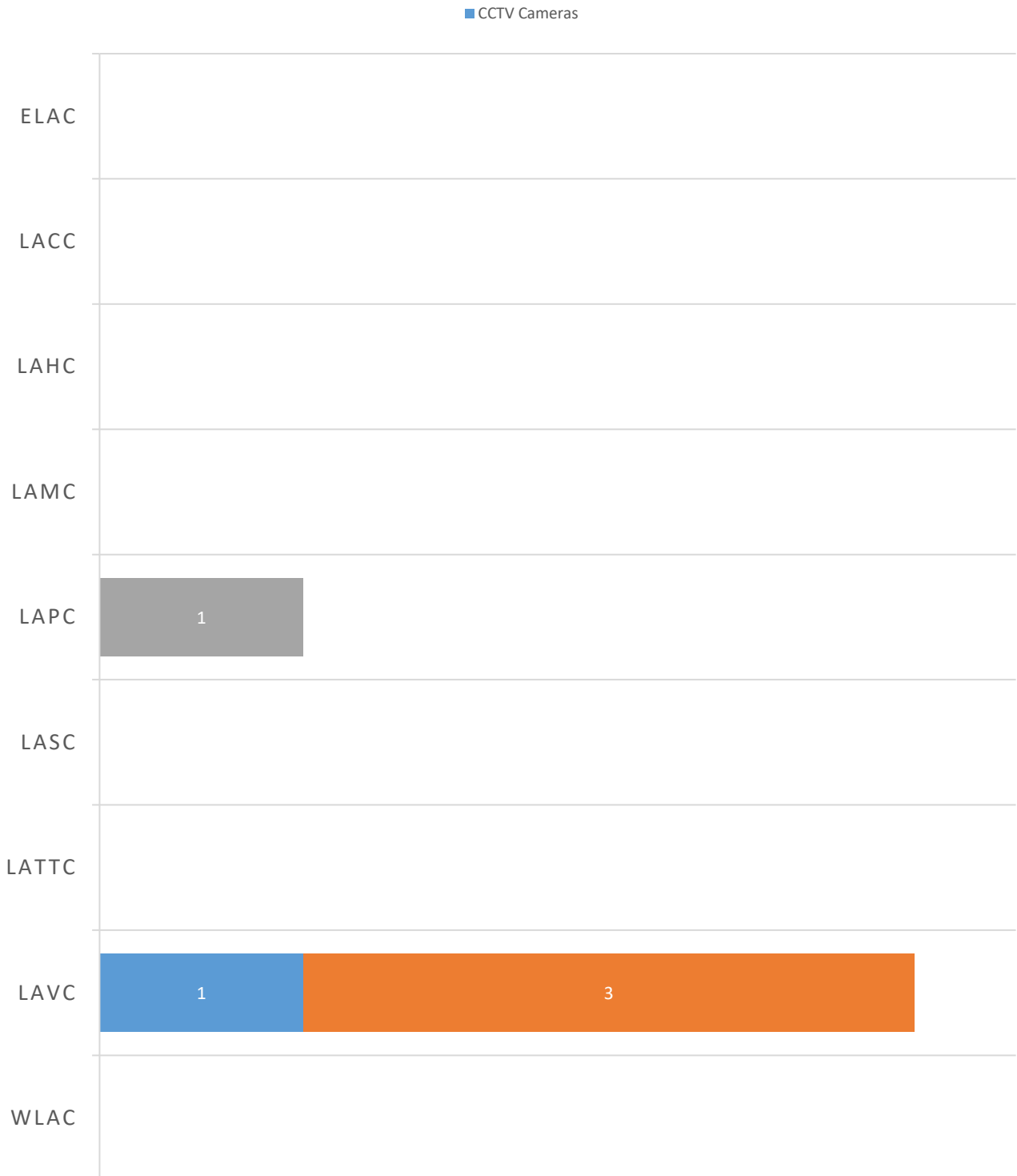

Year-to-Date by Campus

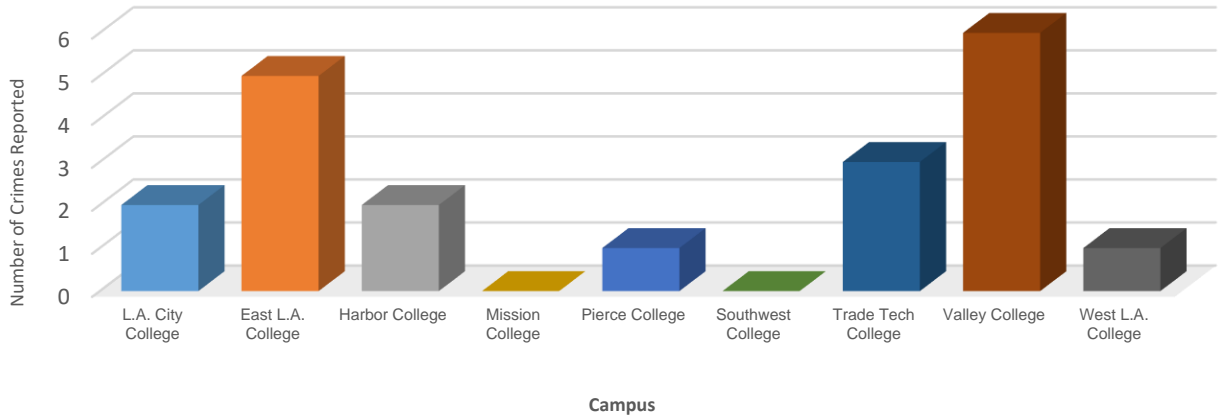

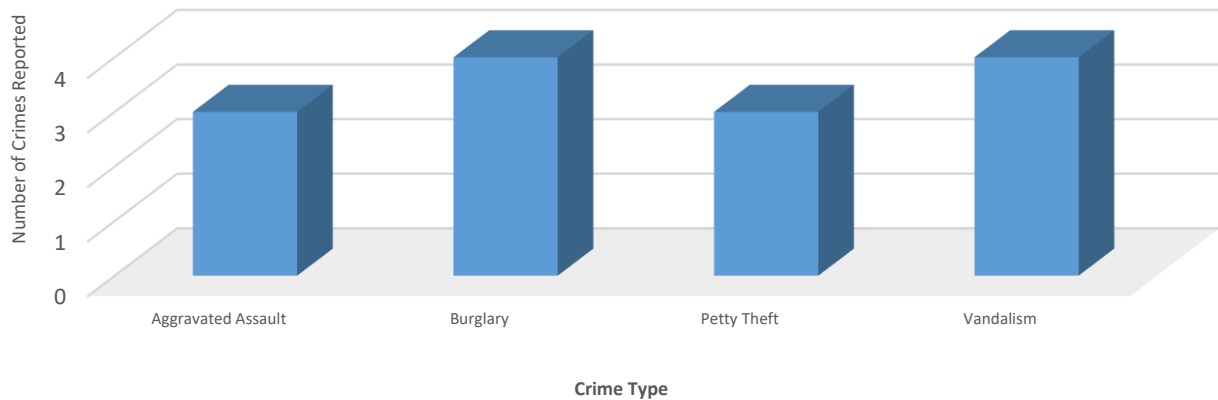

Total Part I & II By Campus

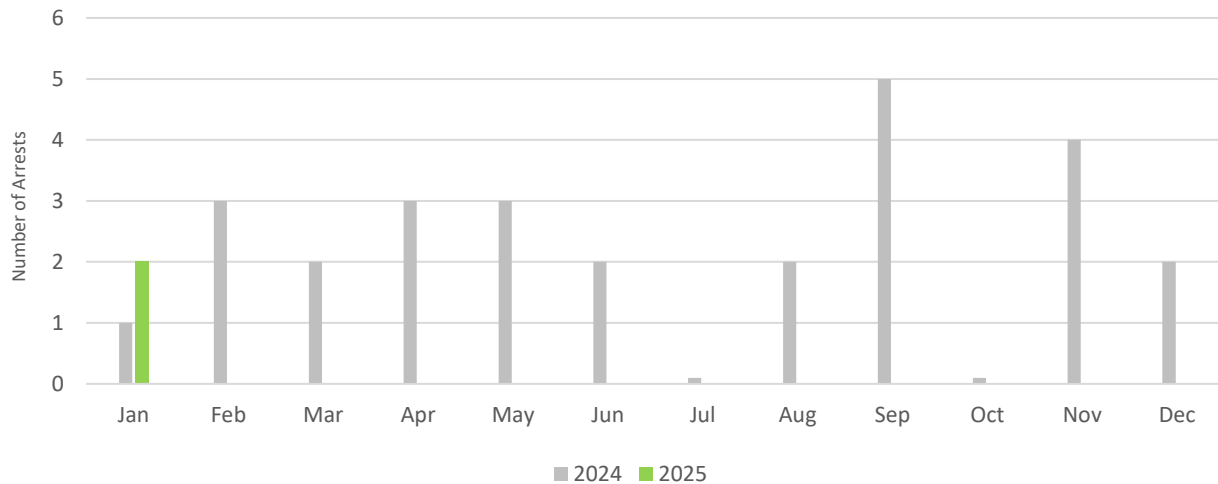

Year-to-Date Arrests by Month

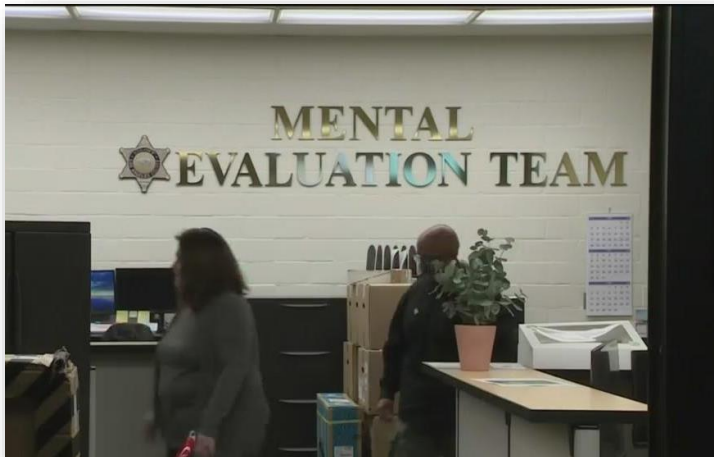


HEAT Program Update

The Los Angeles Mission College and other LACCD campuses were closed due to the devastating wildfires early January.

Fueled by the dry vegetation and fanned by historic Santa Ana winds, Los Angeles experienced one of the worst wildfire seasons in history. The Palisades fire, could be

seen from the LAMC's Math and Science Building. On January 7, 2025, Community College Bureau personnel assigned were on high alert when the Hurst Fire sparked in Sylmar, less than five miles from the campus. LASD personnel throughout the county, including those assigned to LAMC prepared to respond to the fire by working 12-hour days, for several days straight. Fortunately, the Hurst Fire was quickly contained and did not damage any LAMC property.

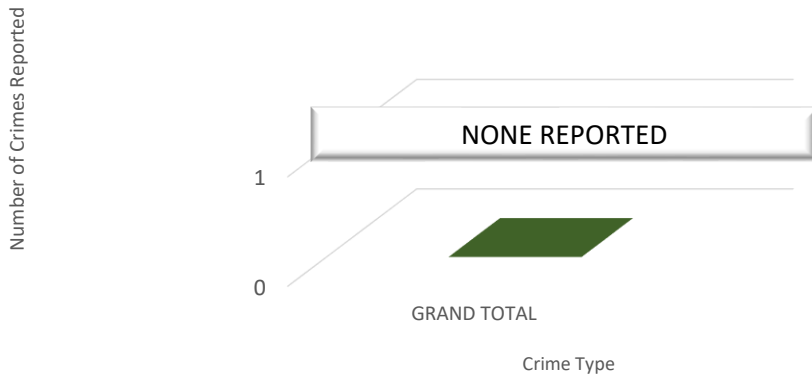

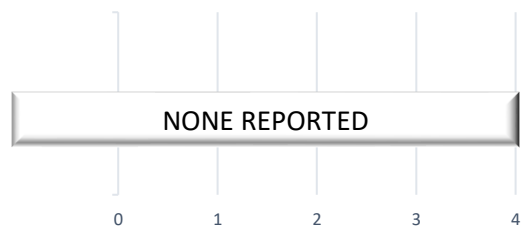

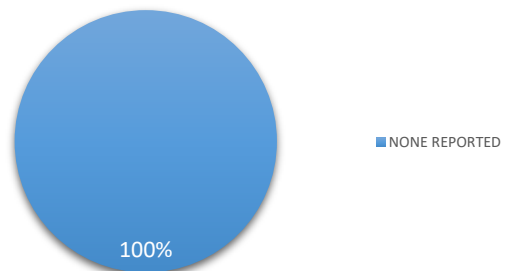

LAPC Opens Equine Area to Shelter Animals Displaced by Fires

The start of 2025 brought a flurry of activity to LAPC as its equine area officially opened on January 8, 2025, to provide shelter for large animals affected by the recent wildfires.

The LAPC farm housed over 225 animals, including horses, pigs, goats, llamas, chickens, and other animals. LAPC became a vital refuge for displaced animals.

A special shout-out goes to the Los Angeles County Animal Control, whose dedicated teams worked tirelessly not only to house the animals but also to rescue them from dangerous conditions. Volunteers played a crucial role in maintaining LAPC's strong bond with the community. Their efforts in cleaning, feeding, transporting, and even assisting with medical care were instrumental in keeping operations running smoothly.

Additionally, the Community College Bureau personnel stepped up by providing security, managing traffic, and offering resources to families impacted by the fires. As of January 29, 2025, 35 animals remain at LAPC, with one particular resident stealing everyone's hearts, a brown alpaca named Bolt. While the community has embraced him as Bolt, those at the LAPC Sheriff's Station have given him a new name: Diego.

With the continued support from volunteers and local agencies, LAPC remains a safe haven for these animals, demonstrating the power of community in times of crisis.
