

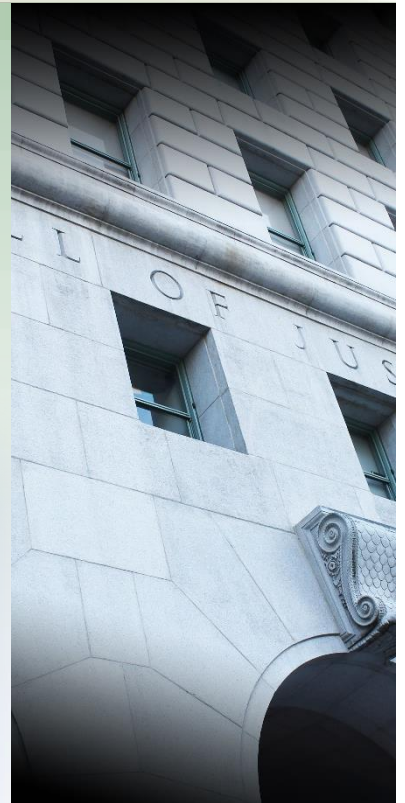

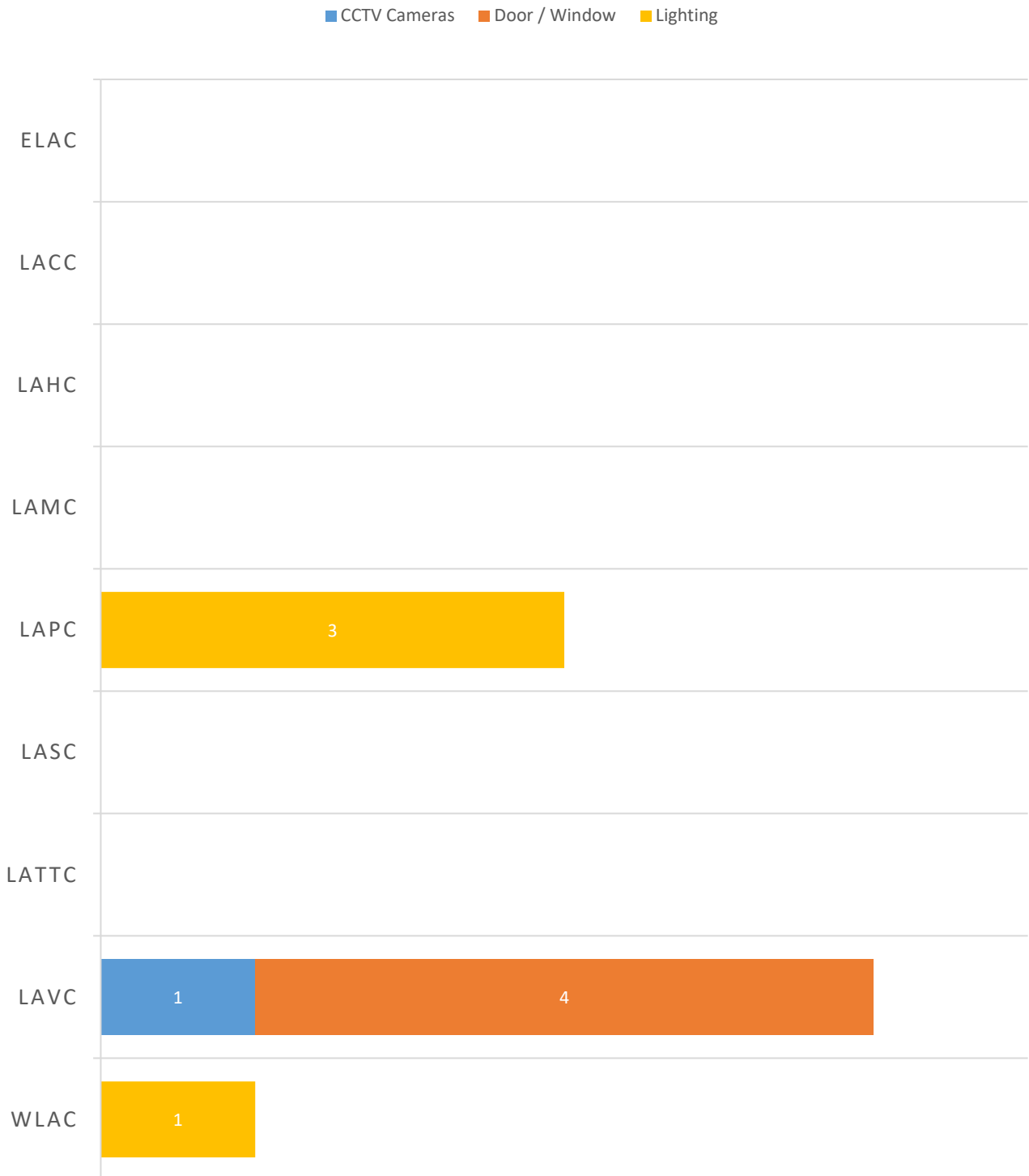

## Year-to-Date by Campus

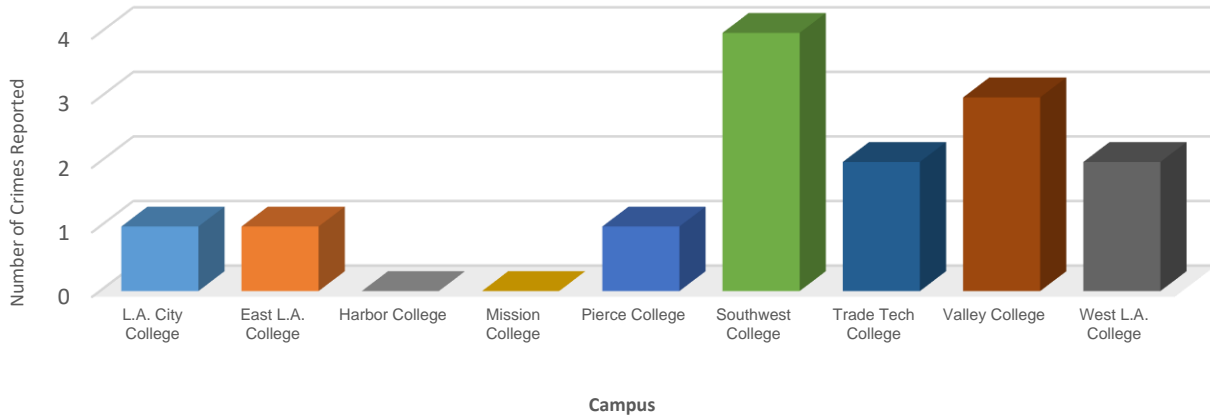

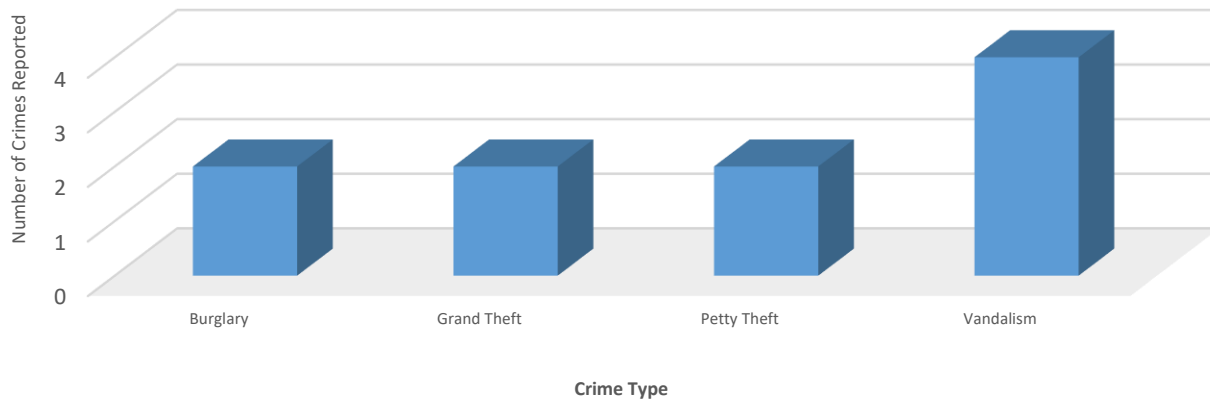

Total Part I & II By Campus

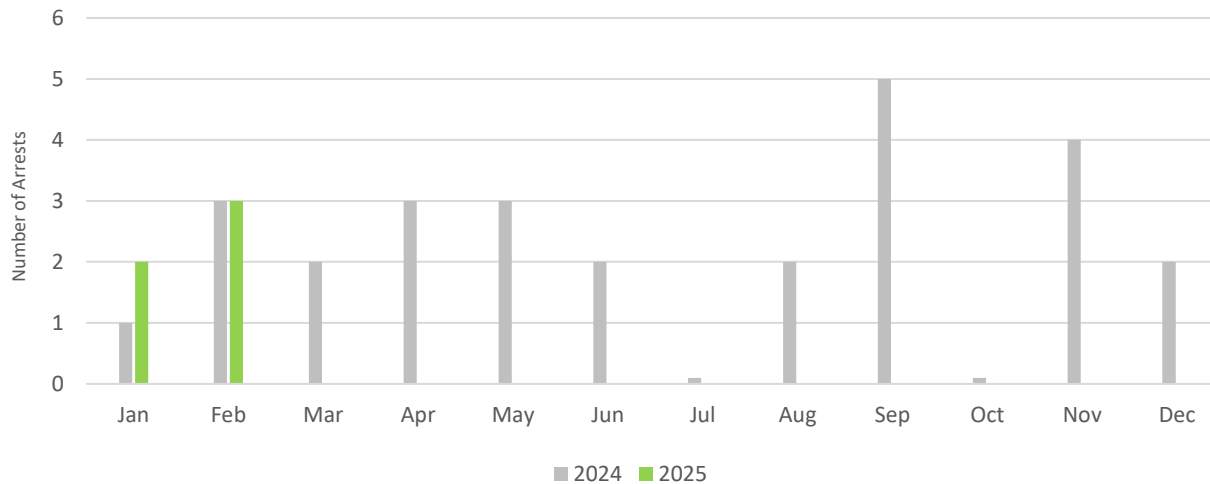

## Year-to-Date Arrests by Month

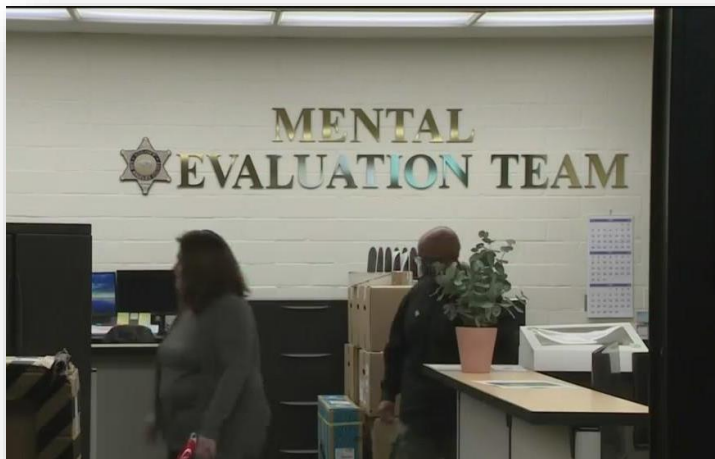


# HEAT Program Update

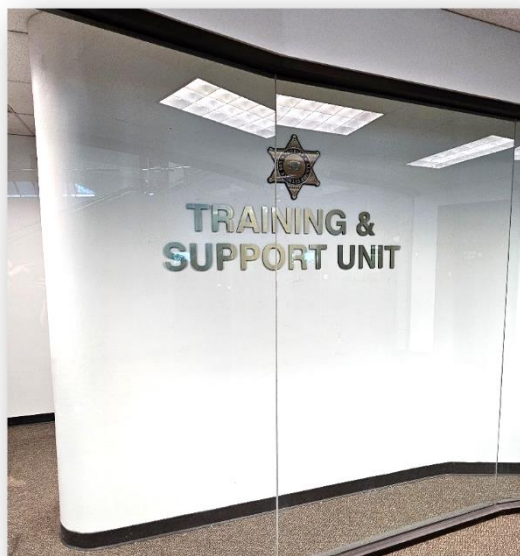
This week, I have been involved in the following:

## Spring 2025 Kicks Off

Community College Bureau personnel welcomed students to the start of the Spring 2025 semester. Deputy Sanders provided students with safety information and answered questions regarding federal immigration operations. Our personnel feel it is important to ensure students feel safe when attending school and adhere to the following guidelines:



- Department members shall investigate criminal activity without regard to an individual's legal status.
- Department members shall not inquire about an individual's immigration status.
- If a victim's, witness, or offender's immigration status is discovered during an investigation, deputies shall not forward that information to the United States Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE).

- Department members shall not initiate police action with the objective of discovering an individual's immigration status.
- Department members shall not use an immigration authority as an interpreter.
- Deputies shall not arrest an individual on suspicion of violating a federal immigration law relating to illegal entry, being unlawfully present, or overstaying a visa.

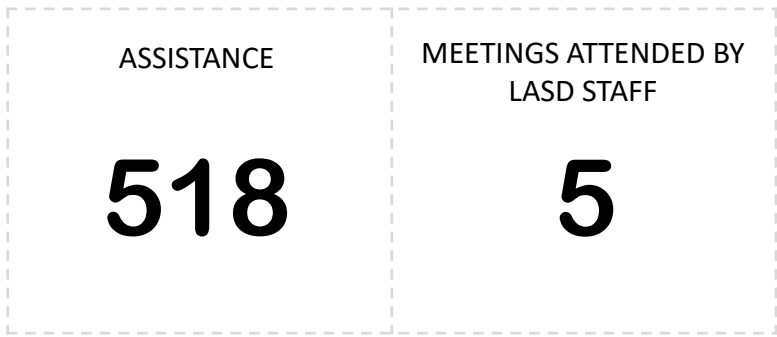


# Los Angeles Trade Tech College



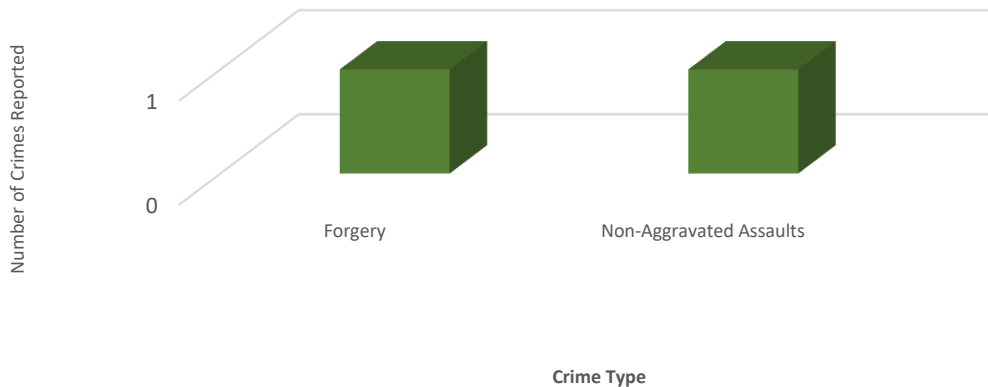

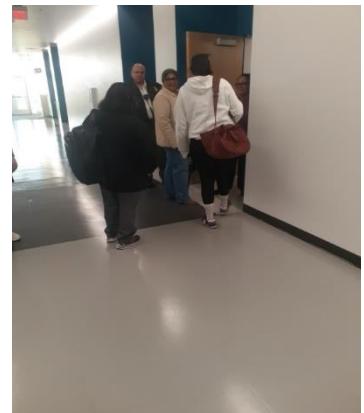


# West Los Angeles College

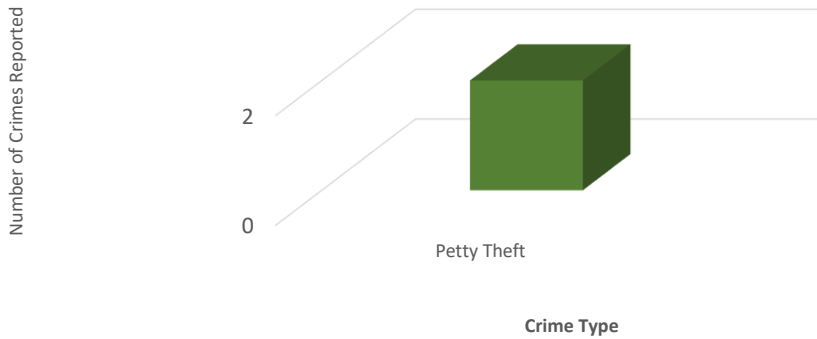

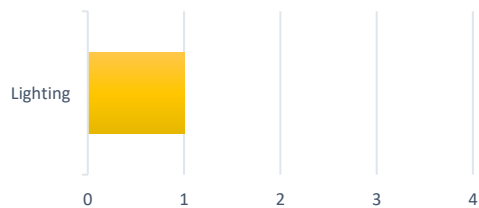
