

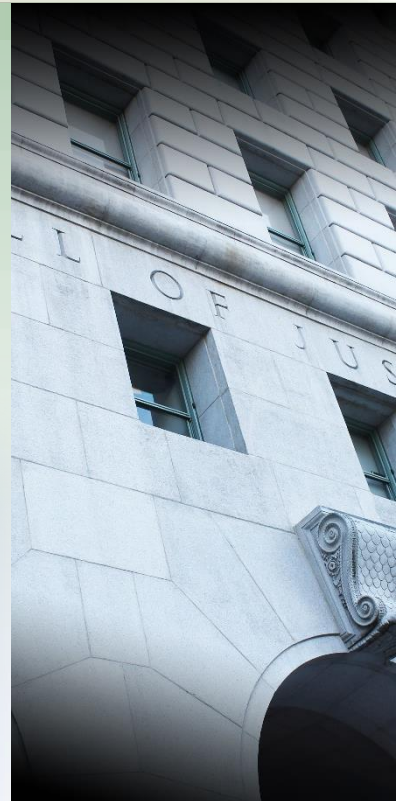

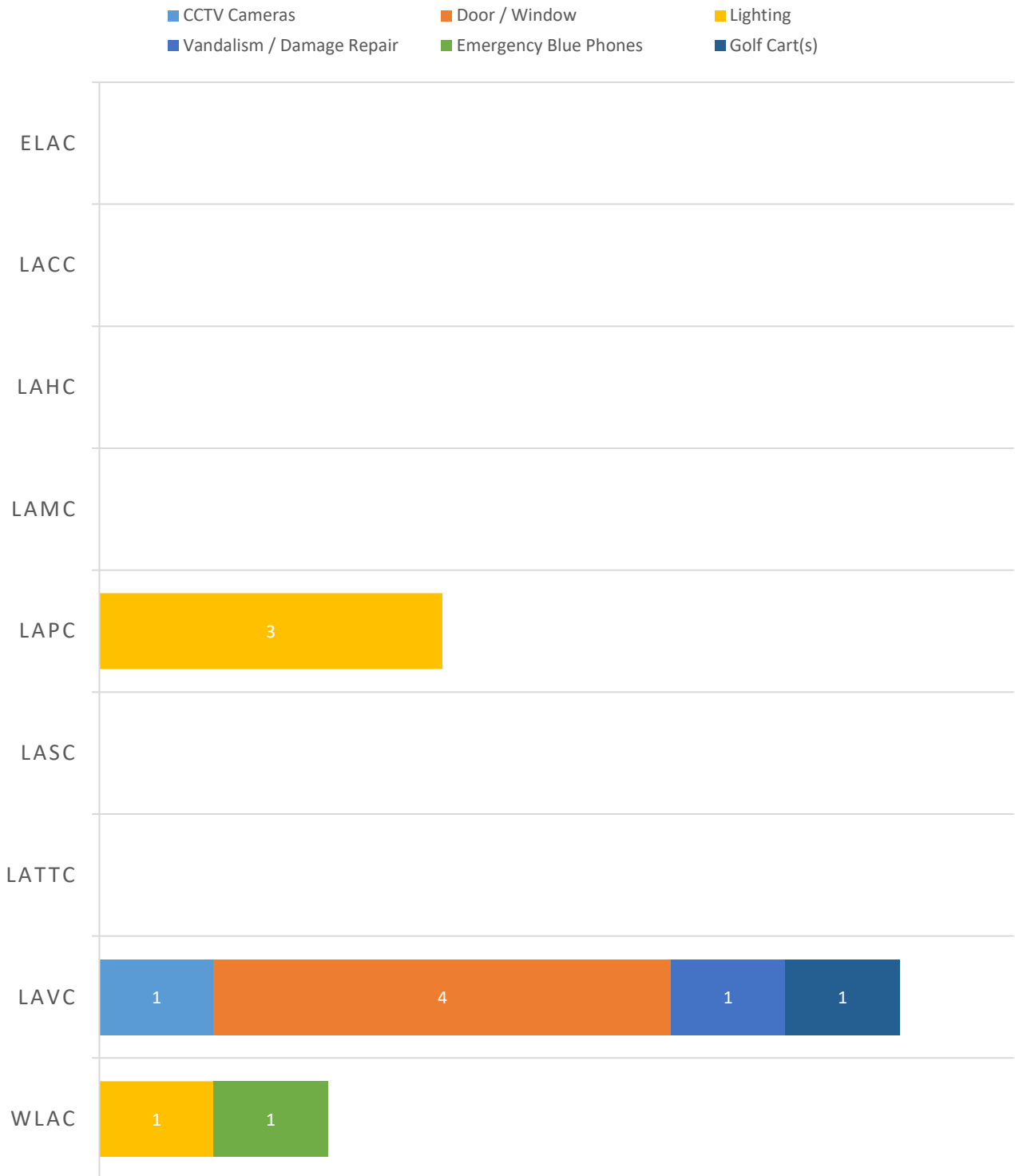

Year-to-Date by Campus

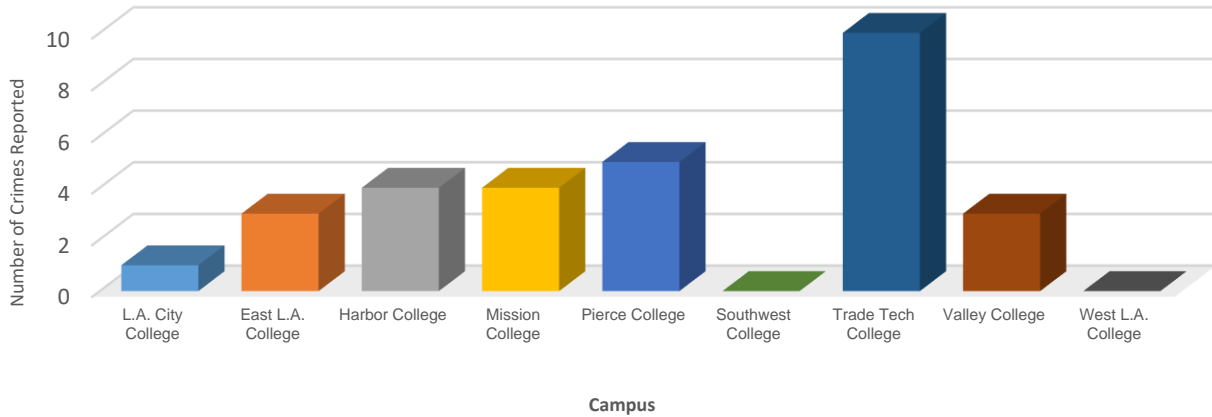

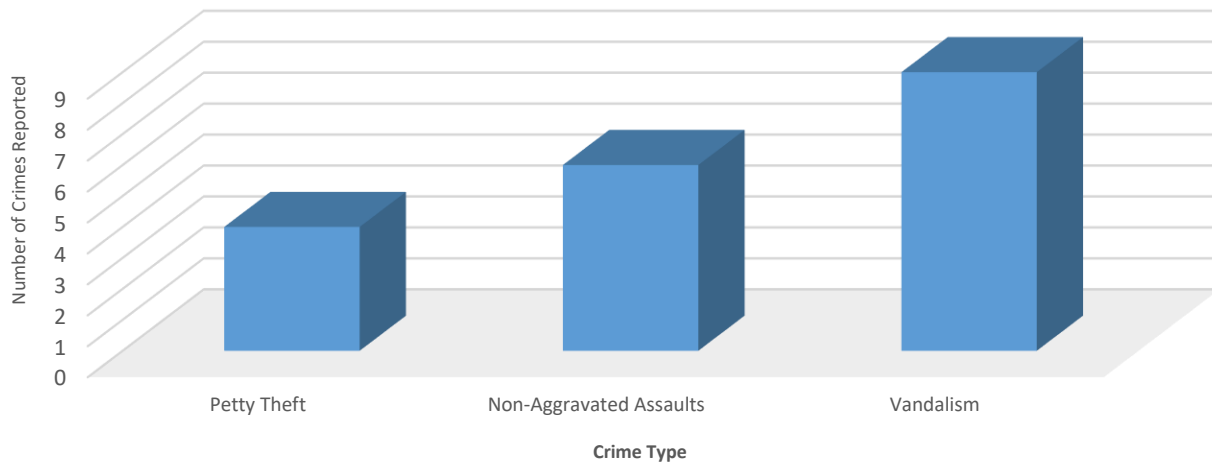

Total Part I & II By Campus

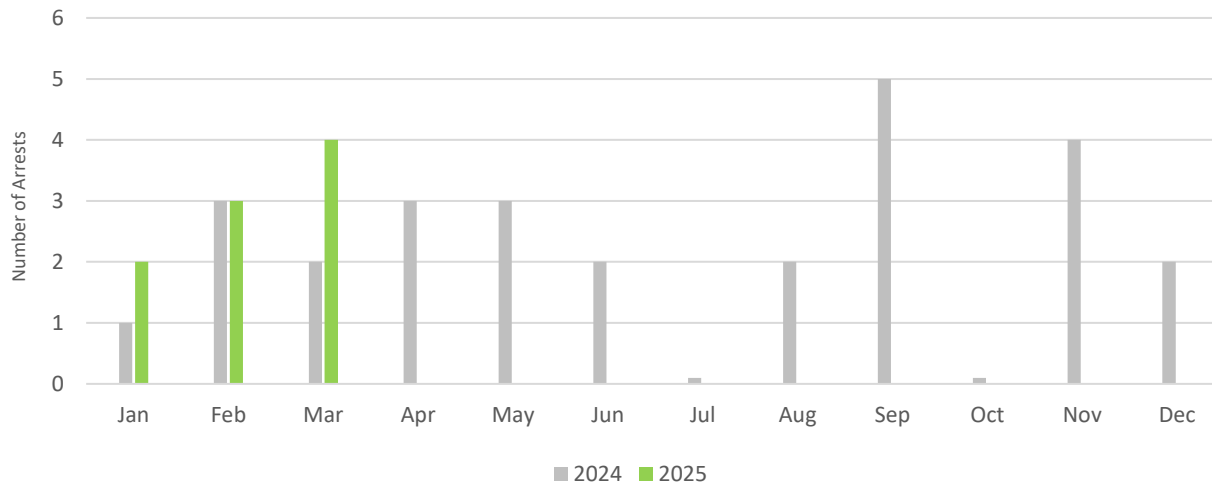

Year-to-Date Arrests by Month

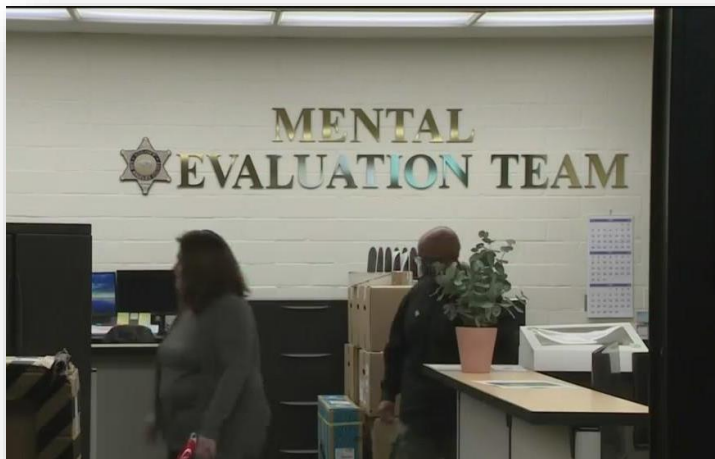


HEAT Program Update

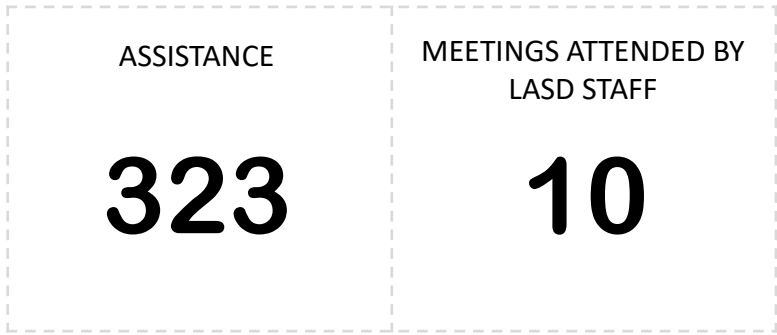
- Assisted with security operations at East Los Angeles College (ELAC) during a student protest.

East Los Angeles College



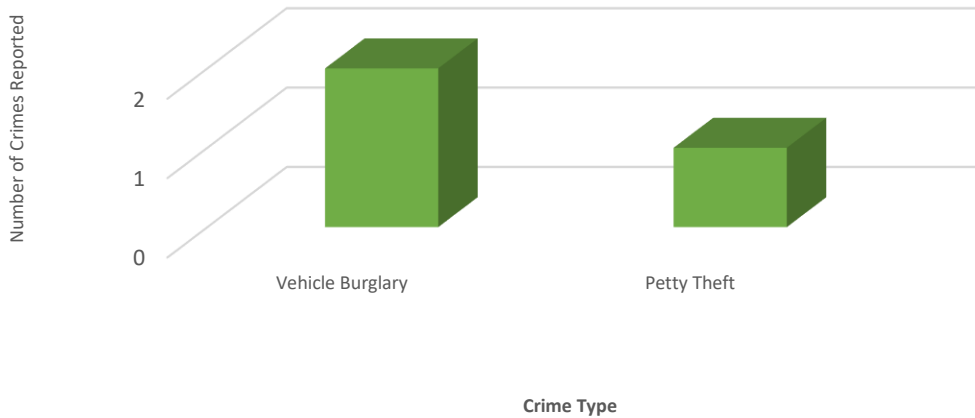
