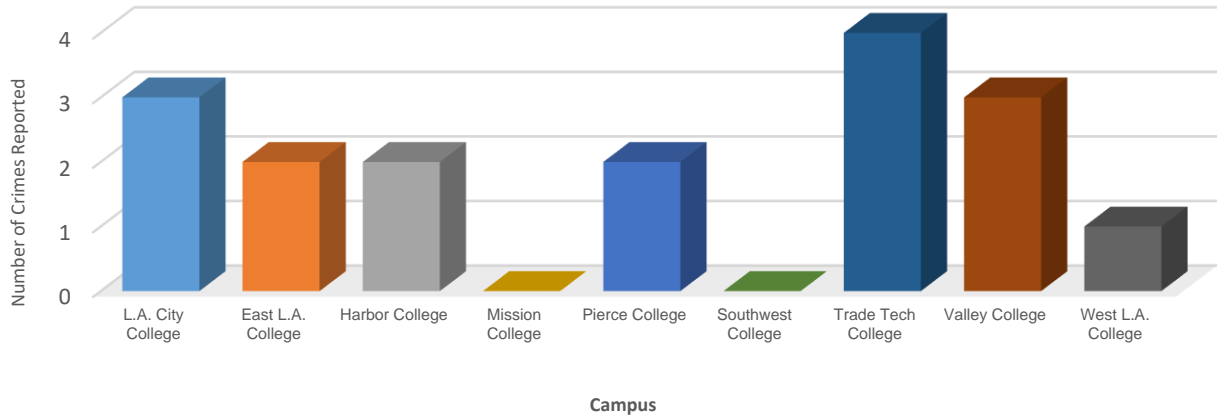

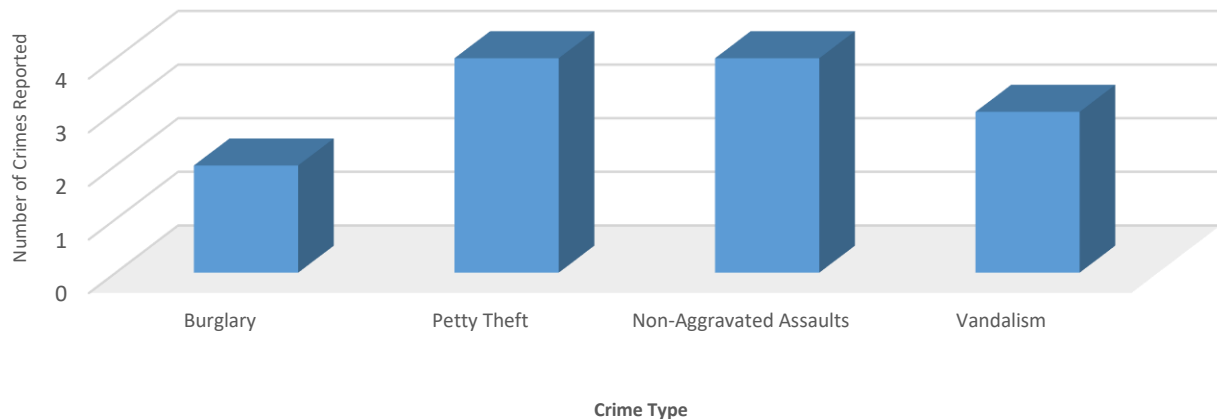

Total Part I & II By Campus

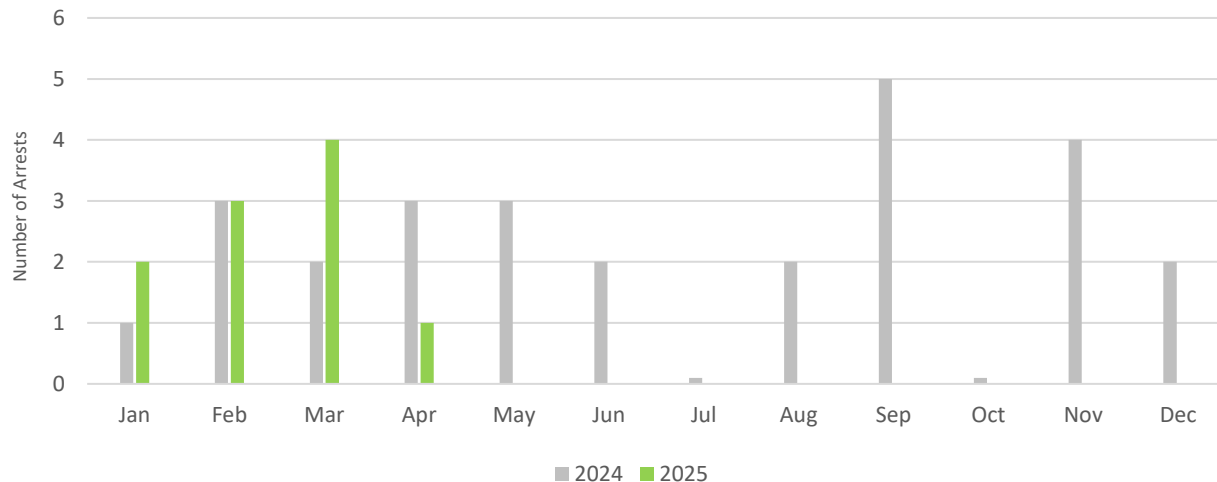

Year-to-Date Arrests by Month

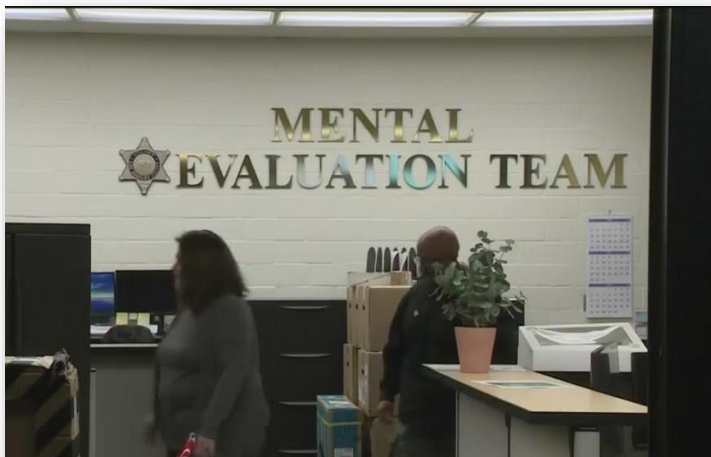


HEAT Program Update

April Update...

The following is a summary of the training activities conducted by the Training and Support Unit for the month of April:

- Coordinating with Administration of Justice Program Chairpersons to recruit current criminal justice students as role players for de-escalation and use-of-force scenario training with Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department (LASD) personnel, as well as for Mental Health Crisis Training with school administrators (all force is simulated only). Several criminal justice students have already participated.

- **04-17-25 EM SHIFT:** Conducted Use of Force/De-escalation training with LASD personnel assigned to LAPC.
- **04-19-25 EM SHIFT:** Conducted Use of Force/De-escalation training with LASD personnel assigned to Los Angeles Mission College and Los Angeles Harbor College.
- **04-21-25 DAY SHIFT:** Conducted Use of Force/De-escalation training with LASD personnel assigned to South Gate Campus.
- **04-21-25:** Participated in the Coffee with a Captain event at ELAC.
- **04-22-25:** Conducted Public Space/Private Areas training with ELAC administration.
- **04-30-25:** Conducted Mental Health Crisis and Behavioral Issue Identification training with ELAC administration.
