

Year-to-Date by Campus










Year-to-Date Arrests by Month






Los Angeles Mission College





On May 14, 2025, Community College Bureau (CCS) personnel hosted a "Coffee With a Cop Event" at Los Angeles Pierce College (LAPC).








Los Angeles Trade Tech College


