

Year-to-Date by Campus







Year-to-Date Arrests by Month



June Update...


The following is a summary of the training activities conducted by the Training and Support Unit for the month of June:

- Met with West Los Angeles College President Doctor Limbaugh to discuss safety and security details for the June 10, 2025, graduation.
- Met with Los Angeles Valley College Vice President Sarah Song to discuss Active Shooter and Building Marshal training (Building Marshal training prepares individuals to assist with building evacuations and emergency responses within a specific building or area).
- Authored the Event Action Plan for the upcoming Active Threat training to be conducted at the Los Angeles Valley College campus.
- Authored curriculum with an emphasis on de-escalation after contacting individuals in crisis. The curriculum was disseminated to all deputy sheriffs and security officers.
- Met with Safety and Emergency Preparedness Manager Adam Saurin and personnel from the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department Emergency Operations Bureau to create a tabletop exercises to train LACCD administrators. The training exercises include:
 - Critical incident management
 - Establishing a command post
 - Establishing ICC's on campuses
- Conducted de-escalation training with Security Officers from LAPC, LAVC, and LAMC.
