DAYLIGHTING LAW NOTICE



Fact Sheet

On January 1, 2025, a new California law, Assembly Bill 413, also known as the Daylighting to Save Lives Bill, took effect statewide.

What does the Daylighting Law do?


- Prohibits stopping, standing, or parking vehicles:
 - Within 20 feet of the approach side of any crosswalk; or
 - Within 15 feet of the approach side of any crosswalk with a curb extension ("bulb-out")
- After January 1, 2025, it permits jurisdictions to issue citations for a violation.

Why Daylighting Matters?

- Nearly 36% of all pedestrian traffic fatalities in unincorporated Los Angeles County occur at intersections.
- Daylighting enhances visibility for drivers, pedestrians, and cyclists.
- Daylighting creates more walkable and livable communities.

What's Happening?

- Public Works is installing new red curb markings in unincorporated Los Angeles County, focusing on areas where there have been concentrations of fatal and severe injury collisions and areas with high pedestrian activity.
- Daylighting Law applies even if there's no posted signage or painted curb.
- All existing parking regulations still apply.
