LASD Deputy-Involved Shooting (DIS) on the 16000 block of Sigman Street, Hacienda Heights.

The following information is based on facts determined from an investigation into the incident described. The investigation is ongoing, and as witnesses are interviewed, evidence is analyzed, and reports are reviewed, our understanding of the facts may change. The details described below accurately reflect the facts as we currently know them.

On July 31, 2025, at approximately 4:00 p.m., Industry Sheriff's Station deputies responded to a family disturbance, person with a knife, and a battery call on the 16000 block of Sigman Street in Hacienda Heights. Information provided in the call indicated that a male had choked a female family member and had armed himself with two knives. The male was reportedly blocking a doorway and had charged at a family member. The male was later identified as 57-year-old Ramon Flores.

Upon their arrival, deputies heard a female screaming inside the residence. Deputies forced entry into the residence through the front door and encountered Flores in a hallway, armed with a knife in each hand. Flores was ordered numerous times to stop but he refused to comply. Flores charged toward deputies, knives in hand, and a deputy-involved shooting occurred.

Flores was struck by gunfire and collapsed to the floor. Deputies rendered medical aid to Flores until the arrival of Los Angeles County Fire Department personnel. Flores was transported to a local hospital, where he was pronounced deceased.

No deputies or other persons were injured during the incident.

Two knives, each with an approximate six-inch blade, were recovered at the scene.

LASD Homicide investigators responded to the scene to conduct interviews, follow up, and process the scene. Representatives from the Office of the Inspector General (OIG), Internal Affairs Bureau (IAB), and the Los Angeles County District Attorney's Office – Justice System Integrity Division (JSID) also responded and monitored the investigation.

Once completed, the criminal investigation will be forwarded to the District Attorney's Office to determine whether the force used by the involved personnel violated any criminal laws. Once the District Attorney's Office investigation is

completed, the LASD will evaluate the actions of the personnel within the application of policy, procedures, and tactics.
