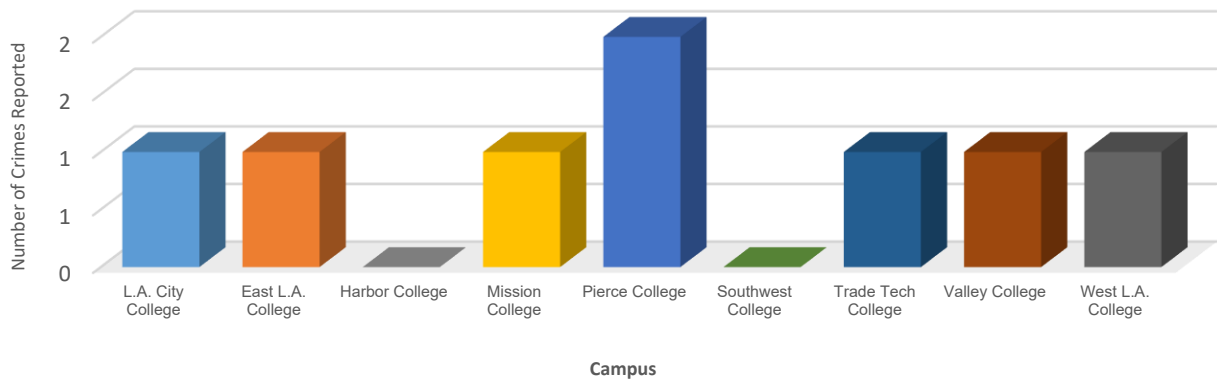

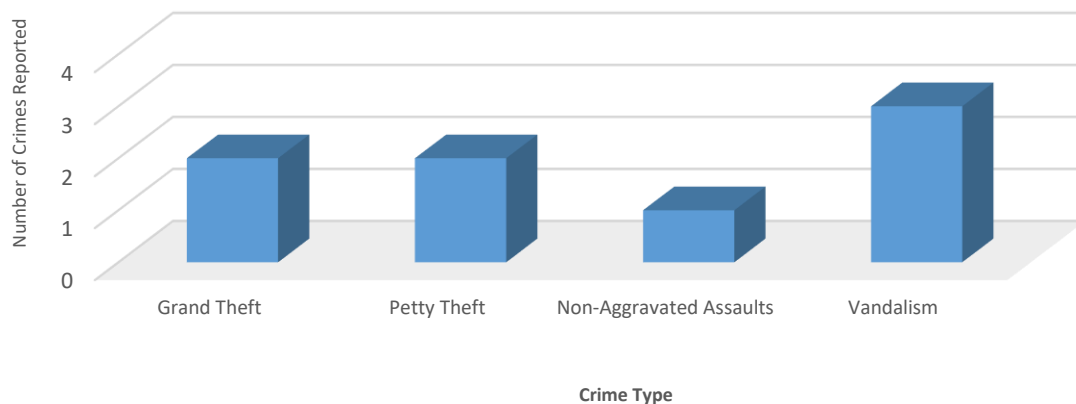

Total Part I & II By Campus

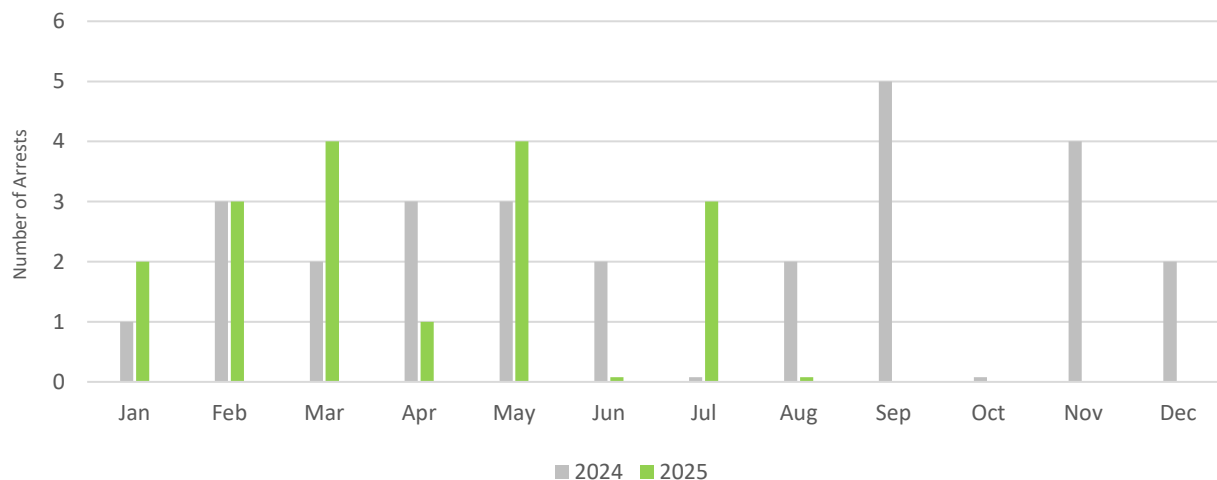

Year-to-Date Arrests by Month

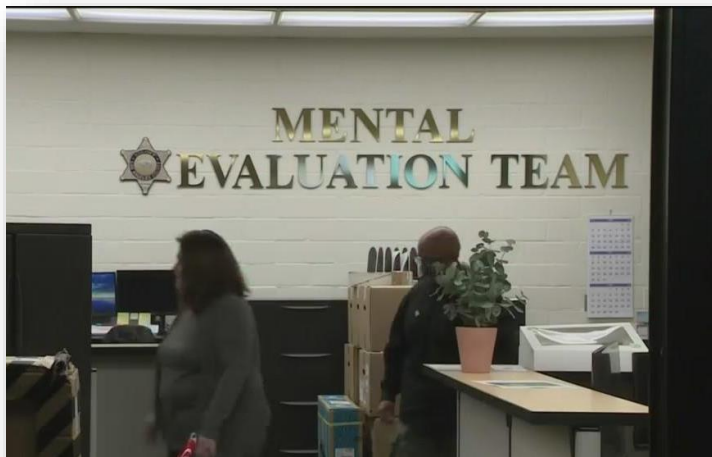


HEAT Program Update

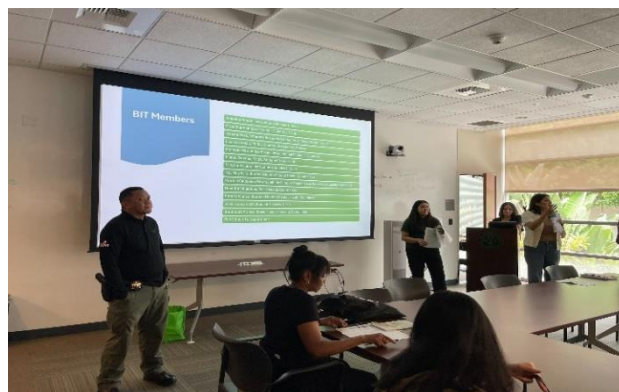
East Los Angeles College

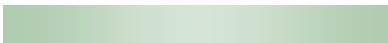


Los Angeles City College

On Thursday, August 21, 2025, the LASD Mental Evaluation Team partnered with Los Angeles Mission College to deliver a specialized training session on behavioral awareness and crisis management. This training was designed to equip college staff with the knowledge and skills to better understand, recognize, and respond to intense or critical situations. The curriculum covered the following key topics:

- **Distinguishing Between Behavioral Issues and Crises:** Identifying signs of distress and differentiating them from imminent threats.
- **Jurisdiction and Privacy:** Explaining the legal and practical differences between public and private spaces on campus.
- **Understanding 1st and 4th Amendment Rights:** Reviewing how these constitutional rights apply on campus and clarifying when protected speech may cross into criminal behavior.
- **Administrative Action:** Outlining the roles and responsibilities of campus administration during and after an incident.
- **Incident Reporting Procedures:** Guidance on how to properly and efficiently report incidents on campus, including referrals to the Behavioral Intervention Team (BIT).
