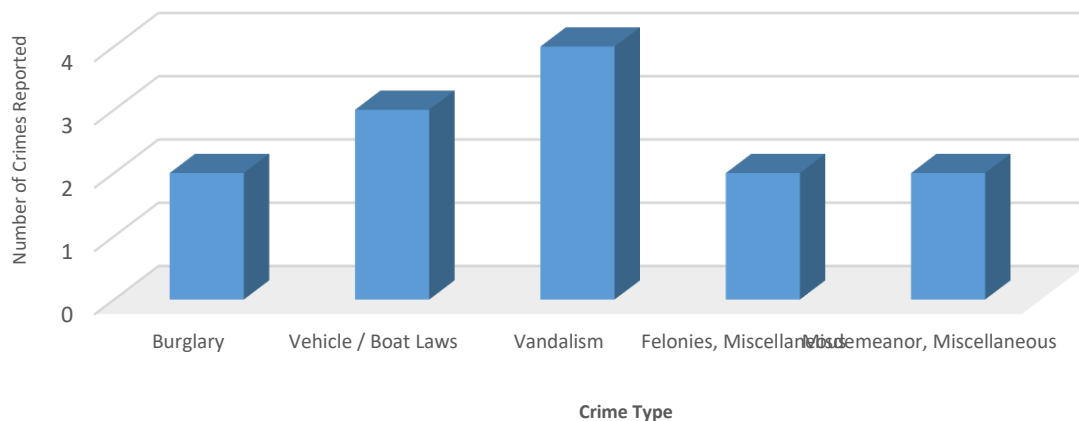

Total Part I & II By Campus

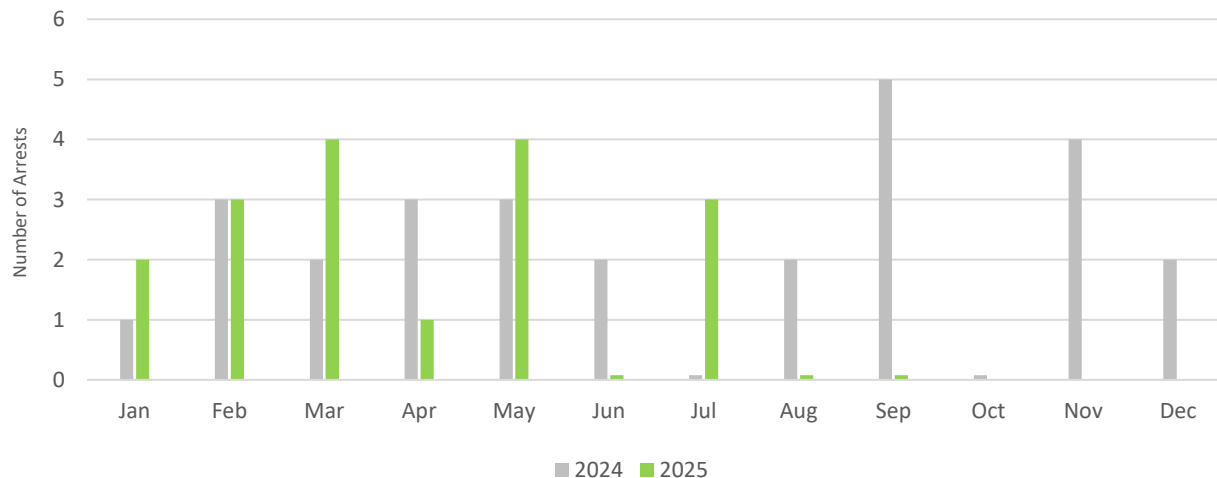

## Year-to-Date Arrests by Month

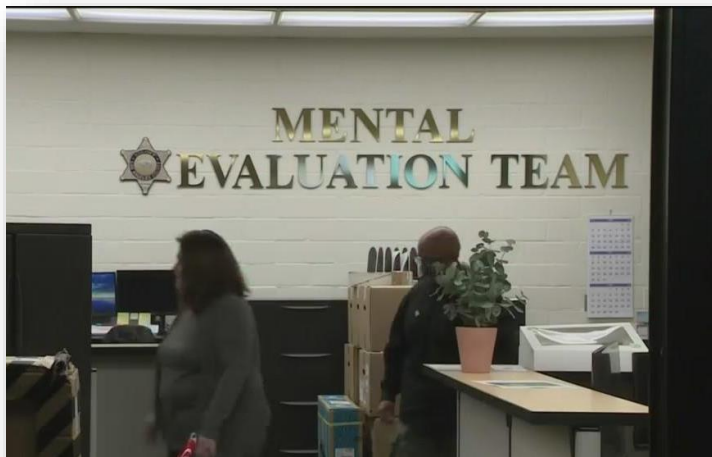


# HEAT Program Update

They set up information tables where students could stop by, ask questions, and pick up pamphlets containing essential resources for navigating campus life.

The presence of CCS personnel not only offered valuable guidance but also helped students feel safe and supported as they transitioned into the new school year. By distributing materials and engaging directly with students, the CCS personnel built friendly connections that reinforced their roles as both protectors and be approachable on campus.

Additionally, representatives from the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department Recruitment team were on hand. They provided students with information about career paths in law enforcement, entry requirements, and the application process. This gave interested students the opportunity to learn more about how they can serve their communities through public safety.

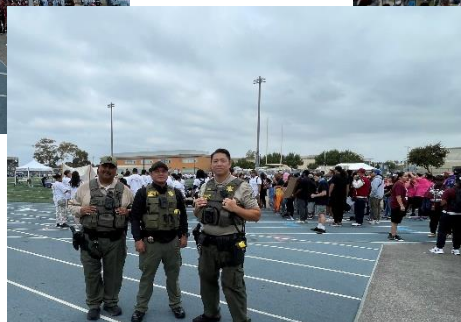

For decades, the LAPC Cross Country course has been a cornerstone for student-athletes across Southern California. With construction threatening to disrupt the venue this year, college officials quickly stepped in to reimagine the course and ensure the season could continue.
