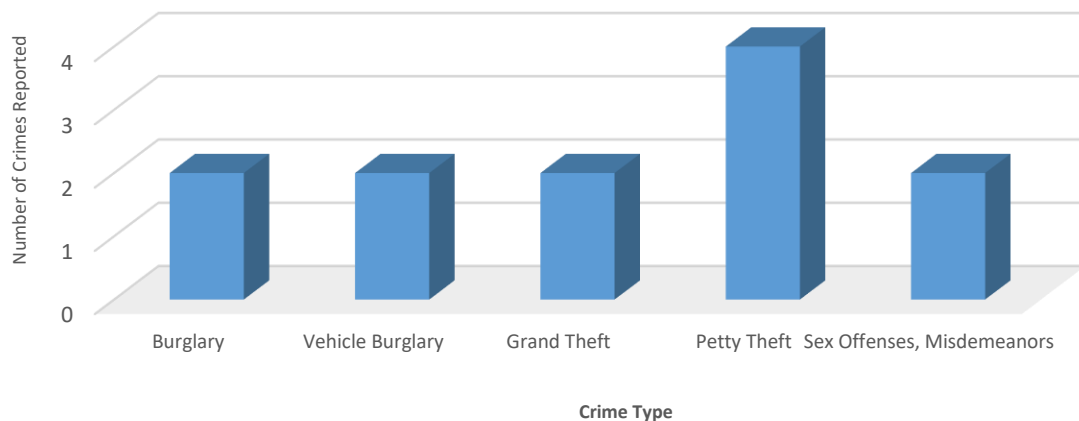

Total Part I & II By Campus

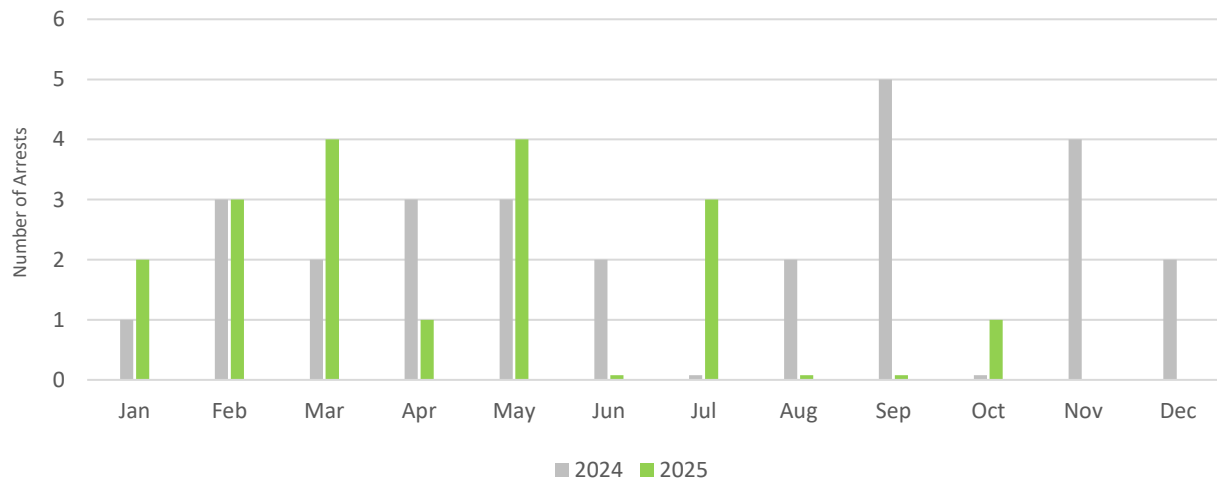

## Year-to-Date Arrests by Month

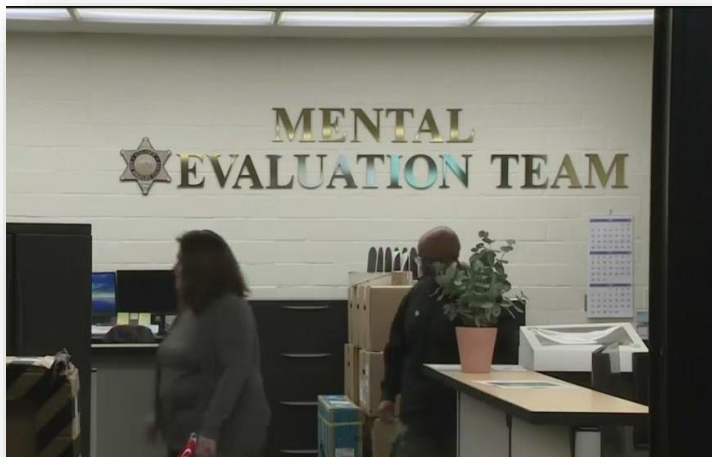
