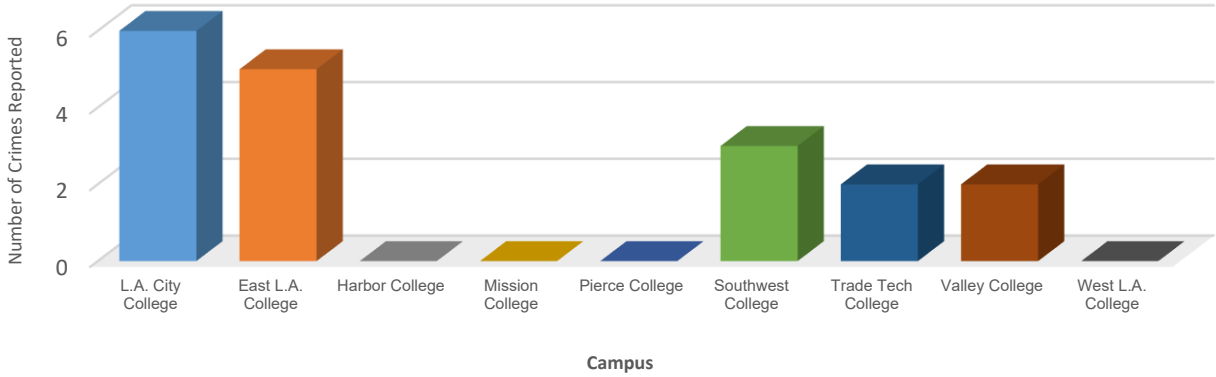

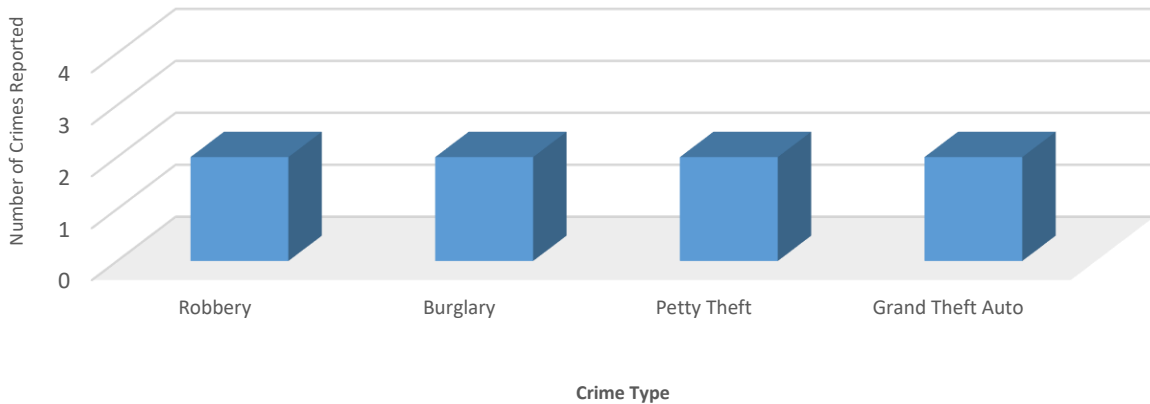

Total Part I & II By Campus

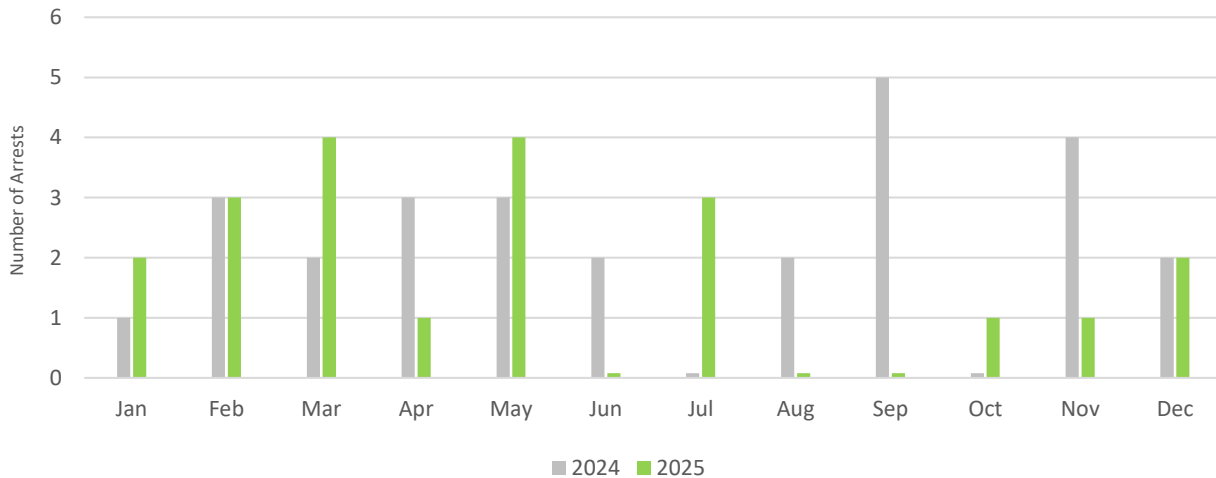

Year-to-Date Arrests by Month

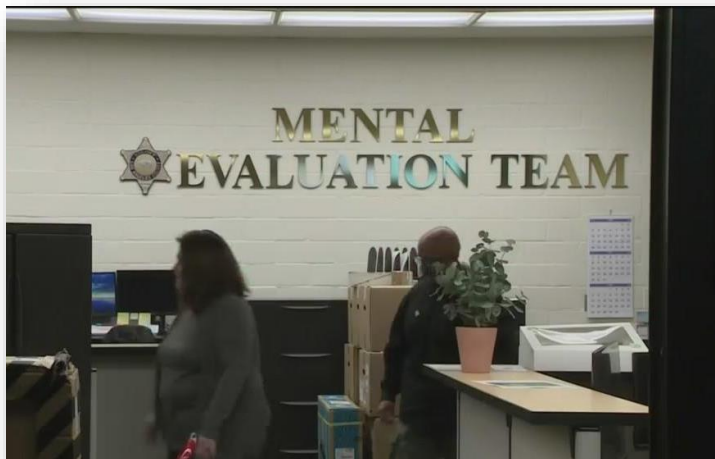


HEAT Program Update

- **December 17, 2025:** TSU attended Coffee with a Cop at Los Angeles Southwest College.

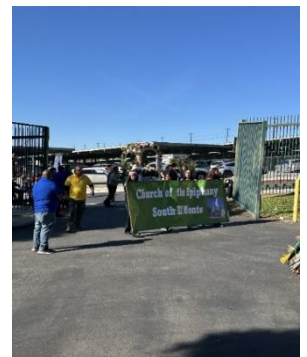


East Los Angeles College
