

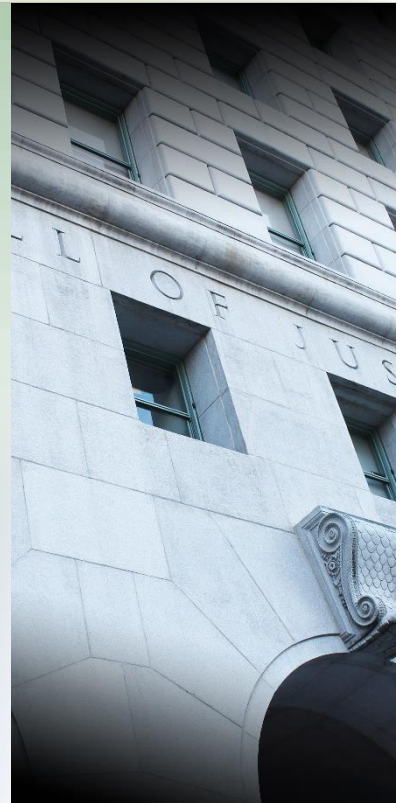

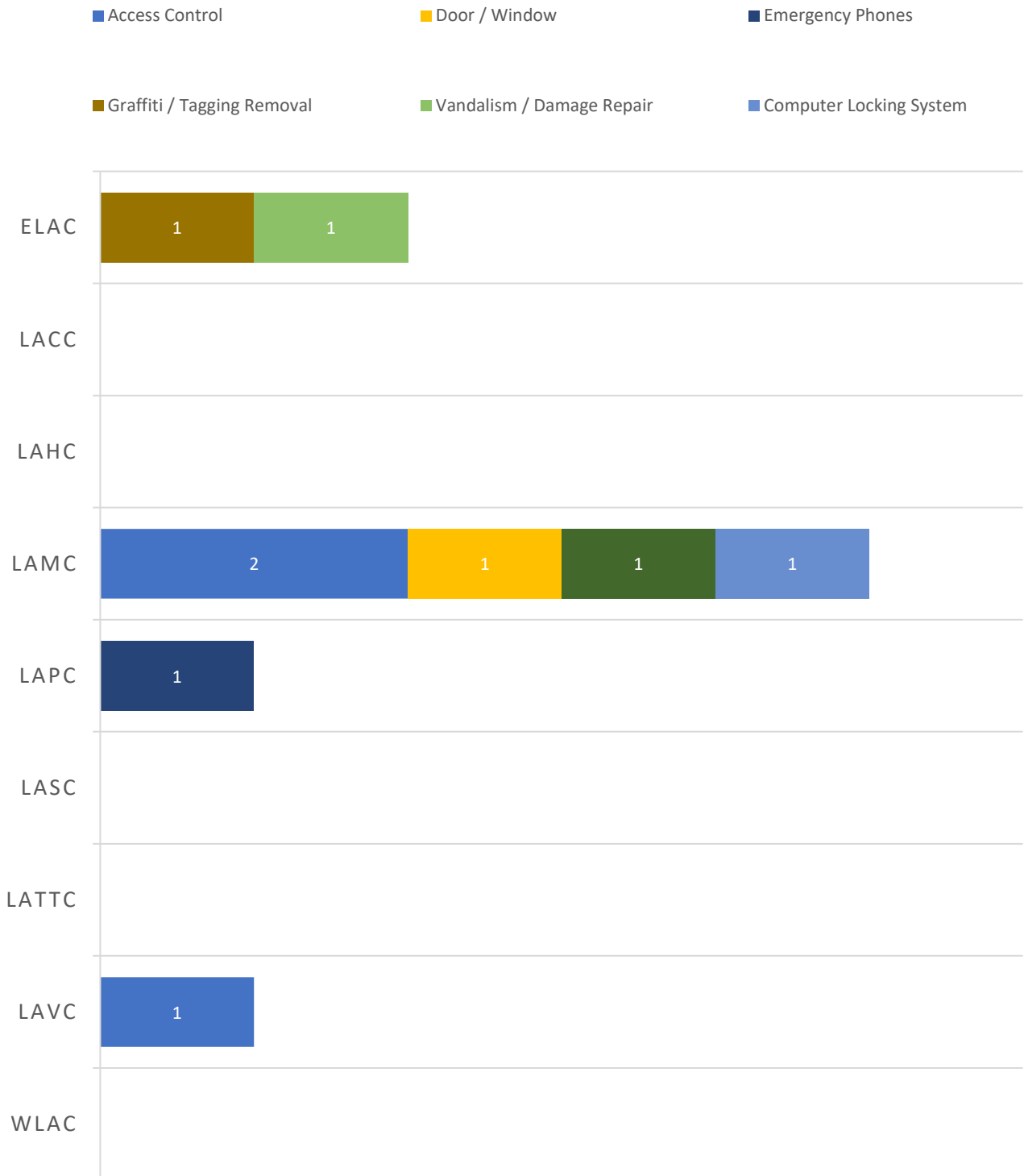

## Year-to-Date by Campus

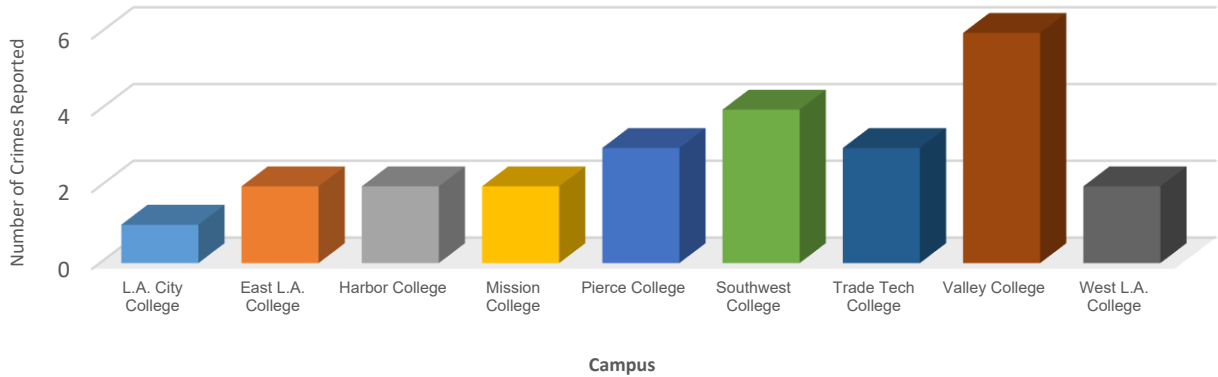

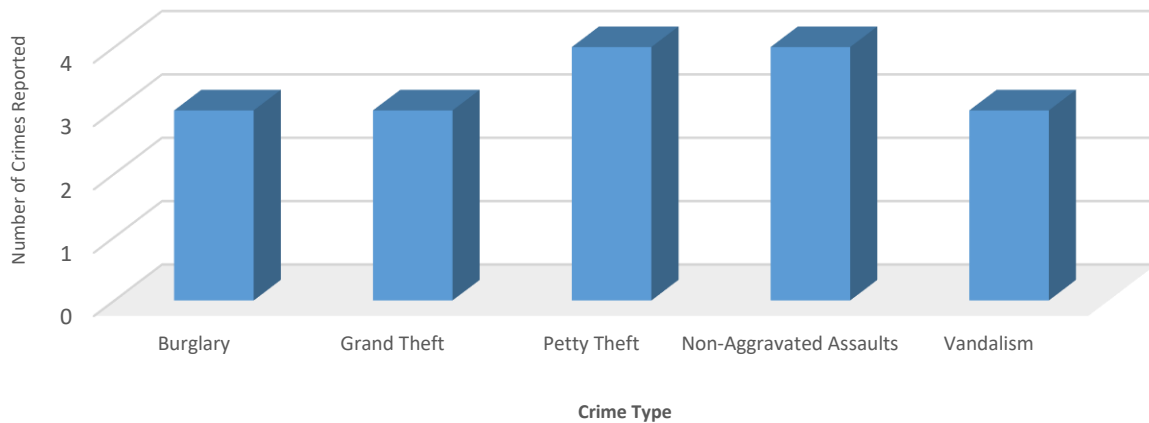

Total Part I & II By Campus

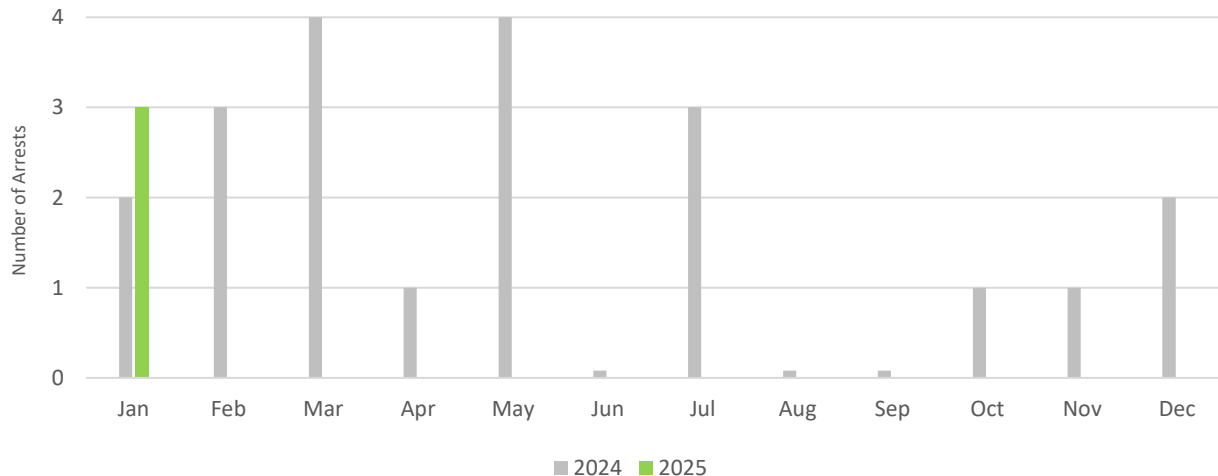

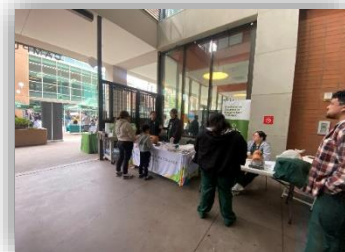
# East Los Angeles College

# Los Angeles Pierce College

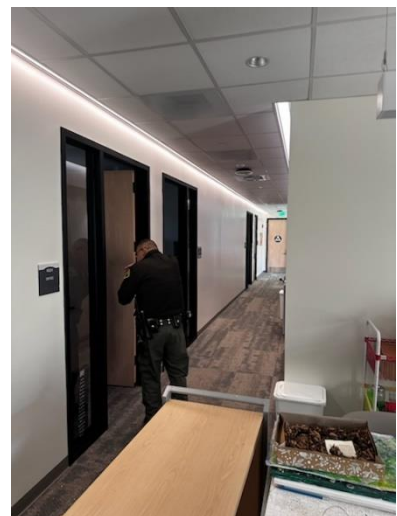

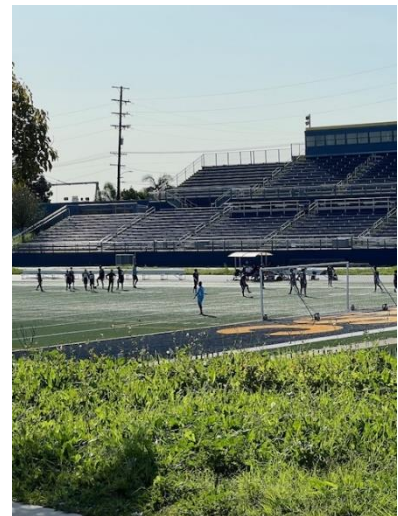


# Los Angeles Southwest College

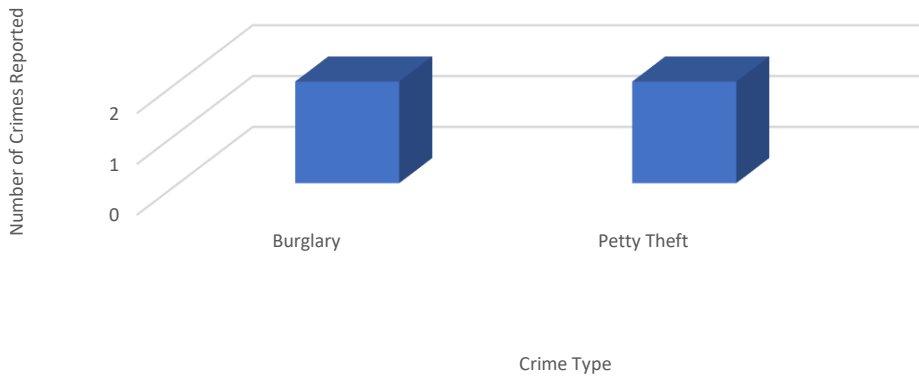

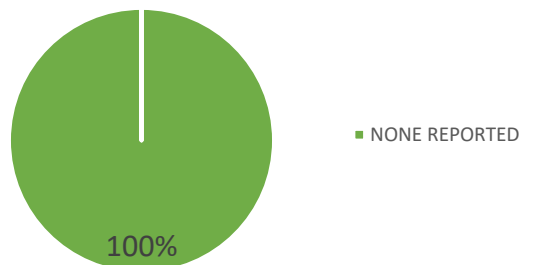

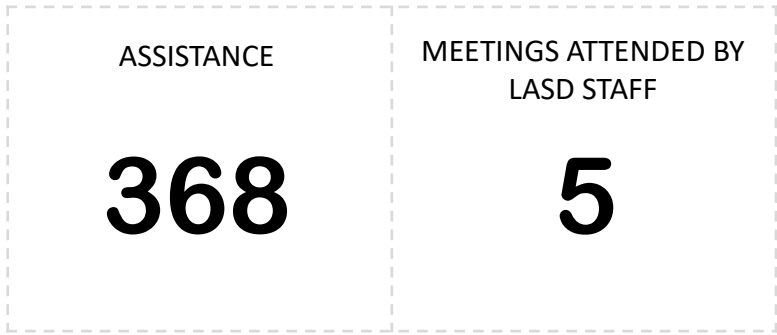


# Los Angeles Trade Tech College
