

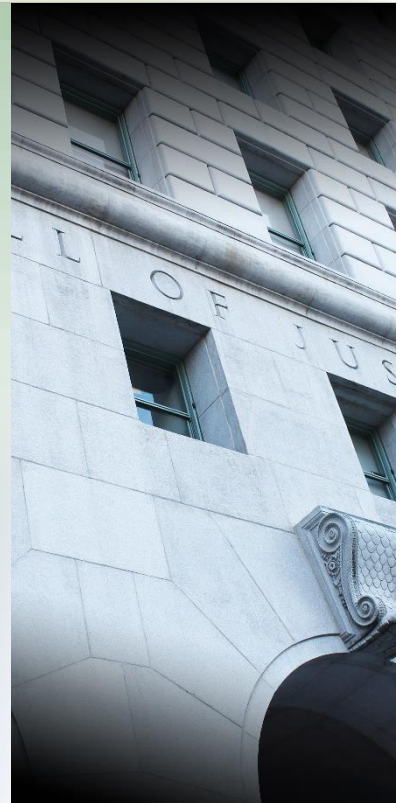

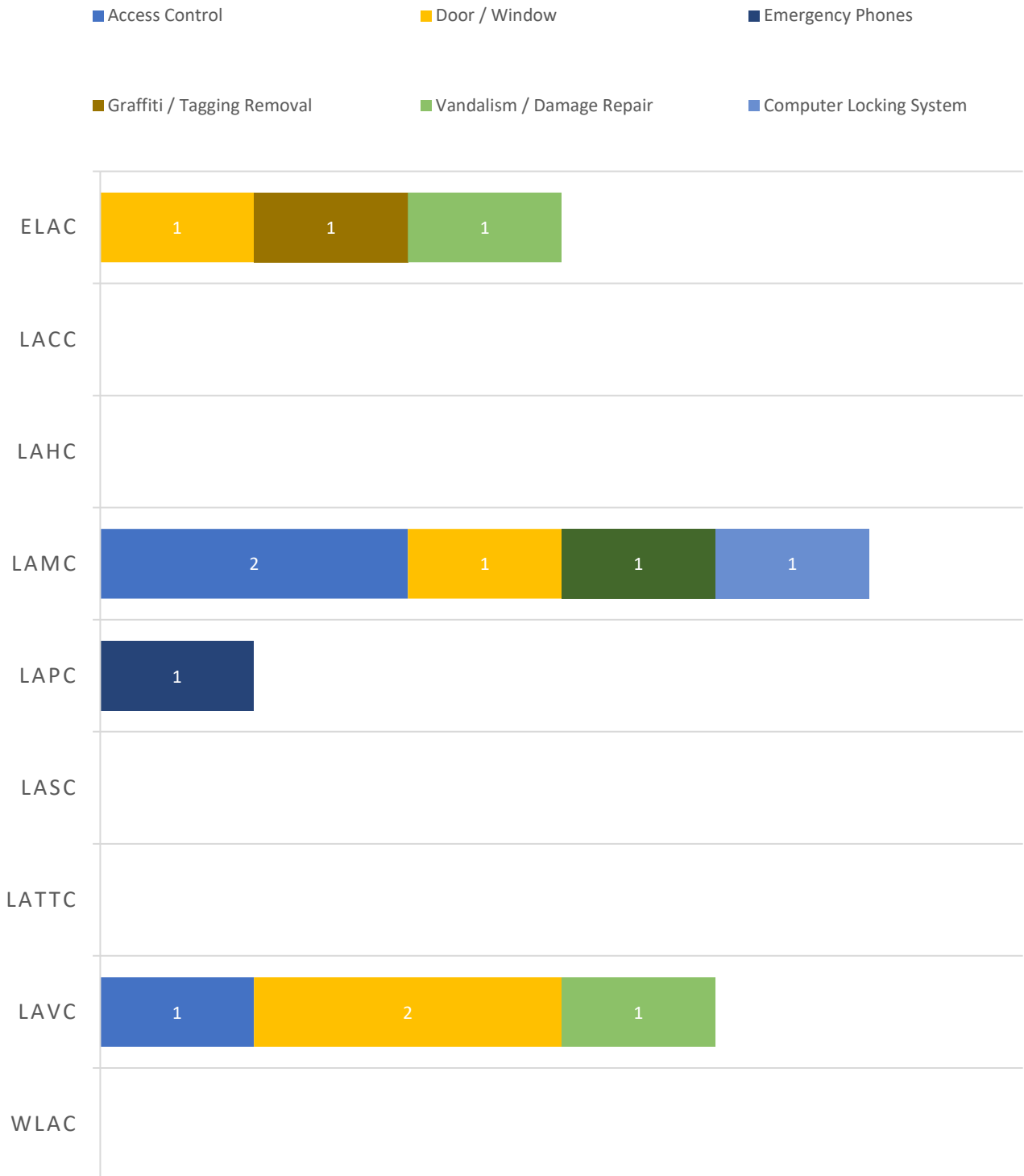

Year-to-Date by Campus

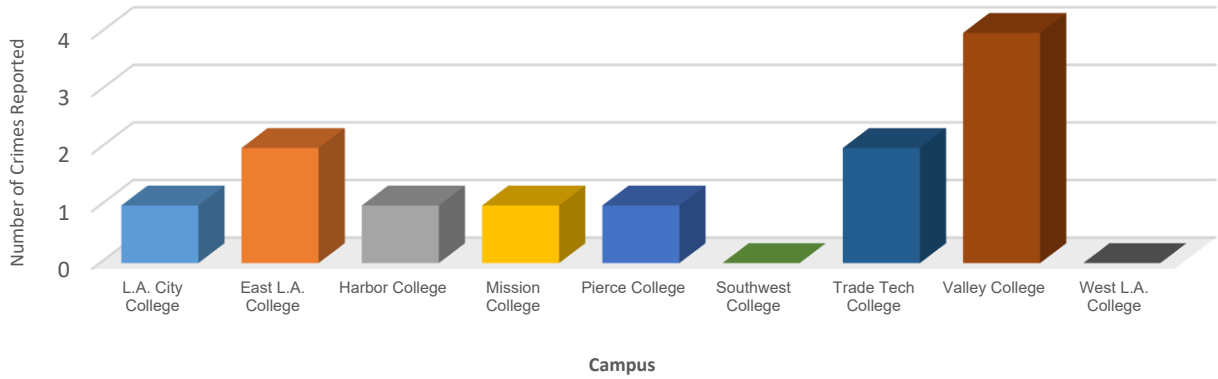

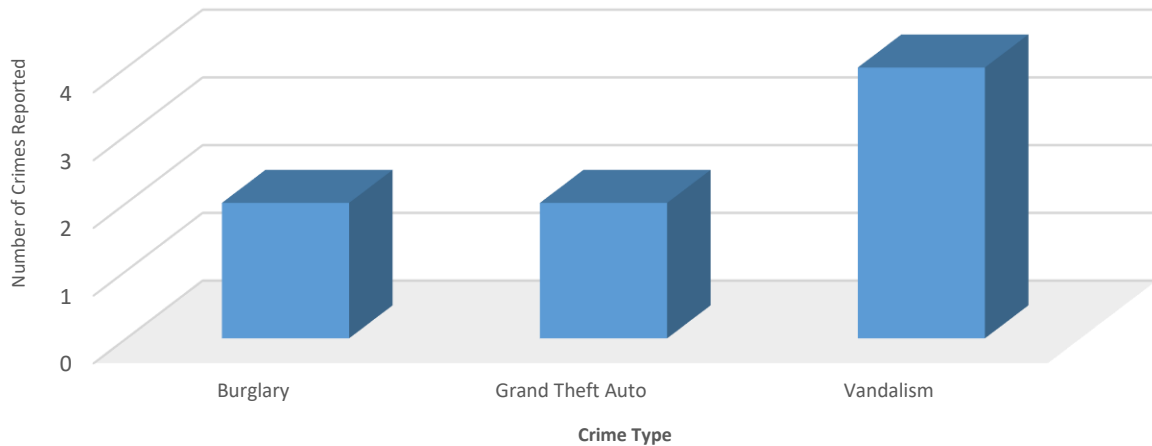

Total Part I & II By Campus

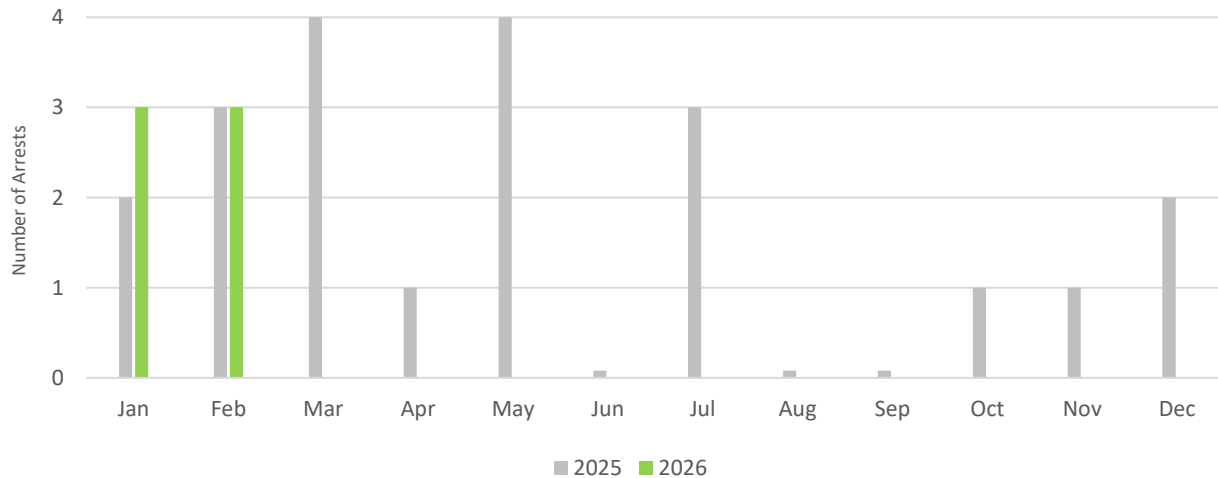

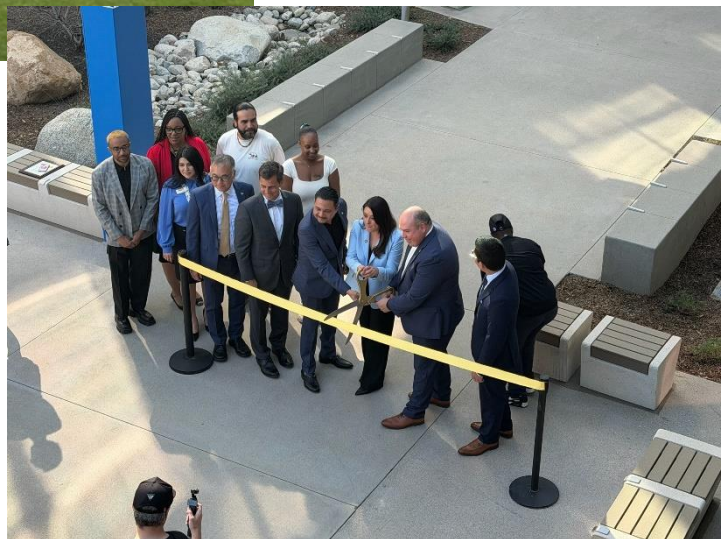
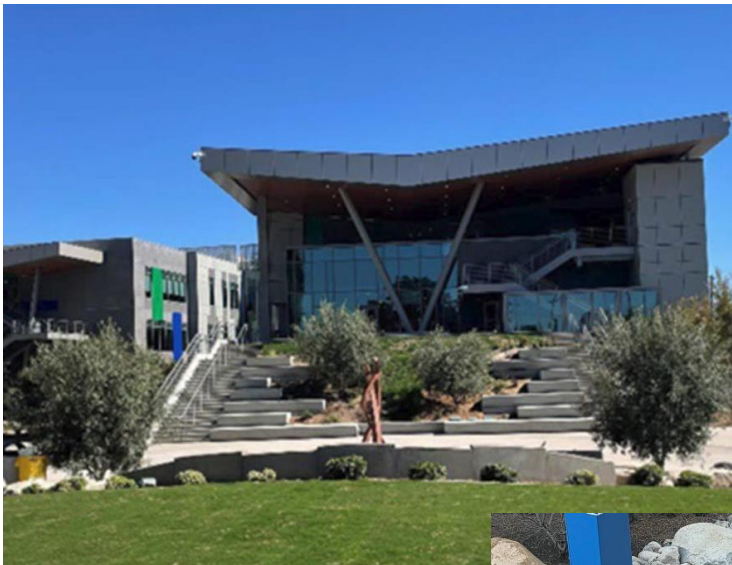


Los Angeles Valley College

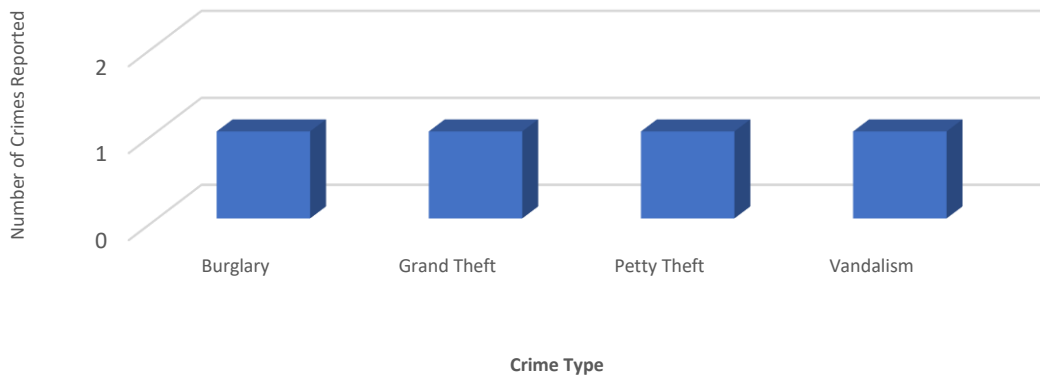

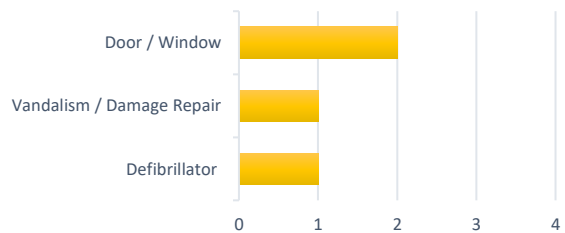

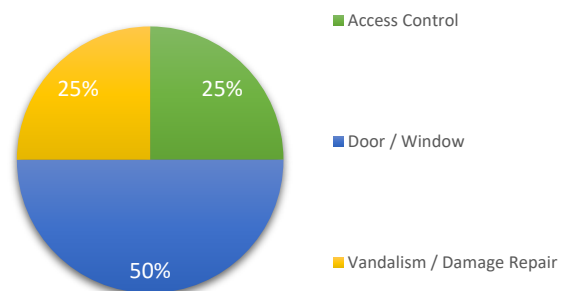

From the Community College Bureau's personnel, our heartfelt thanks go out for all the years of service he offered to the WLAC community, may he rest in peace.



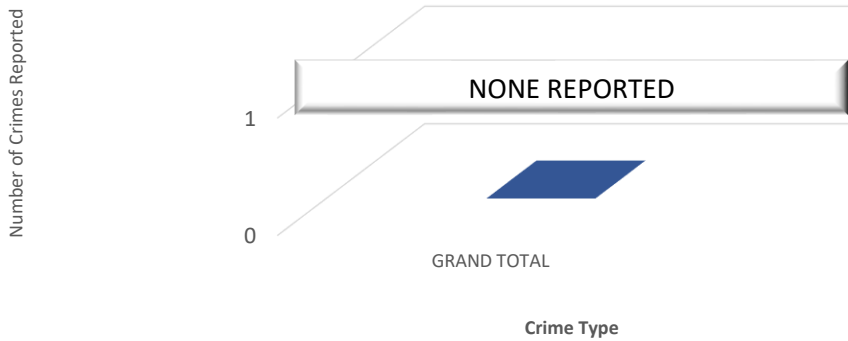
