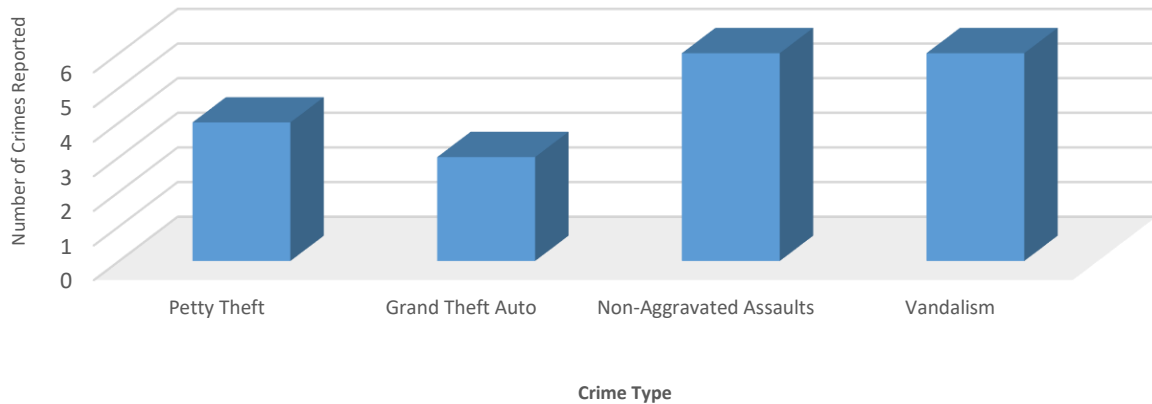

Total Part I & II By Campus

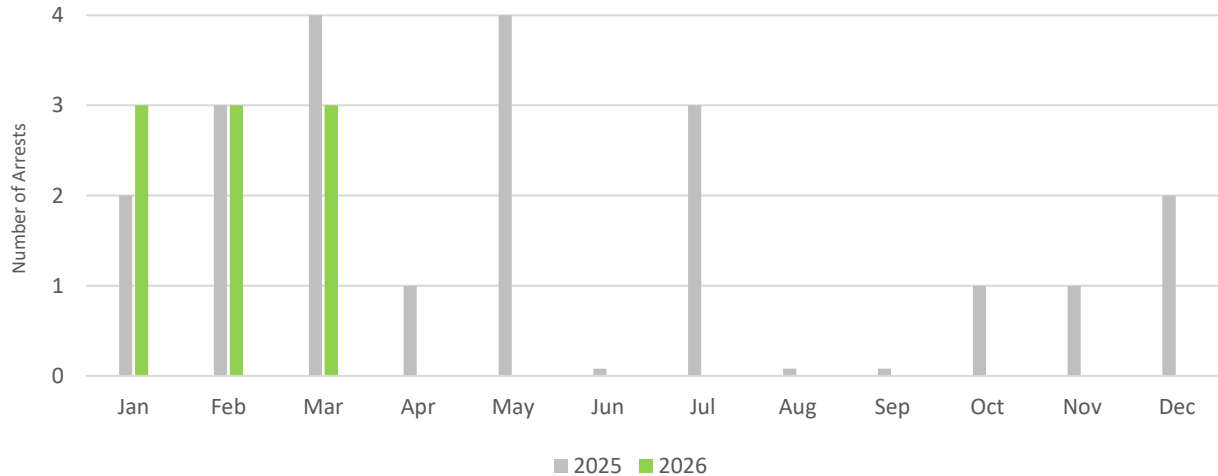

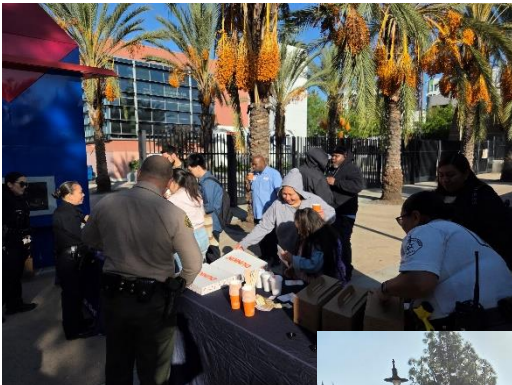
# Los Angeles City College

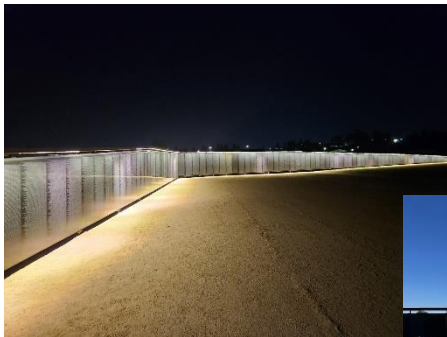
# Los Angeles Pierce College

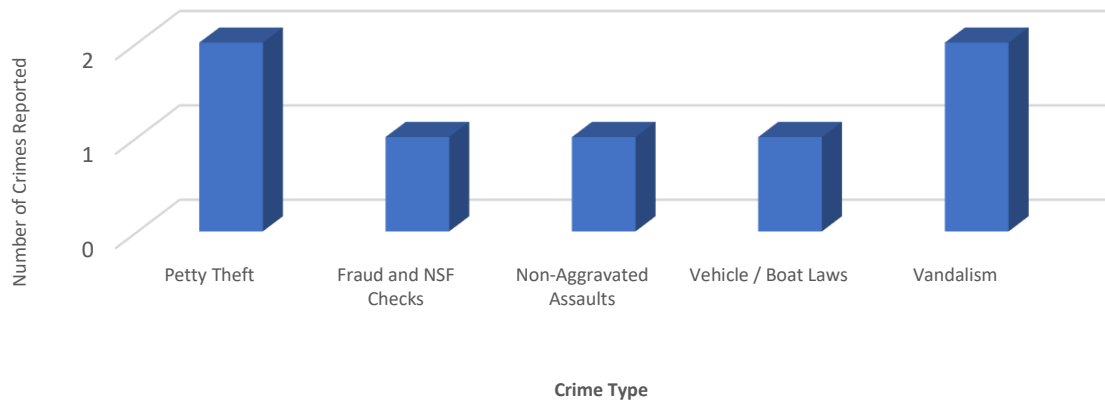
Every year, March is designated to Women's History Month. The month is set aside to honor women's contributions in American history. This month Los Angeles Trade Tech College celebrated women in construction.
