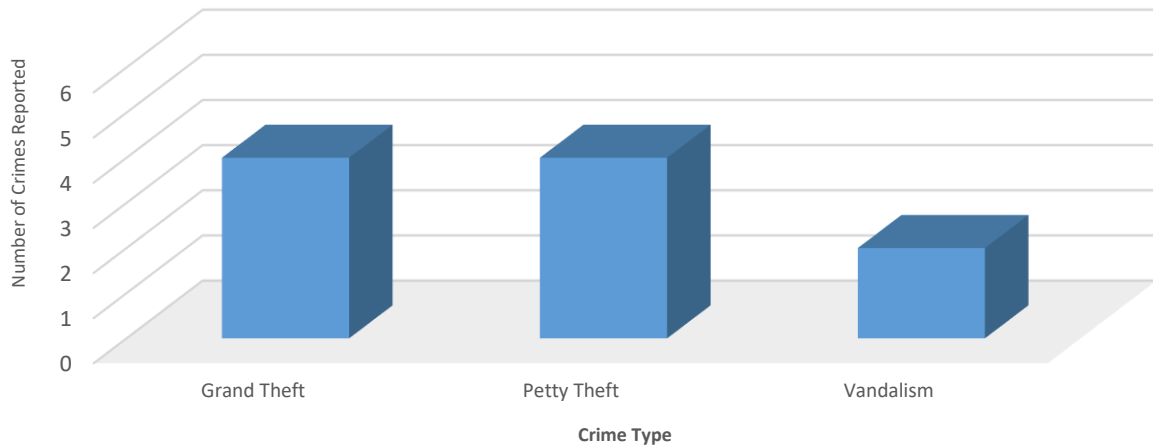

Total Part I & II By Campus

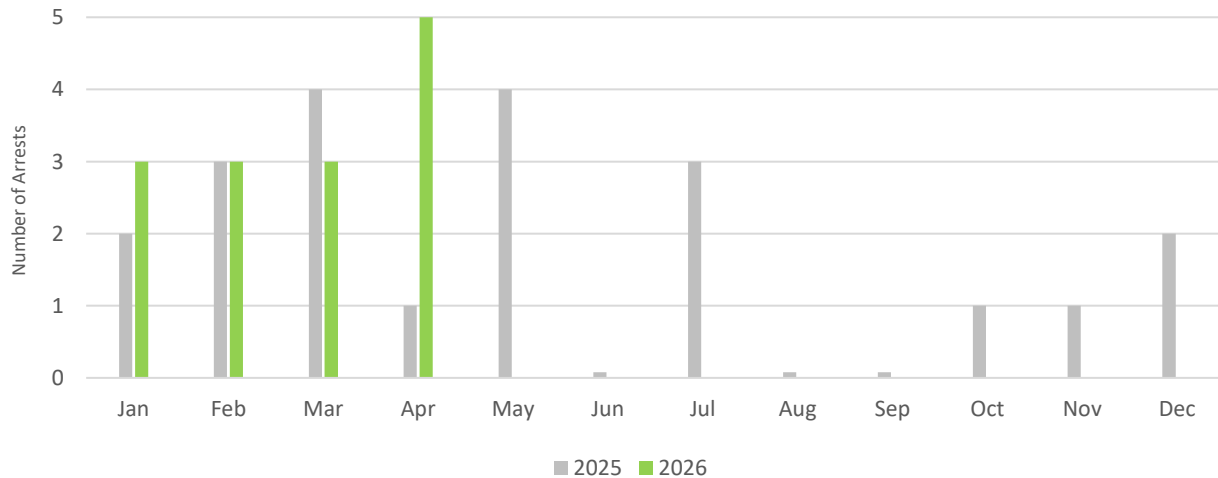

- **04/29/26** – TSU assisted with an active shooter training for the Los Angeles Southwest College staff, providing support in scenario coordination, safety oversight, and participant guidance to help enhance emergency preparedness and response protocols.
- **04/30/26** – TSU assisted with a sexual harassment training conducted by the Los Angeles Mission College staff, supporting the facilitation of training focused on workplace conduct, awareness, and compliance with institutional policies.

# Los Angeles Pierce College



Los Angeles Pierce College (LAPC) spans more than 450 acres, making it unlike any other campus in the district. It operates as a working farm, home to cows, horses, llamas, sheep, goats, and other animals that play an essential role in daily student programs. For Community College Bureau personnel, this assignment is uniquely challenging. It is not just a collection of buildings and parking lots—it's open land, brush areas, barns, and wide-ranging spaces that require personnel to truly understand the terrain. Navigating LAPC is not always straightforward. Getting from one point to another can involve trails, fields, and agricultural zones, making familiarity with the campus layout critical when responding to calls. Effective patrol work at LAPC demands heightened awareness and adaptability. CCS personnel must be comfortable moving through rural-feeling environments, knowing where key areas are located, and managing situations that differ significantly from traditional urban campus settings. LAPC is a unique campus environment, and maintaining safety here requires a specialized approach—one that blends traditional campus policing with the skills needed to operate confidently in open, agricultural terrain.

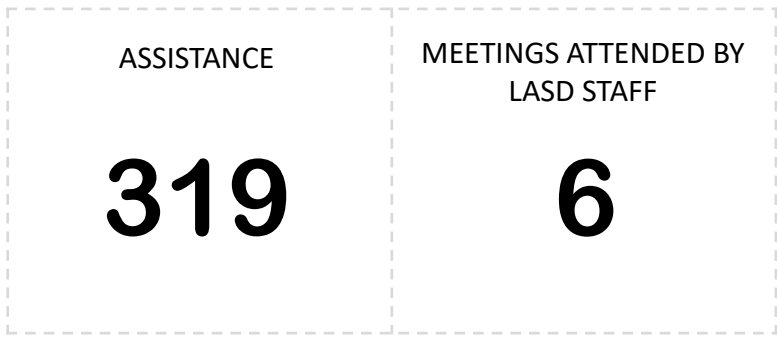
# Los Angeles Trade Tech College

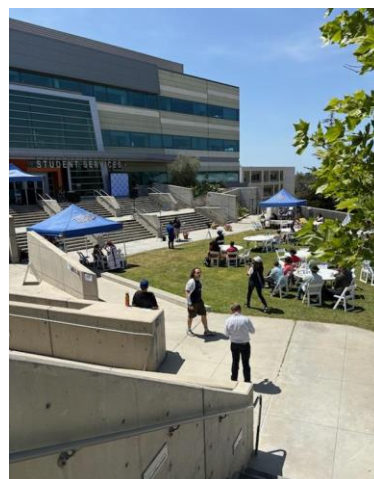


# West Los Angeles College

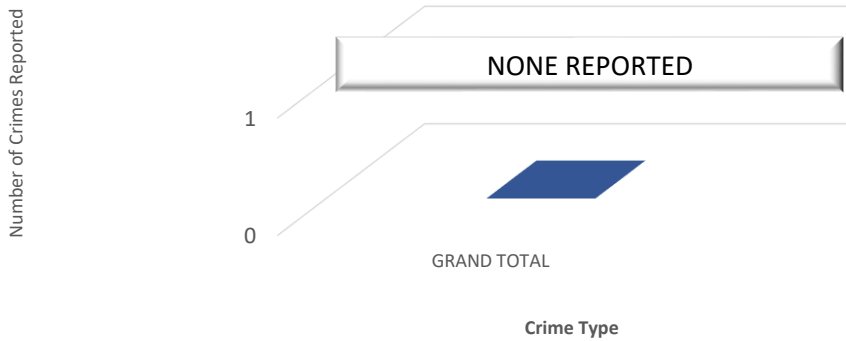
