

NONCONFORMING VEHICLE ORDINANCE

Fact Sheet

On March 3, 2026, the Board adopted an ordinance amendment to expand the existing nonconforming vehicle ordinance to additional unincorporated communities.

What is the Nonconforming Vehicle Ordinance (NCVO)?

- Always prohibits the parking of all nonconforming vehicles on public roadways, except with a valid permit. The NCVO refers to any vehicle and/or trailer which measures: 8 feet in width, 7 ½ feet in height, or 20 feet in length.

What unincorporated communities are in the expansion?

The expansion will include Azusa/Charter Oak/Covina, Del Aire/Lennox, East Los Angeles, East Rancho Dominguez, El Camino Village, Flore-Firestone/Walnut Park, Hawthorne, Rancho Dominguez, West Athens/Westmont, West Carson, West Los Angeles, West Puente Valley/Valinda/South San Jose Hills, and West Rancho Dominguez/Willbrook Districts.

When will Enforcement begin?

- PCOs are currently issuing warning notices and information flyers, Enforcement will begin once all of the logistics are in place.
- The signs will be posted at the entrances, including a towing provision.
- The Los Angeles County Code Section is 15.64.075, with a fine of \$63.

If you are the legal owner or lessee of the RV and live within the community, you may obtain a residential permit from your local Sheriff's Station. A residential permit issued pursuant to this ordinance shall be valid for a period of 24 hours and permits may be used consecutively for a maximum of two 24-hour periods. A valid ID is required when applying for the permit. For RVs with People Experiencing Homelessness (PEH) living inside, the Sheriff's Department partners with other County departments, such as the Homeless Outreach Services Team (HOST) and Public Works, to connect PEH with vital resources such as housing, healthcare, mental health treatment, and other supportive services.
