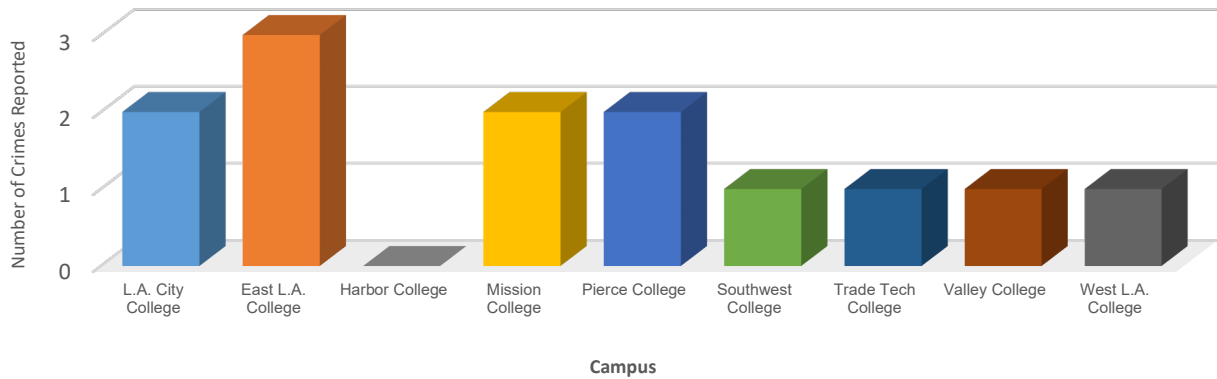

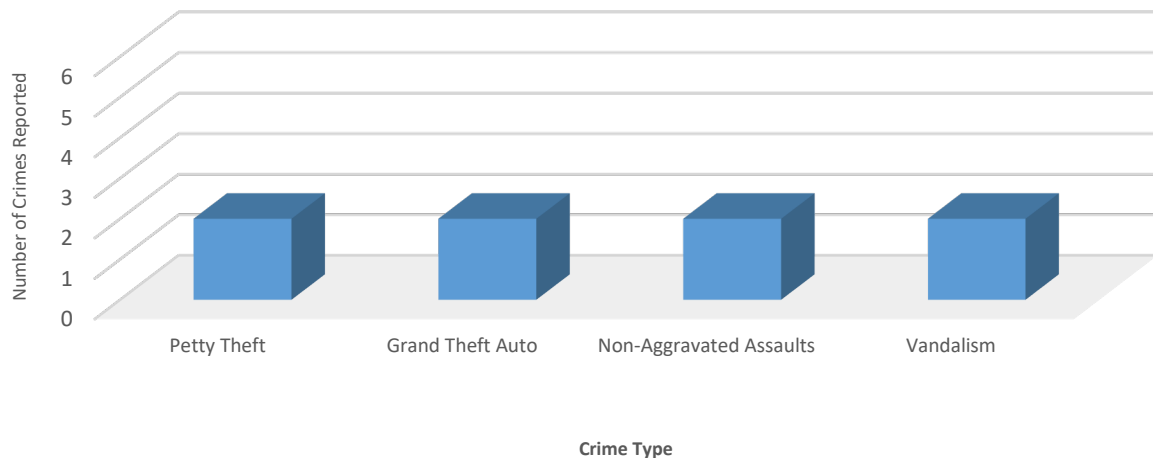

Total Part I & II By Campus

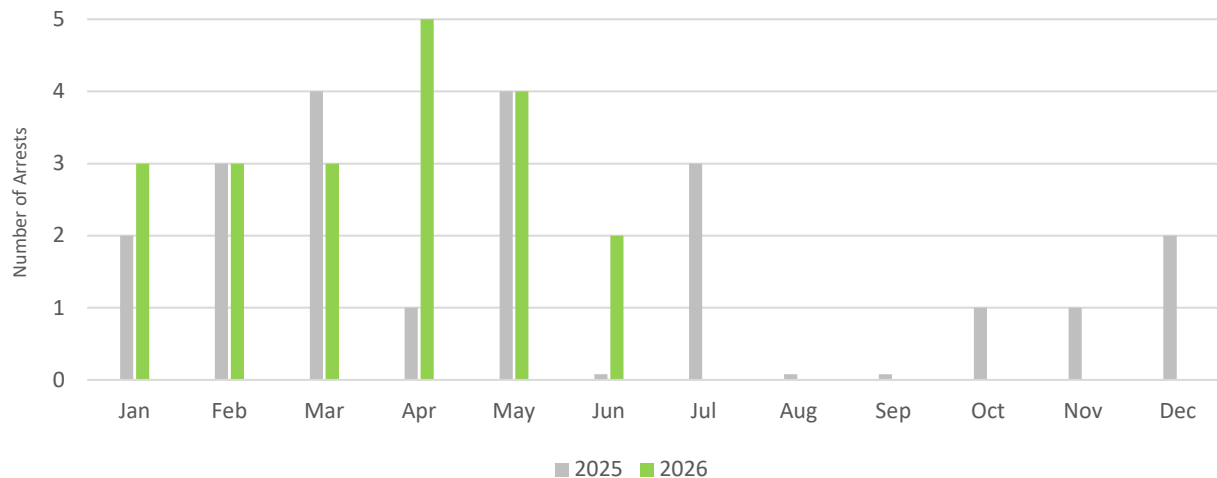

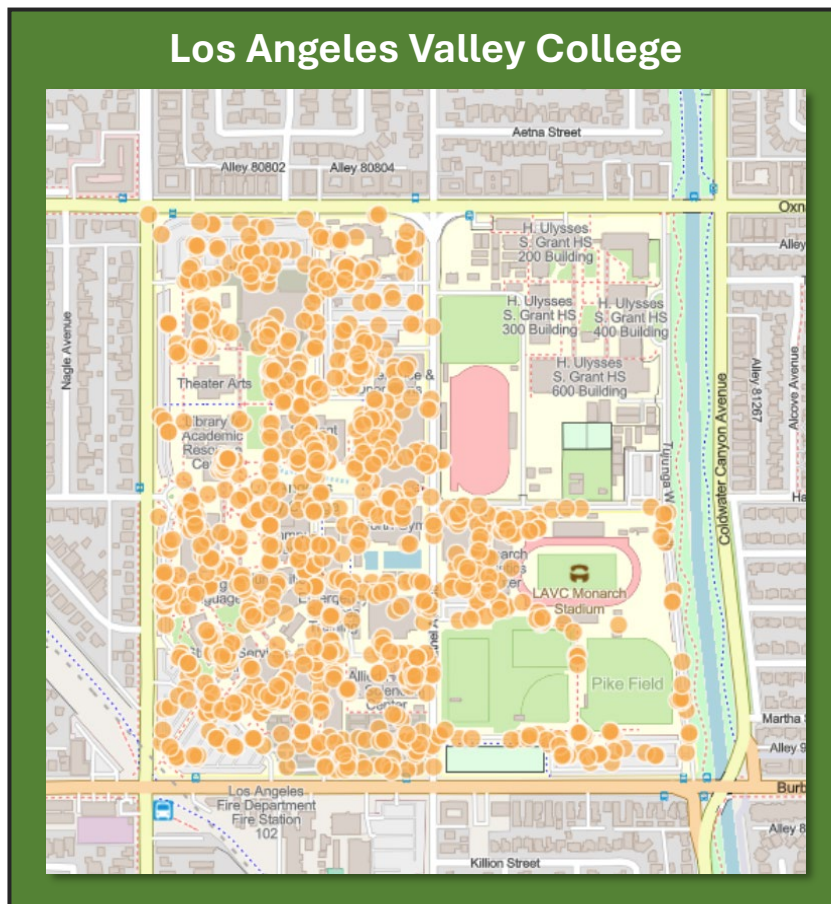

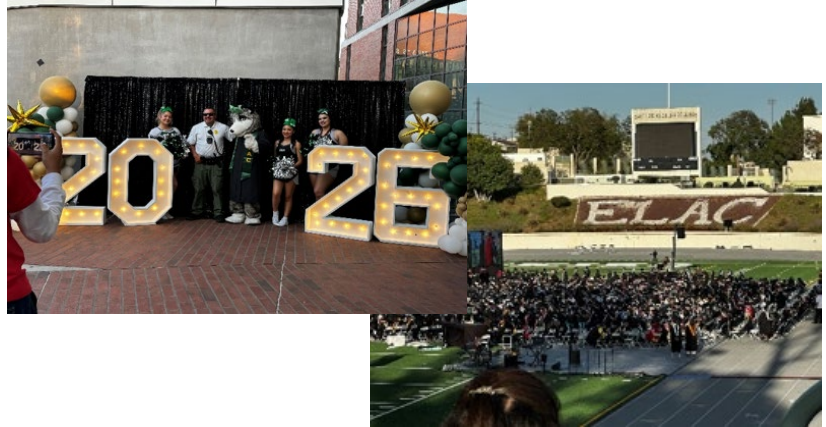
Daily Activity Log Application

On June 14, 2026, the Daily Activity Log (DAL) application was successfully launched across all nine LACCD campuses. The DAL is a mobile application used by CCS personnel to document daily law enforcement activities, including patrol checks, opening and securing doors and gates, and other campus security functions. Each entry is geocoded, providing an accurate location for all documented activities. The DAL enhances accountability, documents overall bureau productivity, and improves officer safety by providing real-time records of field activity.



During the month of June, the Training and Support Unit successfully trained all CCS security officers and deputies on the new application, ensuring a smooth implementation across all campuses.

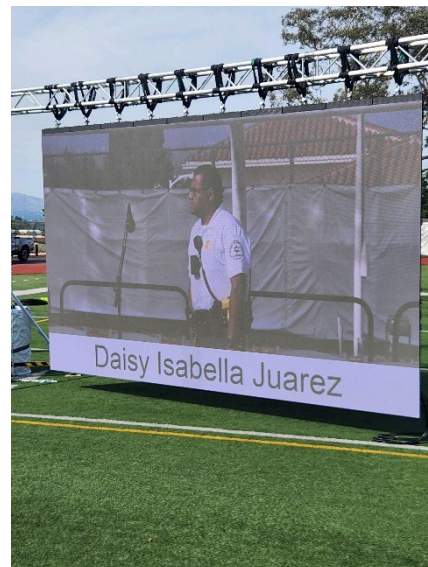
Los Angeles Pierce College

Congratulations to the Pierce College Class of 2026! Your hard work and dedication paid off, and we wish you continued success in everything that comes next.





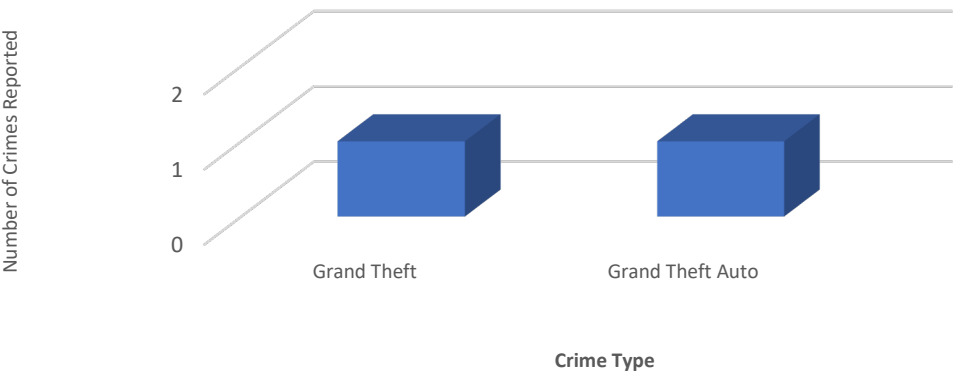

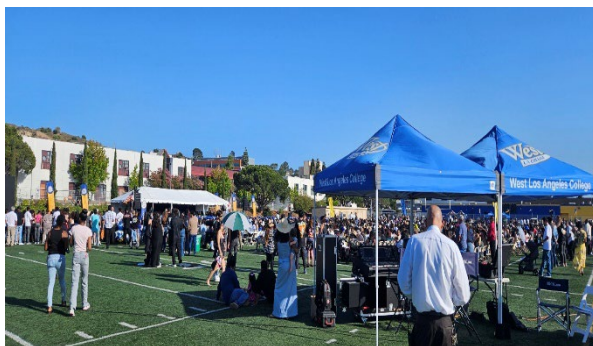


West Los Angeles College
